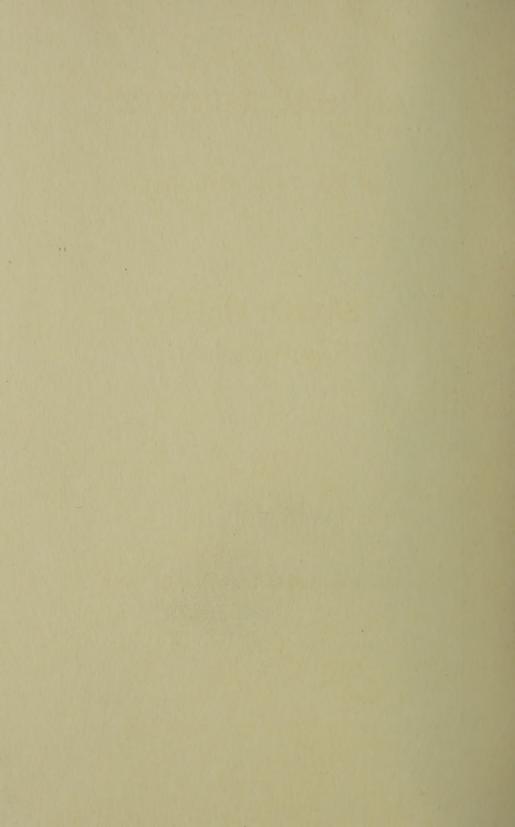

### TOWN WARRANT

### THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the Town of Brookfield, New Hampshire, in the County of Carroll in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs.

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Brookfield on Tuesday, the Tenth day of March next, at one of the clock in the afternoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray Town Charges for the ensuing year and to make appropriations for the same.
- 3. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to hire a sum of money to pay Town Charges in anticipation of taxes.
- 4. To formalize, by vote of the Town, the transfer of two strips of land, 33 feet in width and extending across part of the width of Grantors' (Lillian M. West, Jr.; Paul D. and Louise M. Seiler) land, in exchange for as much of the old highway as is no longer needed or used by virtue of the construction of the new roadway. As additional consideration the Town will provide and maintain suitable ingress and egress to the buildings of Lillian M. West, Jr. so long as she shall use and occupy the same.
- 5. To see if the Town will vote to accept Town Road Aid on Class V highways and raise and appropriate the sum of \$267.01 as the Town's share.
- 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 for the Sanbornville Fire Precinct.

- 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$300.00 for use of the Sanbornville dump.
- 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for the Gaffney Library.
- 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$175.00 for the Huggins Hospital.
- 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$50.00 for the Planning Board.
- 11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for control of Pine Blister Rust.
- 12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$79.52 for membership in the Lakes Region Association.
- 13. To see if the Town will vote to transfer the sum of \$2,000.00 from Cash Surplus to the Capital Reserve Account.
- 14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,500.00 to have all real property in the Town reappraised, for tax purposes, by State appraisers.
- 15. To see if the Town will vote to amend certain articles in the Zoning and Land Use Ordinance and the Building Regulations as appended hereto.
- 16. To see if the Town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to publish each year in conjunction with the Town Report a list of real property tax payers, said list to include valuation and amount of tax assessed for each separate parcel. (As requested by 18 petitioners)
- 17. To see if the Town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to investigate the feasibility of letting out all town road work on a yearly contract basis commencing in 1965, and to report their findings at a special town meeting not later than 30, June, 1964. (As requested by 18 petitioners)

- To choose a delegate to the Constitutional Convention.
- 19. To vote on the question "shall sweepstake tickets be sold in Brookfield."

### **Proposed Amendments to** Zoning and Land Use Ordinance and Building Regulations

### Page 3, Article 5, Paragraph D

Increasing size of lot to 81,225 square feet and frontage and depth to 285 feet.

### Page 8, Article 5

Provides that all work for which permit is issued must be completed within one year of date of issuance of said permit.

### Page 10, Article 9

Increases the minimum ground floor area of every new dwelling unit to 1200 square feet.

### REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the School Board and Citizens of Brookfield:

The current school year has seen changes of great importance to pupils and the school district. The action of the State Board of Education, beginning to implement the report of the interim Commission, dissolved Union No. 36. The school district of Brookfield now is aligned with nine other school districts in an enlarged Union No. 44. This is in accord with the current trend to create larger administrative units whose combined wealth can provide greater educational services for the pupils of our schools.

The popular, attention-seeking, comments on the educational program are those of the critics of our system. It is easier to disparage any program than it is to evaluate the positive values. It is worthy of note that educational systems abroad (European) are taking in whole or in part our programs which attempt to provide universal educational opportunity. This is true of England, Russia and the Scandinavian countries. The so called "aristocracy of brains" is not being supported as it has been in the past.

