STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the Town of Wolfeboro qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Brewster Memorial Hall, in said Town, on the second Tuesday of March next, at nine o'clock in the forenoon, to act on the following subjects:

ARTICLE 1. To choose a Town-clerk for the ensuing year, one Selectman for three years, Two Auditors, Treasurer, Collector of Taxes, Prosecuting Liquor Agent and Constable for the ensuing year, one Library Trustee and one Trustee of Trust Funds for three years.

ARTICLE 2. To elect one or more, not exceeding three, Highway Agents, or instruct the Selectmen to appoint one expert Highway Agent.

ARTICLE 3. To choose all other necessary Town officers and agents.
