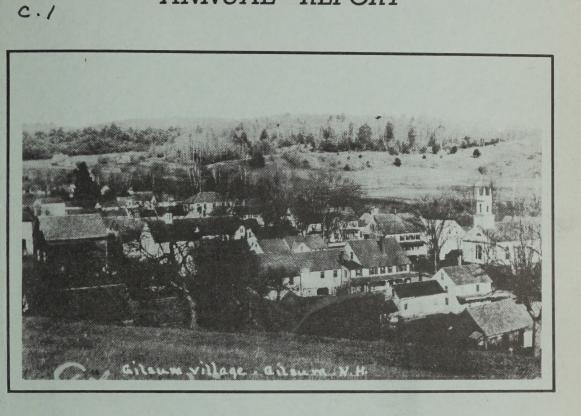

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE TOWN WARRANT

To the inhabitants of the Town of Gilsum in the County of Cheshire in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Gilsum on Tuesday, the 2nd day of March, next, at 1:30 of the clock in the afternoon, to act upon the following subjects:

To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing. Polls will be open until six thirty of the clock in the evening.

The business meeting will be called to order at eight of the clock in the evening, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the withdrawal from the Revenue Sharing Fund, established under the provisions of the State and Local Assistance Act of 1972, for the use of setoffs against budget appropriations in the amount indicated; and, further to authorize the Selectmen to make pro-rata reductions in the amounts if estimated entitlements are reduced, or take any other action hereon.

- 2. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to enter into a contract with the State of New Hampshire Public Works and Highways for the purpose of installing a "Bailey Bridge," so called, to replace the "Polley Bridge," so called, and for this purpose to appropriate the sum of \$6,000; it being understood that said "Bailey Bridge" will serve only as a temporary structure until a permanent structure is erected.
- 3. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to enter into negotiations with the State of New Hampshire Public Works and Highways for the erection of a permanent bridge to replace the "Polley Bridge," under the Town Bridge Aid Program, it being understood that the Town's share is not to exceed 25% of the total cost; and further that this meeting be adjourned to a special Town Meeting to be held at the Town Hall on May 4th at 8 o'clock prevailing time to see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to enter into a contract with said Department of Public Works and Highways for the erection of a permanent bridge, and for this purpose to appropriate the sum, not to exceed the 25% of the total cost of the structure, said sum to be raised by the issuance of notes, and to authorize the Selectmen to issue and negotiate said notes, and to determine the time and place of payment thereof under said terms and conditions as they deem to be in the best interests of the Town. (2/3 vote by written ballot is required for passage of Special Town Meeting, if authorized. Majority vote sufficient for passage at March 2nd Meeting.)
- 4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,000 to be placed in a Trust Fund for Bridge Replacement.

(2/3 written ballot required for passage.)

- 5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,200 for the purchase of a used tractor-loader for the Highway Department.

 (Total amount \$1,200 to come from Highway Subsidy Fund.)
- 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100 as the Town's share of the operating expenses of the Cheshire County Humane Society.
- 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$137 as the Town's share of the operating cost of The Monadnock Regional Association.
- 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500\$ to be placed in the Fire Truck Trust Fund.
- 9. To see if the Town will accept a certain tract of land to be incorporated within the boundaries of Centennial Cemetery, said land to be donated by Faye and Claire B. Kingsbury: and further to see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,500 for the purchase of two (2) additional acres of land from Faye and Claire B. Kingsbury for the purpose of enlargening Centennial Cemetery, the cost being \$750 per acre.
- 10. To receive the report of the Budget Committee and act in any matter relating thereto.
- 11. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray Town charges and make appropriations of the same.
- 12. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
- 13. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to approach the New Hampshire Department of Revenue for the purpose of having the Town reappraised, said reappraisal will not take place for several years, due to backlog within the department.
- 14. To see if the Town will vote to appoint a committee to take charge of observance of Memorial Day.
- 15. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to issue permits without charge for supervised activities held on the Town Grounds, said permits to include the erection of temporary facilities.
- 16. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to sell any land and all pieces of real estate, either by auction or private sale, acquired by tax deed, said property to be advertised for sale for three weeks prior to sale.
- 17. To see if the Town will vote to withdraw from the Old Home Day Trust Fund a sum of money not to exceed the total of \$750 for use by the Town, in conjunction with the National Bi-Centennial Committee, in celebrating the Bi-Centennial of the United States.
- 18. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

The following article will be voted on during the voting hours of 1:30 to 6:30 P.M. by special ballot:

A-1 Question: Should the game of Bingo or Beano be allowed to be played in the Town of Gilsum?

LIBRARIAN'S REPORT

1975 saw a slight decrease in our circulation, although the Library was used a good deal by students for reference and for home work. This year our reference collection was expanded due to a gift of some fine reference works by Mr. Keith McKenna, a summer resident of Gilsum.

