To the inhabitants of the Town of Hampstead, qualified to vote in Town Affairs.

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said town on Tuesday, the thirteenth day of March next, at eleven o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To hear the reports of auditors and committees and act thereon.
2. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year.
3. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year, and make appropriation of the same.
4. To see what sums of money the Town will raise to keep highways and bridges in repair and what method they will adopt to expend the same.
5. To see what sum of money the Town will raise or appropriate to pay the expenses of the Public Library for the ensuing year.
6. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the support of schools in addition to the amount required by law.
7. To see what sum of money the Town will raise or appropriate for the observance of Memorial Day and what method they will adopt to expend the same.

8. (By Request.) To see if the Town will vote to shingle the School House in District No. 4, and what sum of money they will raise or appropriate for this purpose and what method they will adopt to expend the same.

9. (By Request.) To see what action, if any, the Town will take in regard to the fence around School House in District No. 2.

10. (By Request.) To see if the Town will vote to erect a Soldier's Monument, and what sum of money they will raise or appropriate for this purpose. To choose all necessary committees and pass any vote relating thereto that may be necessary.

11. (By Request.) To see if the Town will vote to sell the Road Machine.

12. To see if the Town will authorize the selectmen to hire money for the use of the Town.

13. To see what action if any the Town will take in relation to the "Parsonage Fund" so called.

14. To see what sum of money, if any, the Town will appropriate to protect shade trees from Brown Tail Moths and what method they will adopt to expend the same.

REPORT OF BOARD OF HEALTH.

During the past year, the town while not wholly escaping contagious diseases, have been free from an epidemic of any kind, and are to be congratulated.

The several cases of scarlet fever, while terminating favorably to all, shows the utter laxity with which the law is enforced, in allowing people to roam at will, after being exposed or having had such or other disease, before proper fumigation.

Condemnation cannot be too severe in such cases, (whether the party unthinkingly or unwittingly come from towns infected, transmitting such diseases in their course,) and the law should be enforced to its fullest extent.
