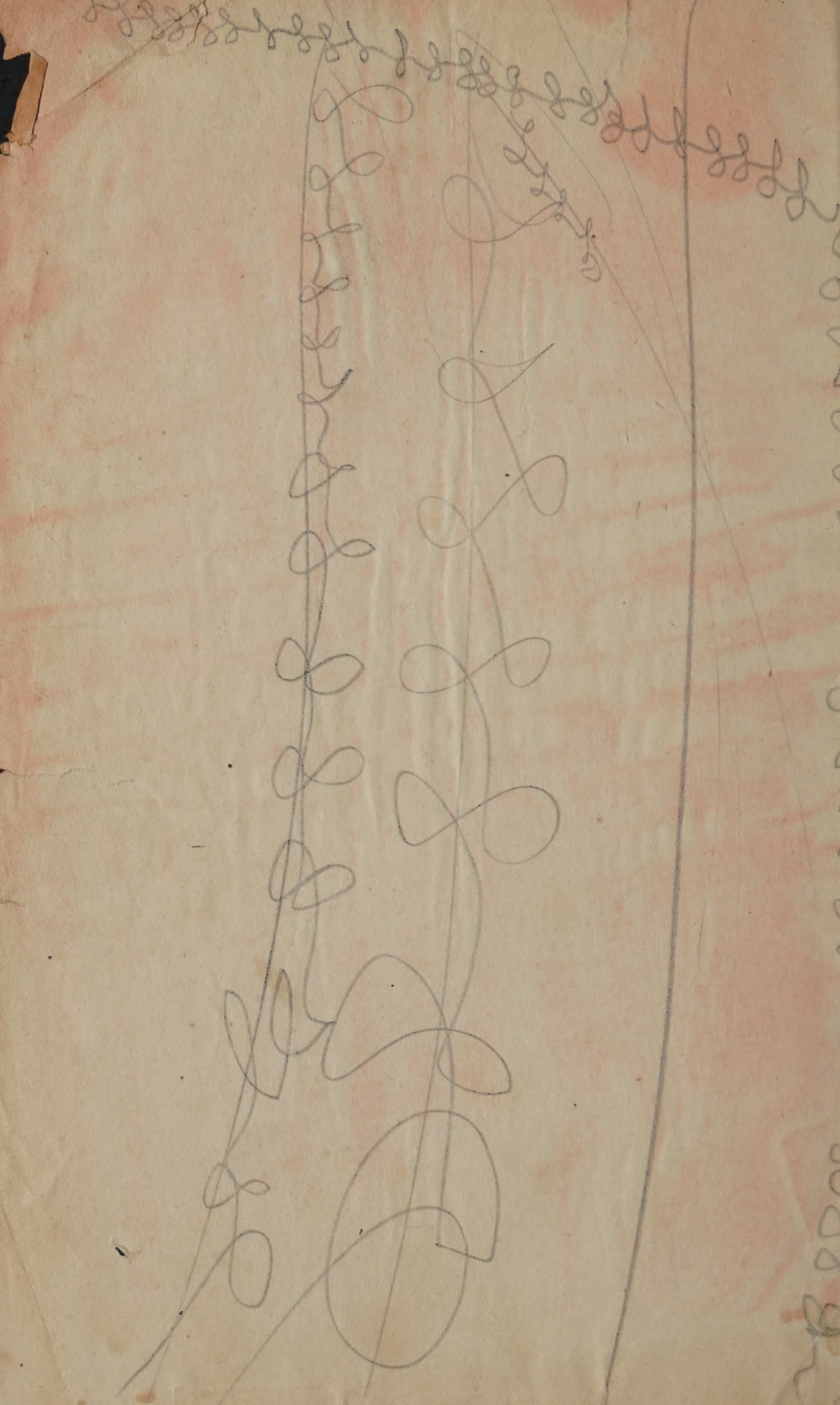

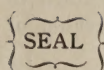

## State of New Hampshire

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To the inhabitants of the Town of Gorham, in the County of Coos, in said State qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet in Municipal Hall on Tuesday the eleventh day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To elect one selectman for three years, and choose all other necessary town officers for the ensuing year.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray the town charges for the ensuing year, and appropriate money for the same.

3. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for street lights.

4. To see if the town will authorize the selectmen to distribute the inventory blanks when taking the inventory.

5. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Public Library.

6. To see what sum the town will vote to raise for the retirement of town water bonds, or a sinking fund, and appropriate money therefor.

7. To see what action the town will take in regard to raising and appropriating money for police for the ensuing year.

8. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance of a trunk line road.

9. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Federal and State Aid Construction.

10. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for highways and bridges.

11. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for sewer and water commission.

12. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for common.

13. To see what amount the town will vote to raise for the retirement of Municipal Building Bonds, and appropriate money therefor.

14. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appro-

15. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the retirement of Cascade Water Bonds.

16. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for State Aid Maintenance.

17. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for permanent road construction.

18. To see if the town will vote to instruct the selectmen to procure a public dumping ground and provide for the burning of refuse and appropriate money for same.

19. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Cascade water and sewer extension.

20. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for sidewalks at Cascade Flat.

21. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for skating rink.

22. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for a gravel sidewalk on Glen street.

23. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for a cement sidewalk on Lower Main street.

24. To see if the town will vote to recind the vote passed under article 24 of the warrant of 1923, also see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for a cement sidewalk beginning at or opposite the schoolhouse. The location to be left to the selectmen.

25. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for a sewer on Washington street.

26. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for water on Glen road.

27. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for water to the Sanborn place.

28. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for water and sewer in the new High School.

29. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for a hose house at the Upper Village.

30. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for fire protection at Cascade.

31. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the use of the Grand Army.

32. To see if the town will authorize the selectmen to employ a stenographer to take a complete record of the proceedings of business at future town meetings, properly transcribe the same and have them retained on file in a ledger for that purpose. The expense of said stenographer to be paid out of town charges.



33. To see what action the town will take in regard to the following: Repairing bridges and abutments, painting bridges, construction of a bridge or culvert on Union street if necessary, locating certain streets, preparing Welcome signs, disposing of town buildings on Androscoggin street and Promenade street, also securing garage on Pleasant street, and question of sewerage in Malloy Park.

34. To see if the town will vote to amend the vote passed under article 30 at the adjourned annual meeting of 1922 held on May 16 of that year, by inserting between the words "It was voted that the" and the words "annual report" in the first line of said vote, the figures "1923" and by striking out the word "hereafter" in the second line so that said vote as amended shall read: "It was voted that the 1923 annual report of the Water and Sewer Commission show the number of miles of mains in the original town system and additions to same and size of pipe and costs of same as laid; also the number of miles of pipe, size of same and cost of same as laid in the Cascade extension and additions to same. Also the number of feet and size of all service pipe connected with the town system and a similar statement in relation to all service pipe laid on the Cascade extension. Also the kind and number of services connected with the original town system and the kind and number of services connected with the Cascade extension." And to further amend said vote by adding the following: And thereafter the Commission shall only report annually the same details for all new installations of mains and service pipe or other additions to the system made during each year in order to avoid the needless expense of reprinting each year the data contained in the 1923 report.

35. To see if the town will vote to rescind the vote passed under article 49 of the warrant of 1923.

36. To bring in your votes for the election of Delegates-at-Large, Alternate Delegates-at-Large, District Delegates, Alternate District Delegates to the National Conventions of the Democratic and Republican parties, to be held for the purpose of nominating party candidates for President and Vice-President of the United States.

37. To see if the town will vote to construct an over-head bridge over the tracks in the yard of the Grand Trunk Railroad at the head of School street or at such other location as may be most desirable and convenient for the public use, and appropriate money for the same, and choose a committee by nomination and election from the floor to carry out the provisions of any vote

that may be passed under this article.

38. To see if the town will vote to instruct the selectmen to issue a permit to druggists for the sale of liquor according to law, for the ensuing year.

39. To see if the town will vote to place the care and management of the Municipal Building in the hands of a Board of Trustees consisting of three persons to be nominated and elected from the floor, who shall have exclusive control of said building.

40. To see if the town will vote to adopt the following rule for the guidance of the Board of Water and Sewer Commissioners in relation to their control, management, and direction of the water and sewer system: "No member of the Board of Water and Sewer Commissioners nor any person who is employed as superintendent of any privately owned water system in the town of Gorham shall be appointed superintendent of the town water and sewer system."

41. To see if the town will vote to reconsider the vote passed at the last annual town meeting whereby it was voted to build a cement sidewalk from the Osgood corner at the Upper Village, so called, to the Peabody line on the south-westerly side of the Berlin road; and instead thereof to build a cement sidewalk on the north-easterly side of said road beginning at Cotter avenue and extending to the Peabody line.

42. To see if the town will vote to instruct the selectmen to install electric lights at the Upper Village as follows: One light at the junction of each of the following streets with the Berlin road, to wit: Cotter avenue, Madison avenue, Elm street, Pine street, and River street, also to install a light at the junction of the street on which Alexander Izatt's house is located, with Elm street and at the foot of Pine street.

43. To see if the town will appoint a committee to investigate the feasibility of establishing a town forest and make recommendations at the regular town meeting in March, 1925.