Borrower's cards issued in 1975 included 140 adult and 68 juvenile for a total of 208 cards altogether. The circulation figure for the year was 4,587; 2,333 fiction and 2,254 non-fiction which included 402 magazines, 229 slides and films, 44 records, and 4 jig-saw puzzles.

The Library borrowed 3,766 books from the State Bookmobile which made 4 visits this year, while many special requests were obtained by mail from the New Hampshire State Library. The Keene Public Library too, supplied us with numerous special requests, plus films, and block loans of from 30 to 40 mystery books every few months, for a total of 333 books, and 168 AV materials.

The Ward Cooley Memorial Fund was established this year at the Library by Mr. and Mrs. Keith McKenna, friends of Mr. and Mrs. Arthur Cooley, parents of this 7-year old boy whose sad death occurred this year. The Cooley family has a summer home in Gilsum Woods, and the boy used to visit the Library whenever they were in town. The Fund has already received contributions of several hundred dollars and quite a few books. It is to be used for a collection of children's books and other materials covering mainly scientific and nature subjects, which would include books on minerals, animals, birds, etc., as all of these were of great interest to the boy.

The collection has been started with some National Geographic books on these subjects, and we have also purchased sets of color slides on wildflowers, birds, insects, animals, etc. which may circulate. Two slide viewers are available for borrowing with the slides.

The Fund is still open for contributions.

Our book cataloguing is progressing well, and we now plan to have book cards in all our books. This changeover will be gradual, but it will eventually make our charging system more efficient.

The Gilsum Nursery School children with their teacher have been attending a Story Hour held for them at the Library every other Wednesday morning at 10:30. Mrs. Harriet Commoss, one of our Trustees, and a former teacher herself, is in charge of the hour, and the children love it!

During the treacherous weather this winter, the attendance at the Library was light. We're trusting that with milder weather, more Gilsum residents will take advantage of the Library's resources. Even for those who don't wish to borrow books, it's a nice cozy place to settle down and read, or listen to records, or to just read the newspaper. We have the Christian Science Monitor, New Hampshire Times, Keene Shopper, New York Times Book Review, and numerous magazines.

Our book collection is varied. Along with the fairly recent books, we have still held on to some of the older authors. Many libraries today have had to remove these authors from their collection to make more room on their shelves for the newer acquistions. Among the well-loved authors still to be found on our shelves, to mention just a few, are: Joseph C. Lincoln, Grace Livingston Hill, Miss Mulock, Ernest Seton, Booth Tarkington, Kathleen Norris, Jack London, Zane Grey, etc.

Do come in. This is your Library.

LIBRARY TRUSTEES REPORT

The Gilsum Public Library earned accreditation from the New Hampshire State Library in 1975 for the first time in its history. Accreditation was finally possible because the new library building met all of the state's requirements for a public library and because during 1975 the library was open for the full 600 hours required for a library in a town the size of Gilsum.

A number of finishing touches were made on the library and grounds during the year. Because of a generous donation from Albert F. Hall, father of the late F. Summer Hall, donor of the land on which the library is built, four trees were planted in front of the building: two sugar maples, one linden and a flowering crab. The library's Memorial Fund made possible the purchase of an antique display case for the entrance hall, the painting of an attractive sign which was hung near the road, and the planting of twenty pounds of spring flower bulbs.

The library was most fortunate in receiving generous donations throughout the year which were used for the purchase of books and for periodical subscriptions not included in our budget. The Ward A. Cooley Memorial Fund, established in the memory of the young son of Mr. & Mrs. Arthur Cooley of the Gilsum Woods, has already made possible the purchase of many nationally recommended children's books not previously in our collection, plus a series of nature slides and a viewer with which to see them. Funds from the F. Sumner Hall Memorial Fund were used to purchase a stereo phonograph.

A Fall highlight at the library was the showing by Dr. Arnold Modell of his slides taken on a recent trip to Africa. The trustees are pleased to make the library available for events such as this and hope to see it more and more a center of community activities.

We wish to say thank you to Marion Hall and Trudi Oesch for their contributions to the library during the past year; as always, their interest and efforts far exceeded the definition of their job. A special word of thanks to Harriet Commoss and Joan Miller for the time they gave to work in the library during the summer and fall.

Don't forget: not only are all the books in the Gilsum library at your disposal, but also all of the books in the New Hampshire State Library. If you are looking for a particular book, Marion Hall can get it from the state library within a few days. Library hours in 1976 will continue to be: Monday and Wednesday afternoons, 1:30 to 4:30; Tuesday and Thursday evenings, 7:00 to 9:00; and Saturdays, 10 to noon.
