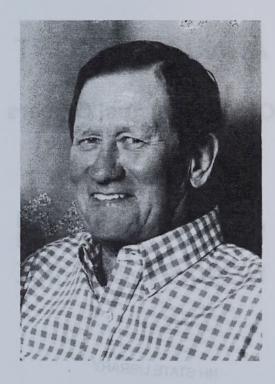

- Article 3- Children Unlimited- This agency provides services to strengthen families by promoting health, well-being, self-sufficiency and positive parenting through support and education. This past year, two families from Chatham received services.
- Article 4a &4b-Saco Valley Fire Department- This agency provides fire protection services for the town of Chatham.
- Article 5a &5b-**Fryeburg Rescue** This agency provides emergency coverage for the town of Chatham.
- Article 6-Lovell Recreation Department- Lovell Rec. offers 28 programs for the children living in Chatham to participate in. Chatham had 48 participants in these programs.
- Article 7- **Tri-County Community Action** This agency provides fuel and electrical assistance to low-income, elderly and or disabled people. They provided assistance to 16 residence of Chatham. 6 households were provided with fuel assistance (\$7,245) and 5 households were provided with electrical assistance (\$2,087).
- Article 8-Eastern Slope Airport- The airport is located in Fryeburg Maine. The funds are used for operation and maintenance costs.
- Article 9-**CASA** Court Appointed Special Advocates for Children would like our support. They provide services for abused and neglected children in New Hampshire. CASA served 54 children living in Carroll County
- Article 10-Charlotte Hobb Library- This library provides people with access to their extensive collection of books, access to the inter library loan system, many adult and children-oriented programs for both fun and enrichment, computer stations and a versatile copy machine.
- Article 11-Brownfield Food Pantry- Southwest Oxford County Nutrition, Inc. helps provide food for people in need. Hours of Operation are the third Thursday of each month. Hours are from 12:00pm to 4:00 pm. Located at 701 Pequawket Trail Rt. 113 Brownfield Maine.

- Article 12- Starting Point- This agency provided services for 5 Chatham residents. Services may have included crisis intervention, court advocacy, Child Advocacy Center accompaniment, in-person support and numerous referrals to a variety of social service providers.
- Article 13- Gibson Center-The Gibson center offers programs to senior citizens that provide them with nutritious meals and transportation. They also provide social/educational programs to enable seniors to stay actively involved in their communities.
- Article 14-Northern Human Services- This agency provided mental health care for 4 uninsured or under-insured persons from the town of Chatham for a total of 6.67 hours at a cost of \$1053.
- Article 15- White Mountain Community Health Center- This agency provides residents of Carroll County with medical care. They project helping 24 patients form Chatham in 2019 at a cost of about \$659 per person.
- Article 16- American Red Cross- In the past year the American Red Cross responded to 3 disaster incidents, assisting 11 residents of Carroll County. They installed 21 free smoke alarms, hosted 31 blood drives and hosted 225 courses where 1,794 residents were taught a variety of important lifesaving skills.
- Article 17 & 18- Capital Reserve funds- See Trustees report for the amount of money in each of the funds.

First and foremost I want to thank all of the citizens of the Towns we cover for your continued support of Fryeburg Rescue. We could not do our job as well as we do without it. We appreciate your feedback and are constantly evaluating and refining our service to suit the changing needs of the communities we serve.

We have a "new" unit 504; this was formerly our "crash truck". The new truck is better equipped to serve our needs with its primary mission as a wilderness extrication support vehicle. Please feel free to stop by and look at this vehicle.

We will be replacing 503 this summer as it is 14 years old and approaching its service limits. Much time and effort was spent to ensure the replacement unit will meet our needs well into the future, maximizing its value and investment.

We responded to 915 calls for our service in 2019. The breakdown was as follows: 544 calls in Fryeburg, 183 in Brownfield, 115 in Lovell, 27 in Chatham, 23 in Stow and mutual aid to other Towns and services 23.

Our Rescue Station is physically staffed from 6:00 A.M. through 6:00 P.M., 7 days a week with a minimum of 2 people available for all responses. At night we schedule 2 or 3 staff on- call. (We strive to position 1 person in Fryeburg, 1 in Brownfield and 1 in Lovell.)

For clarification, our budget to the Towns covers only the cost our our operations; including items such as fuel, medical supplies, building maintenance, and utilities. Up until now our payroll and all associated expenses were covered by the revenues we received from billing but, unfortunately, as costs – including the state mandated wage increase and associated employee expenses - continue to rise, our budget is being stretched ever tighter. The total cost to operate Fryeburg Rescue for 2019 was \$418,000.00+-.

We continue to offer community outreach programs including CPR and AED placements and we are in the process of reinvigorating our Junior Rescue program as well. We are always looking for people who would like to join our organization. EMS is an excellent way for you to serve your community, while learning some very valuable skills. Applications are available in our Rescue station, please stop by to inquire or apply.

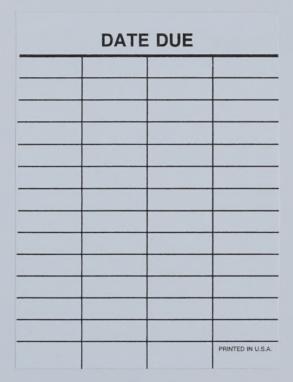
