*To the Inhabitants of the Town of Dublin Qualified to
Vote in Town Affairs:*

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Town on Tuesday the twelfth of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

First. To choose all necessary Town Officers, Agents, Auditors and Committees for the ensuing year.

Second. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors and Committees heretofore chosen and pass any vote relating thereto.

Third. To raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and for any other purposes as mentioned in the budget.

Fourth. To see if the town will vote to apply for State Aid for highways for the ensuing year.

Fifth. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for reconstruction on the Trunk Line Highway.

Sixth. To see what action the town will take relative to moving the Soldiers' Monument from its present location to the grounds of the Dublin Historical Society, raise and appropriate money for the same or take any action relating thereto.

Seventh. To see if the town will vote to extend its Street Light service, raise and appropriate money for the same or take any action relating thereto.

REPORT OF THE SCHOOL BOARD

To the Citizens of the Dublin School District:

We herewith submit the one hundred and seventh annual report of our schools.

The schedule of work outlined by Mr. Chase has been closely followed with an increase in the already high standards of our schools. The school year lacked only one half day of the standard 180 day calendar.

Miss Ruth McLeod, a graduate of Keene Normal School, was appointed as teacher of No. 3 school. In the other schools the same staff was retained.

Much gratitude is felt towards the teachers for the time and work put in to make the graduating exercises a success. We also desire to thank Mr. Olsen for the flowers and the time spent in decorating the hall, and Mr. Dunklee for the use of the lights and the time he spent in installing them.

The Board has held regular monthly meetings with the superintendent.

Necessary repairs have been made on all the school buildings. Schoolhouses No. 2 and No. 3 have been painted on the inside. Number One was painted on the inside and outside. The Board hopes to paint the outside of No. 2 and No. 3 during the next year.

Schoolhouse No. 1 has been newly shingled, with metal at the eaves on the north side. This has stopped the leaking caused by water backing up during the winter. Eaves troughs and drains were installed to carry the water away from the side of the building.

The road was put in with several catch basins in the ditch away from the school house. These catch basins, together with the eaves troughs and drains have put an effective stop to the water coming through the wall and flooding the basements.

An electric pump and storage tank were installed in the basement and connected with the new spring with the old pipe and a series of shut-offs. This made use of the same line.

REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SUPERVISORY UNION NO. 47 OF THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE TO THE SCHOOL BOARD OF DUBLIN, N. H.

During the past fiscal year only eleven towns in the state expended less on current costs for education per \$1,000.00 of equalized valuation than did Dublin. The great wealth of Dublin lays a special obligation on the citizens to see to it that the children receive the care that such wealth makes possible.

Dublin expended \$4.19 out of each thousand dollars for its elementary schools. It added 28 cents for all other current expenditures, locally. It expended 23 cents out of each one thousand dollars for high school tuition. This makes a total of \$4.70 out of each thousand dollars for all costs of the schools. The figures for the two previous years of present supervision were \$4.84 in the fiscal year closing in 1926 and \$5.10 in the school year which closed in 1927. This latter figure included the cost of building the wall and grading the grounds to the extent which they now show.

This decreasing cost, with increasingly high standards, has been due to three major items. First, the support and encouragement given by the School Board to modern educational practice. Second, the high quality of faithful teaching service. And third, the clerical service which has made possible a continual watch over the individual children in the school district. We place these items in the above order, for without firm support the new policies could not have been carried to success. And without faithful and intelligent care for the demands of supervision, the children would have failed to reap benefit.

Four schools were maintained during the past fiscal year, with a total enrollment of 83, and a percent of attendance of 93. Tardinesses dropped to 45, the lowest record since statistics are at hand, a period of nine years. The decrease is from the figure of 375 cases of tardiness in 1923, and 214 in 1926.

All four teachers are graduates of New Hampshire normal schools. Miss Lillian Beaulieu transferred to the Belmont, Mass., school system. Her position was filled by Miss Ruth McLeod.

We believe that the citizens of the town recognize and appreciate the services of the teaching staff. The superintendent desires to express his own appreciation, as well.

Music is now permanently a part of the regular school program, instead of being cared for at intervals by a subject supervisor. Much stress is laid upon the correction of personal defects, in this, as in all branches of the work.

Counting out the days spent in the service of the district by the teachers at institutes, the longest actual recorded school year ever maintained in Dublin was this past fiscal year. The costs to the district for closing, which had in previous years been as high as \$910.56 (in 1924) were reduced to \$132.84. This is the lowest cost recorded for Dublin.

No changes were made in the administrative plans of the schools. The high standards reached, measurements being impersonally made by achievement tests, showed conclusively that Dublin is maintaining city school standards of high rank.

The superintendent visited the schools 89 times during the past year. Sixty-nine citizens visited the schools.

We regret to report that no pupil secured a perfect record for attendance during the past year, according to the registers. Only 13 children have had perfect attendance during the past nine years of school. The record for the past nine years for perfect attendance is, 0, 3, 0, 0, 0, 7, 1, 2, 0. This is a matter, chiefly, for parental consideration.

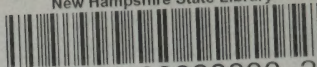