44. To see if the town will vote to raise money to purchase a tractor and plow for the purpose of clearing the streets of snow and for other public purposes.

45. To hear reports of town officers, agents, committees, heretofore chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.

46. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

We are, as usual, appending to the preceding report a list of recommendations and a condensed statement of recommended appropriations.

This has been a difficult year for your committee, because of the large number of requests for needed improvements, and the increased requirements of the school district and the high school building committee.

If the town should raise by taxation enough to meet all the demands made your tax rate would be about 3.80 per \$100.00 but by consulting with the various departments, reducing estimates wherever possible, and holding over some projects until next year, we are able to present a budget which if voted according to our recommendations, would give a tax rate of not exceeding 3.10 per \$100.00.

We recommend that the sum of \$8,000.00 be appropriated for town charges for the ensuing year, and that it be taken from any unappropriated money in the hands of the Treasurer.

The state engineer estimates the cost of maintenance of trunk line roads as \$8,300.00 of which the State pays one-half. We recommend that the town raise and appropriate \$4,150.00.

The state engineer estimates the cost of state aid maintenance as \$1,000.00 of which the state pays one-half. We recommend that the town raise and appropriate \$500.00.

The engineer's estimate for completing the road on Gorham hill from Mr. Currier's house to the Randolph line is \$20,000.00. Of this amount the Federal government will pay one-half, and the State will pay one-third of the balance. We recommend that the town raise and appropriate \$6,666.66.

We recommend that the selectmen and road agent arrange, if possible, with the Brown Company for ploughing the main road from the Berlin line to the Shelburne line, and also such of the side streets as, in their judgment, seems advisable. For this purpose we recommend that the town raise and appropriate \$1,000.00.

We recommend that the repairing of bridges and abutments of same, the painting of bridges, and the construction of a bridge or culvert on Union street, if necessary, be left to the selectmen, and that any money expended for these purposes be taken from the unappropriated money in the treasury.

Because of the need of several new street lights in different parts of the town, we recommend increasing the appropriation to \$3,000.00.

In Malloy park some system of sewerage will be necessary but because of some uncertainty as to the best system of installa-

tion, we recommend that the Water and Sewer Commission install cess pools satisfactory to the Board of Health, at the three houses of Mr. Malloy, taking the expense of same from the maintenance money, and that the question of permanent sewers be considered next year.

We recommend that the town raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,500.00 for the Common. This will make it possible to continue the good work done last year and still further beautify and improve this recreation center.

We recommend that the location of the hose house at the Upper Village be left to the Selectmen and Fire Wards, and that the town raise and appropriate the sum of \$700.00.

We recommend that the Selectmen be instructed to procure suitable "Welcome" signs to be placed at the four entrances to the town on the main highways; also suitable signs of direction to be placed at the junction of roads in the town wherever necessary, and that the expense of same be taken from any unappropriated money in the treasury.

We recommend that the Selectmen be instructed to locate and mark the boundaries of the main road from Moose River to Moose Brook; also the Randolph road from its junction with the main road at the Upper Village to the Grand Trunk crossing; also Pleasant street.

We recommend that such portion of the vote under Article 24, at the annual meeting of 1923, as provided for the building of a cement sidewalk from Osgood's corner to the corner near Peabody's be recinded; and that the Selectmen shall, after locating the street boundaries at the Upper Village, locate and build a cement sidewalk, beginning at, or opposite, the schoolhouse, and extending towards Gorham Village, on whichever side shall, in their judgment, best accommodate the public.

We recommend that \$10,000.00 be appropriated for water and sewer extension at Cascades, and that it be taken from any unappropriated money in the treasury.

We recommend the building of a cement sidewalk with proper retaining walls and driveway approach in front of Mr. Berwick's property on Lower Main street, and that the town raise and appropriate \$1,000.00 for the same.

We recommend that the selectmen be given authority to sell the old town building on Androscoggin street, and the building at the junction of Church street and Promenade street, and to purchase the Madison House garage at the corner of Pleasant street and Jewell street as a storage and repair place for town property,

if in their judgment it is advisable to do so, and if satisfactory arrangements can be made. We recommend that any expense of purchase or transfer be taken from any unappropriated money in the treasury.

We recommend that the following article be inserted in the Town Warrant.

To see if the town will authorize the selectmen to employ a stenographer to take a complete record of the proceedings of business at future town meetings, properly transcribe the same, and have them retained on file in a ledger for that purpose. The expense of said stenographer to be paid out of town charges.

## Water and Sewer Commission

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The Water and Sewer Commissioners of the Town of Gorham, herewith submit their report for the year ending January 31, 1924.

