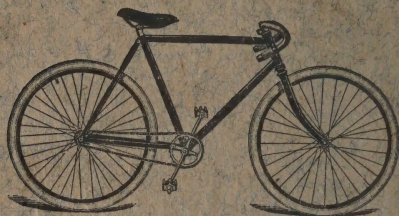

GENERAL REPORT.

To the Citizens and Parents of Salisbury :

The flight of time has again brought us around to the time when the annual statement as to the condition of our schools is due.

In the first place, please bare in mind that the School Board are human and not infallible, and that while we have conscientiously tried to discharge our duties, we may have made some mistakes over which we ask you to throw the mantle of charity and look at the general improvements of the schools instead of us.

We have employed as good teachers as we could for the money at our command and in the main we think we have been successful. But we have found it difficult in some cases to secure teachers in some of our large schools for the prices we have been obliged to pay.

During the winter term, owing to a large amount of sickness in town, the average daily attendance was decidedly lowered, and in a few cases there were many days when some of our students who lived near the schools forgot to rise early enough in the morning to get to school at all during the day, but we are happy to say these cases were rare.

Books like men, will wear out, and we have found it necessary to expend quite a sum for text books, some previous Boards have allowed several kinds of Grammars to be used in the schools at the same time.

This we found to be not only contrary to law but a source of annoyance to both instructor and pupils; consequently the odd varieties were exchanged for Mary Hyde's three books.

Our Geographys are in poor condition, some are worn out, while others have been in use so long as to be out of date, another year we think a change should be made in these books.

As a general thing more interest has been taken in the schools by the parents than last year, and more sympathy existing between parents and teacher, which is shown by the large number of names appearing on the Roll of Perfect attendance. Last year there were only 43 names on this roll; this year 73 appear.

This interest was shown to an unusual degree in the South Road school during the summer term when in order to secure the services of Miss Durgin a sum in excess of what the Board could use for this school was raised by the parents by subscription, and as is always the case where everyone is interested, the term was a success.

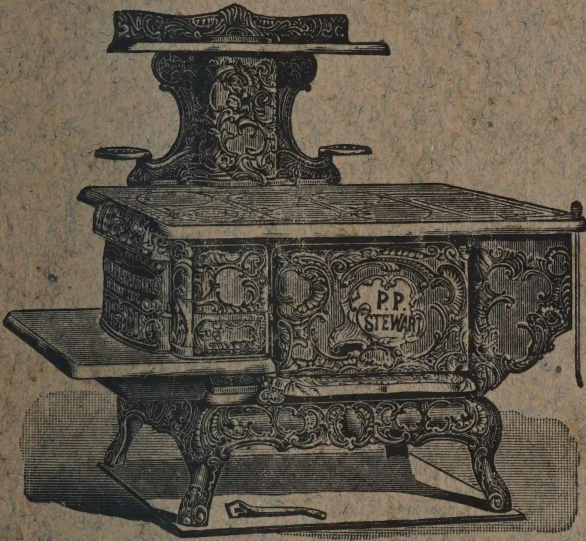
