




Report of School Board

The same number of schools have been maintained during 1912 as on the previous year. The average attendance has been good and the service of the teachers entirely satisfactory. A portion of the appropriation for the year has been used at Schools Nos 3 and 6 for needed repairs and improvements. All that is required to put these two School buildings in a satisfactory condition is outside painting.

At the Lower Neck, School No. 8, the number of pupils to attend have been diminishing until now there are but seven. There are not likely to be any accessions but rather a decrease by reason of school age. Practically the same condition exists in the Richardson District School No. 1.

It is therefore apparent that in the not very remote future a consolidation of one or both of these Schools with some other will seem advisable.

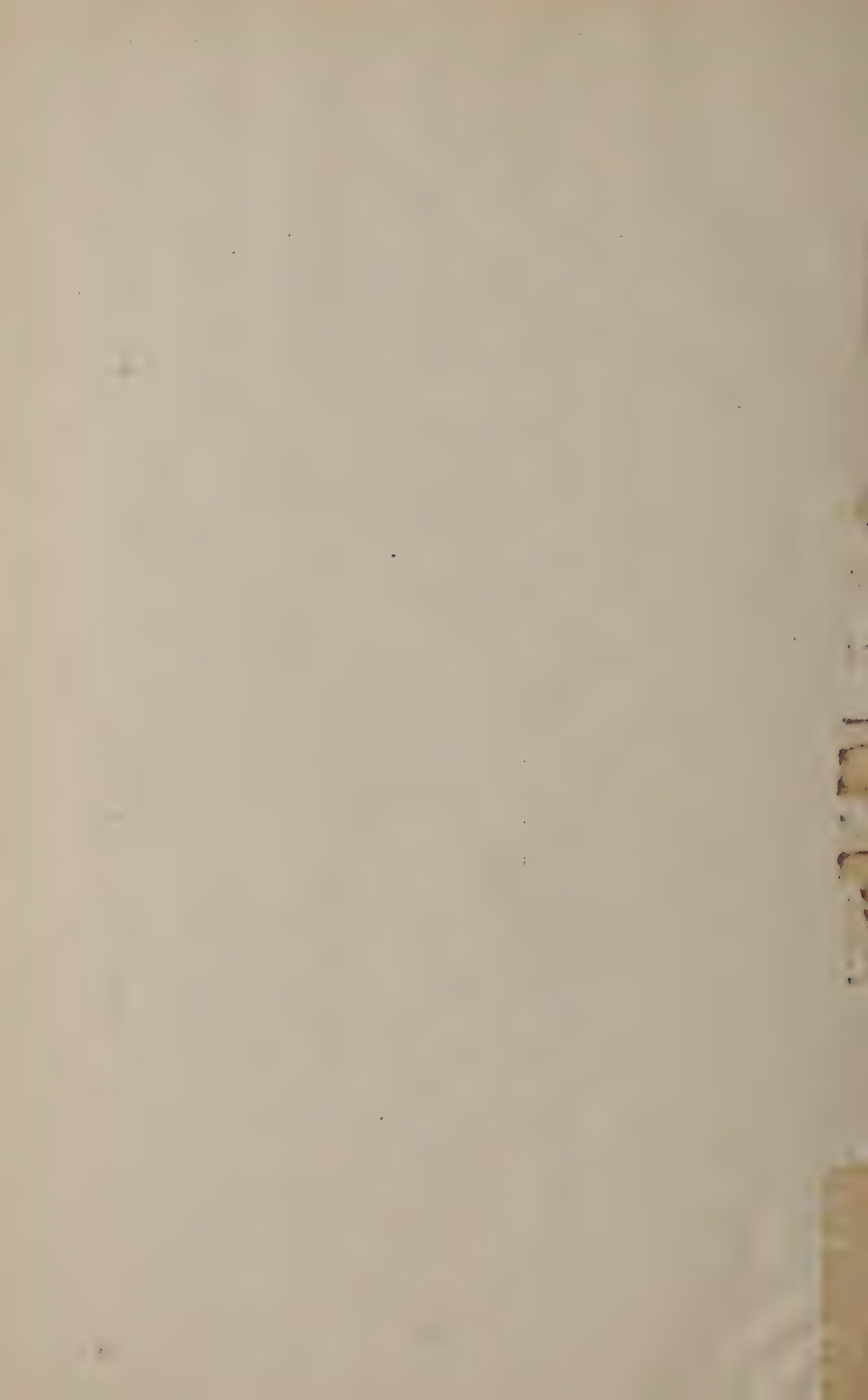
