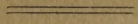

To the inhabitants of the Town of Gorham, in the County of Coos, in said State, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet in Town Hall, Park street, on Tuesday, the ninth day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary town officers for the ensuing year.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray the town charges for the ensuing year, and appropriate money for same.
3. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for street lights.
4. To see if the town will authorize the selectmen to distribute the inventory blanks when taking inventory.
5. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Public Library.
6. To see what amount the town will vote to raise for the retirement of town water bonds, or a sinking fund, and appropriate money therefor.
7. To see what action the town will take in regard to raising and appropriating money for police for the ensuing year.
8. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance of a trunk line road.
9. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for trunk line aid.
10. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for highways and bridges.
11. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for oiling permanently built roads.
12. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for sewer and water commission.
13. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for band concerts and common.
14. To see what amount the town will vote to raise for the retirement of Municipal Building Bonds and appropriate money therefor.

15. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the completion of a permanent Honor Roll.

16. To see what amount the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the retirement of town notes.

17. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for District Nurse.

18. To see if the town will vote to install a sewer on Union street, so called, and raise and appropriate money for same.

19. To see if the town will vote to build a gravel sidewalk starting at the extreme west end of the cement sidewalk at upper village and extending along the easterly side of Lancaster road to the Umbagog hose house, and raise and appropriate money for same.

20. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the retirement of Cascade Water Bonds.

21. To see if the town will vote to purchase an addition to the Lary cemetery, and raise and appropriate money therefor.

22. To see if the town will vote to purchase a motor truck for the Fire Department and raise and appropriate money therefor.

23. To see if the town will vote to install a sewer system on Cascade Hill and raise and appropriate money for same.

24. To see if the town will vote to give the William Holmes Post, American Legion, the use of the old Town Hall, and raise and appropriate money towards putting same in proper condition.

25. To hear reports of town officers, agents, committees, heretofore chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.

26. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

Gorham District Nursing Service

GORHAM, N. H., February 1, 1920.

The district nursing service continues its work of last year. There have been fewer bedside nursing visits during the same period of

time, which is due to less illness in the community. The influenza of last year has not made its reappearance, as yet, and since its short stay with us there has been a noticeable decrease in sickness; in fact, this has prevailed over all the country.

During July, August and September the babies were weighed every Tuesday afternoon at the Municipal Building, to carry on the good work started by the Gorham Woman's Club in 1918. This work will be continued this year. The Woman's Club have donated fifty dollars to the nursing service this year.

The school children have been examined by the School Physician, assisted by the nurse, and the defective cases have been followed up. The nursing work in the school at the Cascade has been heavy this year and has required both diligence and patience.

The State has sent an orthopedic specialist, together with a nurse, from Concord, to assist us with the deformed children. This assistance is greatly appreciated by all.

The Brown Company have co-operated with the district nursing service by having two lectures given in its industry at the Cascade Mill by the nurse.

It is hoped that arrangements can be made to extend the nursing service this year.

In the financial statement given above we wish to call attention to two items. Under permanent improvements (equipment) \$310.65 out of the \$332.58 mentioned, was for library furnishings ordered in 1918, when the library moved to its present quarters. Due to war conditions, these furnishings did not arrive nor the bills come to hand until April, 1919. The second item, that of \$95.99 for binding, was likewise for binding done in 1918, the bill for same not coming to hand until after the opening of the books for the current year. This total of \$406.64 appreciably decreases the apparent amount spent for bills incurred during 1919.

No binding was done during the current year, which means that some \$75.00 will have to be spent for that work during 1920.

The circulation of books and magazines from the library has nearly doubled during the past year, which means that the work of the librarian has doubled. This seems to be due partly to increase of population and partly to increase of interest on the part of the citizens. Special emphasis has been laid by the librarian on the Juvenile Section, a large amount of the very best literature for young people having been placed in that section. That this has been appreciated can be verified by being at the library on any open days.

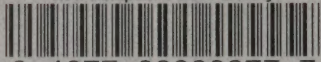
