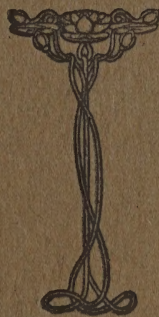

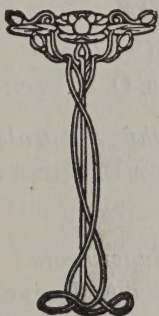

Warrant for Annual Town Meeting Year 1924

To the inhabitants in the town of Colebrook in the County of Coos, in said state, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the town hall in said town on the 11th day of March next at ten o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose by ballot and major vote a Town Clerk, for the year ensuing.
2. To choose by ballot and major vote one Selectman for the three years ensuing.
3. To choose by ballot and major vote one trustee of trust funds for the three years ensuing.
4. To choose by ballot and major vote all other necessary town officers and agents for the year ensuing.
5. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the support of poor for the year ensuing.
6. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the building and repair of highways and bridges for the year ensuing.
7. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the support of public library for the year ensuing.
8. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for town charges for the year ensuing.
9. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for police service for the year ensuing.
10. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the observance of Memorial day and care of Monument lots.

11. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the building and repair of sidewalks.

12. To see if the town will vote to continue the Pleasant street sewer and to raise money for that purpose

13. To see if the town will vote to put down an Asphalt road on Main street from the Mohawk Bridge to the Beaver Brook Bridge and to raise money for that purpose.

14. To see if the town will vote to resurface Colby Street and to raise money for that purpose.

15. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to Gravel Railroad Street in addition to the \$1000 raised last year.

16. To see if the town will vote to continue the electric lights from Everett Wiswell's to East Colebrook turn.

17. To see if the town will vote to build a new sidewalk on the North side of Colby Street and to raise money for that purpose.

18. To see if the town will vote to buy seats for the Town Hall and to raise money for that purpose.

19. To see if the town will vote to buy a road tractor and to raise money for that purpose

20. To see what sum of money the town will raise for care of cemeteries.

21. To see what action the town will take in regard to releasing, from the Colebrook Water Company, water for use in hydrants.

22. To see if the town will vote to pay the bill presented to the Selectmen by the Colebrook Water Company for alleged damage to water main.

23. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

24. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees and officers heretofore chosen and to pass any motion relating thereto.

25. To bring in your votes for the election of Delegates-at-large, Alternate Delegates-at-large, District Delegates, Alternate District Delegates to the National Conventions of the Democratic and Republican parties, to be held for the purpose of nominating party candidates for President and Vice President of the United States.
