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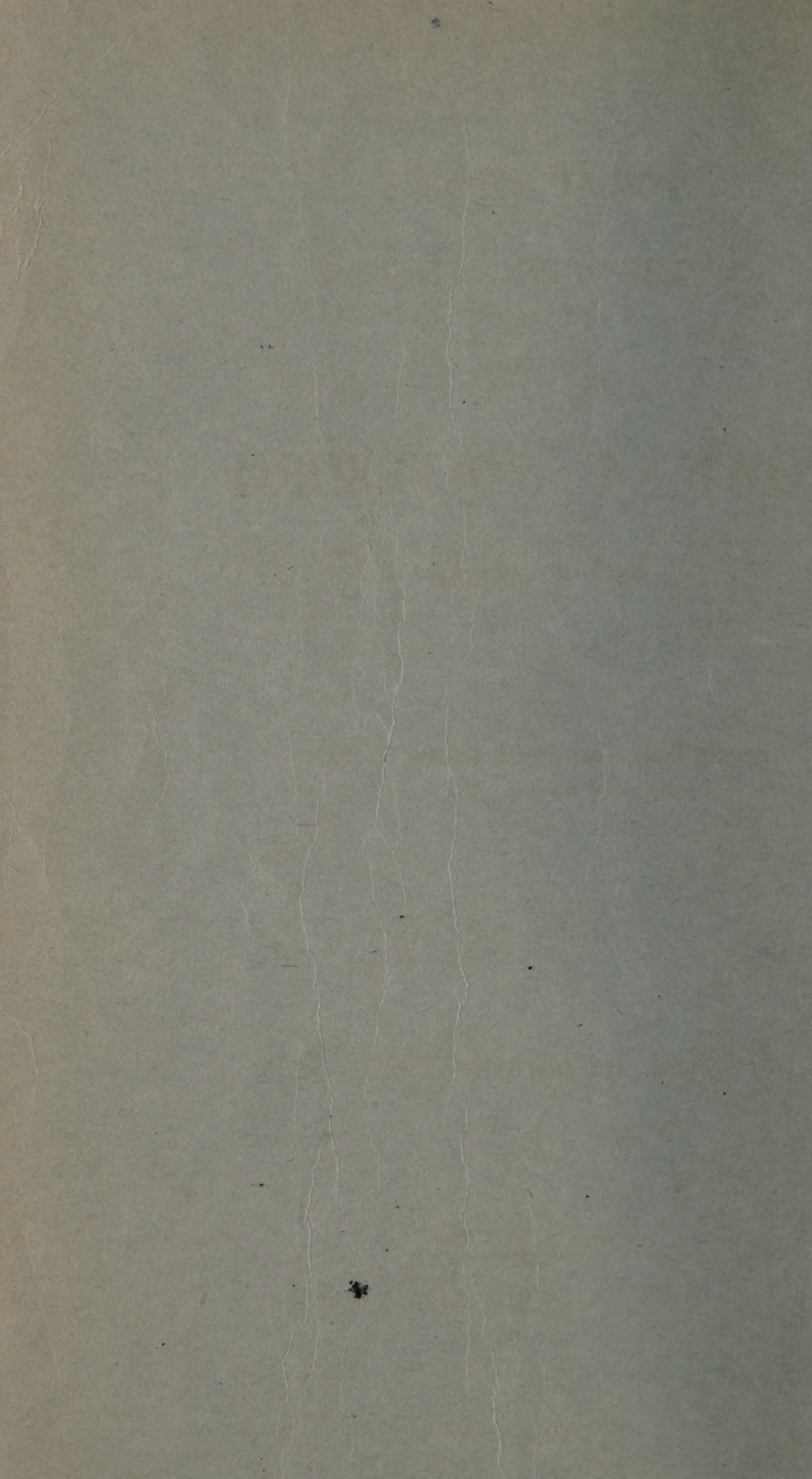

**Warrant for Annual Town Meeting 1924**

L. S.

**STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE**

To the inhabitants of the town of Wolfeboro, qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Brewster Memorial Hall in said Town on the second Tuesday of March next at nine o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

ARTICLE 1. To choose a town-clerk for the ensuing year, one Selectman for three years, two Auditors, Treasurer, Collector of Taxes, Prosecuting Liquor Agent and Constable for ensuing year, one Library Trustee, and one Trustee of Trust Funds for three years.