The vote passed at the last annual meeting requiring an itemized report of the receipts and expenditures has been complied with as the following pages will show.

Five new services have been installed at Cascade and until the town system is able to get water on to the hill these services will be supplied by the Berlin Water Co., and the connection has been made.

3934 feet of new sewers have been laid, 2006 feet at Cascade, of 6, 8, 12 and 15-inch size. 1928 feet of 6 and 8-inch sewer pipe have been laid on Wilson street, Madison avenue and another short unnamed street. A short section of the 6-inch sewer in rear of I. O. O. F. block has been relaid with 8-inch pipe.

The "Island" so called, has been taken over from the Alpine Aqueduct Co., as favorably reported by the committee empowered to act by the last annual meeting, and is now supplied with town water. The consent of the Public Service Commission was obtained.

An additional supply of water has been connected with the system, and the supply ought to be sufficient for all needs for years to come.

Settlement with the Brown Company, A. D. Barrett and E. H. Barrett for laying additional water supply pipe across their land has not been made.

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Gorham, N. H., March 13, 1923, 9 A. M.

Meeting was called to order by the moderator, H. G. Noyes, who read the warrant and proceeded to take up the following articles:

It was voted to keep the polls open until 6.30 P. M.

It was voted to expend work on the articles in the warrant from 11.30 to 1.30 P. M.

It was voted to vote on article 53 at the same time we vote on article one.

Article 1. Philip K. Ross was elected selectman for three year.

Adelbert E. Leavitt was elected treasurer, Merton M. Willis was elected town clerk, Thomas E. Malloy was elected road agent, Harriett L. Marble was elected library trustee for three years, Elisha H. Cady and Joseph O. George was elected auditors, Alfred O. Mortenson was elected a member of the water and sewer commission for three years, Guy L. Shorey was elected trustee of trust funds, under chapter 162 laws of 1915 for three years.

Article 2. It was voted a sum of \$8,000.00 and the same be taken out of surplus amount on hand.

Article 3. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,500.00.

Article 4. It was voted to allow the selectmen to distribute inventory blanks at the time of taking inventory.

Article 5. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00.

To inspect such part of the Alpine System and if they consider it advisable and the price reasonable, that they purchase it for the town and connect the town system therewith. If in their judgment it was not adviseable to do this, that they so report to the Water and Sewer Commission, and that the Water and Sewer Commission be then authorized to extend the town system to the Island by laying new pipe, that the sum of \$1,500.00 be raised and appropriated for this purpose.

The above was carried.

It was voted that a committee of three be elected from the floor. Chas. A. Chandler, George Thurlow and Henry Fancy was elected.

Article 23. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of

\$10,000.00.

Article 24. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000.00, and \$500.00 of this amount be laid out from Marble's hill down Main street.

Article 25. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$700.00.

Article 26. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00.

Article 27. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00.

Article 28. It was voted that the town build a sidewalk on Pleasant street and \$500.00 be taken out of the funds on hand for the same.

Article 29. It was voted 84 to 72 to pass over this article.

Article 30. It was voted to install a catch basin on Highland avenue.

Article 31. It was voted that street lights be installed on the Randolph road.

Article 32. It is moved that the Water and Sewer Commission be authorized and instructed to construct a proper in-take dam and reservoir on Perkins brook in the Dixon neighborhood, so-called, and connect it by pipe line with the main pipe line of the water system at the point where a tee was left for that purpose when the water plant was originally installed; that this work be done in the early part of the coming summer and that the expense of doing it be paid for out of surplus funds on hand otherwise appropriated. The above was carried.

The committee believe that town officers should receive pay for their services which is just and reasonable.

Mr. Libby wrote the State Tax Commission for a statement showing the salaries paid by some of the different towns in New Hampshire, which might be used to compare with salaries paid by the town of Gorham, having regard to population and valuation.

To see if the town will vote to require its different town officers who have the expending of the town's money for their various departments to itemize in the annual printed report all moneys received, from whom, and when received and each expenditure, showing to whom paid, for what purpose paid and the work done or material furnished therefor, in addition to and supplementing the condensed uniform accounts prescribed by the State Tax Commission.

42. To see if the town will vote to adopt "Cushing's Manual of Parliamentary Law" for the government of the proceedings of its town meetings.

43. To see if the town will vote to annually employ an expert public accountant to audit the accounts of the different town departments in conjunction with the regularly elected town auditors who shall make a report upon the state of the finances of the town, the condition of the town accounts, whether receipts and

expenditures are properly entered up and vouched for and give such other information as the inhabitants of the town ought to have in relation to town finances, which report shall be printed in the annual town report, the expense of said public accountant to be paid for out of the money appropriated for town charges.