In view of these facts it seems appropriate to review some of the recent developments in the American Educational system and program. The developments of a positive nature can be subdivided in many ways. Three areas can be touched on briefly in this report.

### Curriculum

The changes in subject matter offerings, both in content and subject in the past decade are profound and far reaching. In the elementary school science is a recognized part of the days program from the first grade. New areas in geography and history untouched a decade ago are now generally accepted as part of the curriculum. Much greater depth is attempted and attained in these two areas. Mathematics has received a new emphasis. The changes in this area are aimed at a greater understanding of basic concepts. The program will result in greater mathematical progress for all pupils. The secondary program in science has been expanded. There are more subject areas being taught. In addition, the work in all science areas is much more intensive.

The introductions of different foreign language courses is indicative of a new vital interest in the needs of our civilization. The program in this area has had a change of emphasis.

In addition to the changes in the curriculum offerings, the changes in techniques of the teaching process have been extensive. This is due in part to the development of varied types of equipment. The use of television, projectors (motion picture, slide, overhead, opaque and micro), tape recorders and record players has been beneficial to both student and teacher. These tools have been used advantageously but educators have been experimenting with teaching techniques that are also making a direct contribution to educational progress. Team teaching, team learning, ungraded schools and advanced placement, are some of the techniques in more or less common use. All are designed to improve the educational program. Fundamentally, both the tools and techniques are implementing more fully the concept of individ-

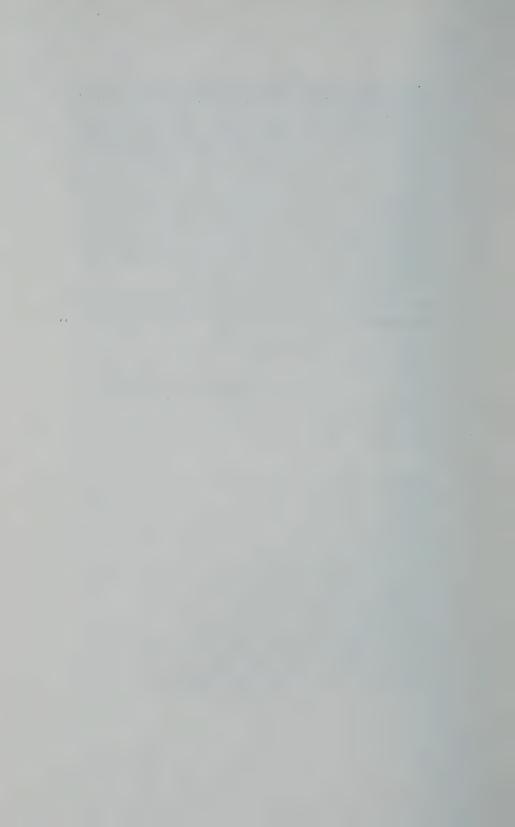
ualizing instruction. They are basically designed to permit each pupil to progress at his own rate and to realize his highest potential.

Like all other professional groups, teachers and administrators are raising the professional standards. This means in general that a better prepared and more competent person will be providing for the education of America's children and youth. Despite the improvements in all these phases there are some critics, who on little knowledge, indict the educational program. The public should draw up a balance sheet to see our educational assets. In those areas where improvement is needed, the profession and the public should strive cooperatively to affect the necessary adjustment.

It has been pleasant working with the School Board who are sincerely and conscientiously working to provide the best educational opportunity for the children of Brookfield.

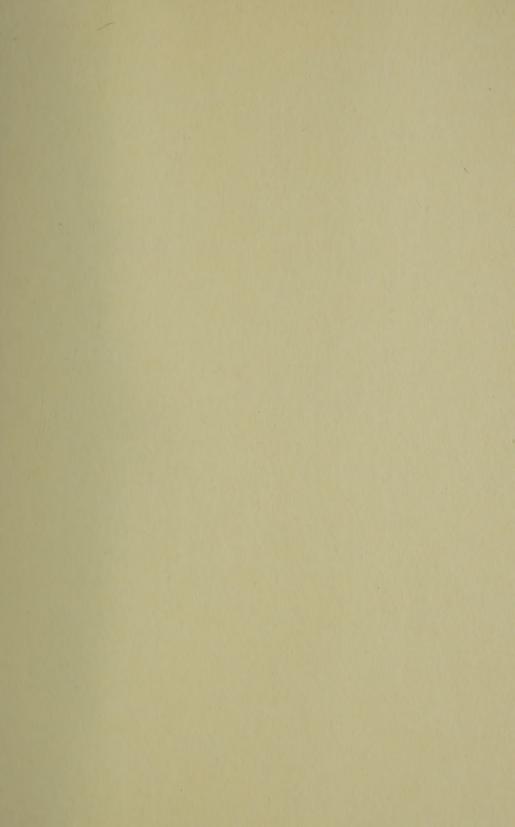