ARTICLE 2. To bring in your votes for the election of Delegates-at-large, Alternate Delegates-at-large, District Delegates, Alternate District Delegates to the National Conventions of the Democratic and Republican parties, to be held for the purpose of nominating party candidates for President and Vice-President of the United States.

ARTICLE 3. To elect one or more, not exceeding three highway agents, or instruct the Selectmen to appoint one expert highway agent.

ARTICLE 4. To choose all other necessary Town officers and agents.

ARTICLE 5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the amount of money necessary

to secure State Aid for the permanent improvement of highways under the law passed at the January session of the General Court 1905.

ARTICLE 6. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the repairs of highways and bridges in addition to that required by law.

ARTICLE 7. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the redemption of Town Bonds.

ARTICLE 8. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to pay each Fireman legally returned for the year 1924 in addition to that required by law.

ARTICLE 9. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Town Public Library in addition to that required by law.

ARTICLE 10. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to pay Harri-man Post No. 18 to defray expenses of Memorial Day, May 30, 1924.

ARTICLE 11. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Town expenses for the ensuing year.

ARTICLE 12. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to hire a sum of money necessary to pay Town expenses in anticipation of Taxes for 1924.

ARTICLE 13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate three hundred (300.) dollars for the maintenance of the East Side Trunk Line, the State to appropriate seven hundred (700.) dollars.

ARTICLE 14. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to aid in suppression of the Gipsy Moth.

ARTICLE 15. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to be used in connection with the State or Federal money for the suppression of the White Pine Blister Rust.

ARTICLE 16. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to aid and assist the Huggins Hospital.

ARTICLE 17. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of thirty-two hundred (\$3200.) dollars to secure a like sum from the State for the maintenance of State Aid Roads in said Town.

ARTICLE 18. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the free Public Band Concerts for the ensuing year.

ARTICLE 19. To see if the Town will vote to return to Greenleaf B. Clark the property on South Main St. known as Clark Park, deeded to the Town in 1920.

ARTICLE 20. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of three thousand (\$3000) dollars to extend the Macadam on Sewall Road.

ARTICLE 21. To see if the Town will vote to build a suitable public toilet and raise and appropriate money for the same.

ARTICLE 22. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of two hundred and fifty (\$250.) dollars for a memorial tablet for the men who served in the World War.

ARTICLE 23. To transact any other business

that may legally come before said meeting.

## LIBRARIAN'S REPORT

To the Board of Trustees of the Wolfeboro Town  
Library,

Gentlemen:

The nineteenth annual report of the librarian is

herewith presented.

A marked feature of the past year has been an increase of interest on the part of town and summer patrons, shown in the number of gifts received mention of which has already been made in the local paper.

The circulation has been 19,616 books of these classes: fiction 11,043; non-fiction 3,076; children's books 5,497. The average monthly circulation has been 1,635. The largest number of books circulated for any single day was 172, the smallest 22. Three hundred and thirty-seven books have been added to the two libraries, 147 of which were contributed.

During the summer months the Duplicate Pay System was introduced, a system used in most city libraries. While it did not seem feasible to continue the rental of the 25 books purchased until they should pay for themselves, as is generally done, the collection earned over \$19 for the library before it was put in general circulation. The experiment will be tried a second summer.

One woman living in The Highlands has had the courage to take a collection of books to circulate in her own neighborhood. Who will be the next?

We need in the next two years to use more of our appropriation for the purchase of technical and scientific books which are up to date, and a large supply of the former not too difficult for the untrained worker. All branches of industry have changed much since the war. A patron recently refused to take out any work on dietetics, because there was nothing of a later date than 1915.

During the absence of Miss Lucas, the place at the charging desk has been acceptably filled by Miss Ruth Sargent; and Miss Mary Goodhue, coming in at the close of school, has done good work with the children.
