# State of New Hampshire

---



To the inhabitants of the Town of Gorham, in the County of Coos, in said State qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet in Municipal Hall on Tuesday the fourteenth day of March next; at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To elect one selectman for three years, and choose all other necessary town officers for the ensuing year.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray the town charges for the ensuing year, and appropriate money for the same.
3. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for street lights.
4. To see if the town will authorize the selectmen to distribute the inventory blanks when taking the inventory.
5. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Public Library.
6. To see what sum the town will vote to raise for the retirement of town water bonds, or a sinking fund, and appropriate money therefor.
7. To see what action the town will take in regard to raising and appropriating money for police for the ensuing year.
8. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance of a trunk line road.
9. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for state aid construction.
10. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for highways and bridges.
11. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for oiling permanently built roads.
12. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for sewer and water commission.
13. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for band concerts and common.

14. To see what amount the town will vote to raise for the retirement of Municipal Building Bonds, and appropriate money therefor.
15. To see what amount the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the retirement of town notes.
16. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for District Nurse.
17. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the retirement of Cascade Water Bonds.
18. To see if the town will vote to build a permanent road from Glen street to Shelburne line, and raise and appropriate money therefor.
19. To see if the town will vote to extend the pipe line on Mechanic street to Androscoggin River and raise and appropriate money therefor.
20. To see if the town will vote to install a sewer on Union street and raise and appropriate money therefor.
21. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Cascade water and sewer extension.
22. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for a sinking fund to connect new springs with water system.
23. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Macfarlane and Park street sidewalks.
24. To see if the town will vote to build a foot bridge over Moose River on upper Main street and raise and appropriate money therefor.
25. To see if the town will vote to change the present fire alarm system and raise and appropriate money therefor.
26. To see if the town will vote to instruct the manager of the Gorham Opera House to make the rate of rental for entertainments and social functions held under the auspices of the pupils of the public schools or by others for their benefit the entire net profits of which are to be used for school purposes, the actual cost to the management.
27. To see if the town will vote to instruct the selectmen to see that the laws relating to pool rooms be enforced and upon an infraction of same to revoke their licenses immediately.
28. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Federal aid.
29. To see if the town will vote to change the vote of 1920 so as to use the appropriation of \$2,800, to build concrete sidewalk beginning at Church street sidewalk, south side of Main street and extending towards the upper village.
30. To hear reports of town officers, agents, committees, here-

tofore chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.

31. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

To the full detailed report preceding, we are adding the following condensed statement so that the voters may see at a glance, the amount of each item of the Budget, as well as the total amount recommended.

We recommend that the amount of \$2,800.00, appropriated in 1920, for a cinder sidewalk from Church street to Hannafords corner, be used to construct a cement sidewalk beginning on the southerly side of Main street, at the corner of Church street, and extending towards the Upper Village.

There is in the treasury about \$7,000.00, balance from the sale of the Cascade Water & Sewer bonds. This, with the \$3,000.00 which we recommend, will give \$10,000.00 with which to put the town water into the Cascade school house, and to make a start towards installing a suitable sewer system on Cascade Hill.

We recommend that if an appropriation is made for the construction of a permanent road on lower Main street, the Selectmen have suitable specifications drawn up, and call for sealed bids for such construction.

We recommend that a committee be appointed to erect the permanent Honor Roll, substantially in accordance with a plan which has been placed in the hands of the Selectmen.

We have tried to consider the needs of all parts of the town. We have also had to consider the desirability of keeping the tax rate within 3 per cent of the valuation. This we believe can be done if the appropriations are made in accordance with our recommendations.

### Report of District Nurse

We are entering on our fourth year of district nursing service, and the work is growing steadily.

One thousand six hundred and twenty nursing visits were made

during the year just closed. These visits consisted of general bedside nursing, surgical dressings and care of small injuries and sores, mostly among school children.

From June 1, to Oct. 1 babies were weighed and mothers were advised as to feeding etc., every Tuesday afternoon at the nurse's rooms. This work will be resumed the coming summer.

The physical examination of the school children by the school physician, assisted by the nurse, showed many defective cases which are being followed up and the need of treatment for the correction of these defects is being presented to the parents.

In weighing the school children it was found that many of them were underweight, and a plan to serve milk to them during the recess period was discussed with the Superintendent of schools and with the teachers of the Ann Lary school. The Superintendent brought the matter before the Board of Education which approved the plan. The committee of the District Nursing service, at its meeting, showed its approval and cooperation by donating the sum of \$50.00 to supply the milk and utensils for serving it until the matter can be brought up at the coming town meeting.

The nurse has been giving practical talks and demonstrations on Home Hygiene and care of the sick, at the High school one afternoon each week, when possible, to a class of girls studying Domestic Science.

We wish to thank all those who contributed clothing (especially infants clothing) and other supplies during the past year.


