





SOME STATISTICS FOR THE YEAR

Schools were maintained on the Hill, the River Road, on the Turnpike and during the winter in the Brick schoolhouse.

Thirty-one pupils were registered in all the schools during the year. They maintained an average attendance of 96.03 percent. Twenty-four were promoted at the end of the year.

The schools averaged being actually in session 352 half days during the year.

Six children were transported to school.

Three were in secondary schools outside of the district.

The school board members made 7 visits in schools during the year, the superintendent made 66 visits and 122 were made by citizens.

Public graduation exercises were held at Union Hall at the end of the year and Ora Morrill, Georgiana Wiser, Eda Atwood, and Frances Cass were promoted to high school work from the eighth grade.

The census in September, 1927, showed 32 pupils between 5 and 16 years old.
