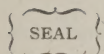

To the inhabitants of the Town of Gorham, in the County of Coos, in said State, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet in Municipal Hall on Tuesday, the eighth day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To elect three selectmen, one for three years, one for two years, and one for one year, and choose all other necessary town officers for the ensuing year.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray the town charges for the ensuing year, and appropriate money for the same.
3. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for street lights.
4. To see if the town will authorize the selectmen to distribute the inventory blanks when taking inventory.
5. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Public Library.
6. To see what sum the town will vote to raise for the retirement of town water bonds, or a sinking fund, and appropriate money therefor.
7. To see what action the town will take in regard to raising and appropriating money for police for the ensuing year.
8. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance of a trunk line road.
9. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for state aid construction.
10. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for highways and bridges.
11. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for oiling permanently built roads.
12. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for sewer and water commission.
13. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for band concerts and common.

14. To see what amount the town will vote to raise for the retirement of Municipal Building Bonds and appropriate money therefor.

15. To see what amount the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the retirement of town notes.

16. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for District Nurse.

17. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the retirement of Cascade Water Bonds.

18. To see if the town will vote to repair Cross street and raise and appropriate money therefor.

19. To see if the town will vote to purchase a scarifier for road work and raise and appropriate money therefor.

20. To see if the town will vote to install a water and sewer extension at Upper Village, including 6-inch pipe line to power plant, and raise and appropriate money therefor.

21. To see if the town will vote to build a sidewalk at Cascade and raise and appropriate money therefor.

22. To see if the town will vote to accept the provisions of Chapter 117, Laws of 1917, on a section of the East Side Road so called, and appropriate or set aside from the amount raised for highway work the sum of forty dollars for this purpose.

23. To see if the town will vote to discontinue the use of the fire alarm as a curfew signal, and that the striking of the town clock at eight p. m. in the winter and nine p. m. in the summer be considered as such curfew signal.

24. To hear reports of town officers, agents, committees, heretofore chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.

25. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

In recommending \$2,800 for police, we would provide for experienced officers, as follows:

One regular officer in the village, on duty during such hours as the Selectmen may direct.

A second officer in the village during the Summer months.

An officer at the Cascade during the Summer months.

Thus providing for three officers in the Summer and one in the Winter.

We recommend a more strict enforcement of the law governing the licensing of dogs, and the appointment of a dog constable.

We recommend that the town discontinue the use of the fire alarm as a curfew signal, and that the striking of the town clock at 8 p. m. in the Winter and 9 p. m. in the Summer be considered as such curfew signal.

Also that the fire alarm be tested at 12 noon when necessary.
