REPORT OF THE SCHOOL BOARD.

To the School District of Webster:

During the last three years the wages of the teachers have been advanced, the schoolhouses improved, books and supplies liberally furnished, in some divisions improved methods of instruction introduced, and in all thoroughness in teaching and firmness in discipline have been enjoined.

The result: good work has been accomplished during the year, and we thank the teachers who have been diligent and untiring in their efforts, and alive to the importance of their work.

Nothing but illness should keep pupils from school. While it is in session, it is their business to be there, and to be in season. This part of their life's work is as important as anything they will do in later years. The success or failure of a person's life depends very much on the way their school days are spent.

The committee would recommend the following appropriations: \$200 for repairs on schoolhouses; \$100 for supplies and text-books; \$200 for tuition; \$500 for transportation of scholars; \$90 to pay school officers.
