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KUSTER OPENS LEAD IN CD2

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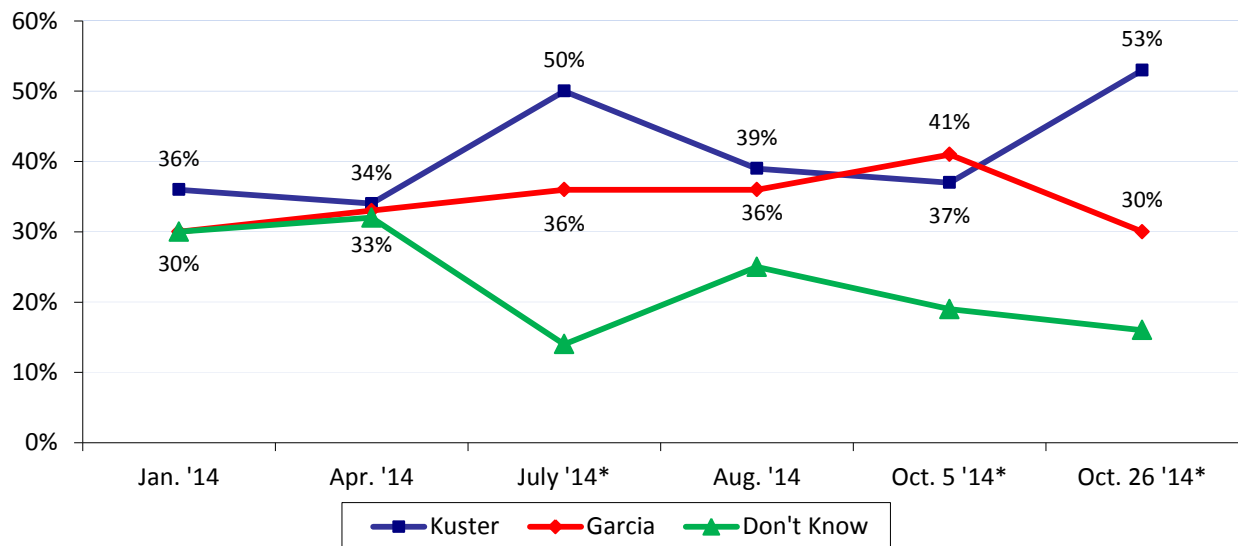
DURHAM, NH – With a week to go before the general election, District 2 Congresswoman Ann Kuster has opened a lead over her Republican challenger Marilinda Garcia.

These findings are based on the latest **WMUR Granite State Poll**,* conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. Six hundred and seventy-seven (677) randomly selected New Hampshire adults were interviewed by landline and cellular telephone between October 22 and October 26, 2014. The margin of sampling error for the survey is +/- 3.8 percent. The sample included 555 likely voters (with a +/- 4.2 percent margin of sampling error). Included were 294 likely voters in New Hampshire's Second Congressional District (MSE = +/- 5.7%)

2014 U.S. Congress Election – 2nd District

The unpopularity of both candidates make the race for the 2nd District seat a volatile one. Currently, 46% of likely voters in the 2nd District say they would vote for Kuster if the election were held today, 28% would vote for Garcia, 1% would vote for someone else and 24% are undecided. However, when undecided voters are asked which candidate they lean toward supporting, 53% say they would vote for Kuster, 30% say they would vote for Garcia, 1% would vote for someone else, and 16% remain undecided. Kuster is doing better among Democrats (85%-6%) than Garcia is among Republicans (67%-18%) and Kuster holds a double digit lead among Independents (47%-15%). While Kuster has a wide lead over those who approve of President Obama (84%-3%), Garcia only has a 53%-25% lead over those who disapprove of the President.

Granite State Poll Methodology

These findings are based on the latest WMUR Granite State Poll, conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. Six hundred and seventy-seven (677) randomly selected New Hampshire adults were interviewed by landline and cellular telephone between October 22 and October 26, 2014. The margin of sampling error for the survey is +/- 3.8 percent. The sample included 555 likely voters (with a +/- 4.2 percent margin of sampling error). Included were 294 likely voters in New Hampshire's Second Congressional District (MSE = +/- 5.7%)

The data have been weighted to adjust for numbers of adults and telephone lines within households, respondent sex, age, and region of the state. In addition to potential sampling error, all surveys have other potential sources of non-sampling error including question order effects, question wording effects, and non-response. Due to rounding, percentages may not sum to 100%. The number of respondents in each demographic below may not equal the number reported in cross-tabulation tables as some respondents choose not to answer some questions.
