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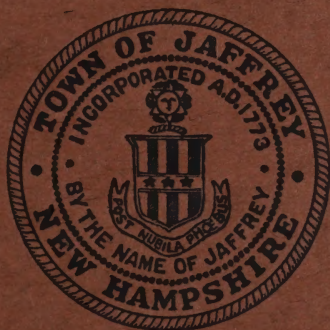

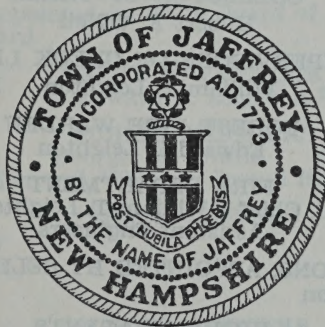

# Town Warrant

## THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Jaffrey, in the County of Cheshire, Qualified to Vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Union Hall, in said Town, on Tuesday, the fourteenth day of March, next, at nine o'clock in the forenoon, to act on the following subjects:

1. To choose a Town Clerk, one Selectman for three years, and all other necessary Town Officers.
2. To hear all reports and act thereon.
3. To raise such sums of money as may be required for the support of the poor, building and repairing highways and bridges, fire department, Memorial Day, street lights, and all other town charges.
4. To see if the Town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,869.50 for State Aid Construction, upon condition that the State allot the sum of \$2,151.75, to be expended on the "Turnpike," so-called, beginning where work ended last year, or act in any way relating thereto, as petitioned for by Alfred S. Despres and others.
6. To see if the Town will vote to discontinue a portion of town road near Badger Pond, providing a right-of-way of suitable width is conveyed to the Town in lieu thereof.
7. To see if the Town will vote to discontinue the highway leading northerly from the "Turnpike Road," so-called, at a point immediately east of the residence of John W. Badger, or act in any way relating thereto.
8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money to run a line of water pipe into the Old Town Burial Ground at Jaffrey Center, or act in any way relating thereto, as petitioned for by B. F. Cann and others.
9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money to be expended on putting a sewer through Charlonne Street, or act in any way relating thereto, as petitioned for by Mabel P. Urquhart and others.
10. To see if the Town will vote to accept the fire truck built by the Jaffrey Center Fire Department, or act in any way relating thereto.
11. To see how much the Town will vote to pay the Firemen, or act in any way relating thereto.
12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$200.00 to provide a swimming instructor and life guard at Contocook Lake, or act in any way relating thereto.

13. To see if the Town will vote to accept the street leading west from North Street, known as Parent Street and being forty feet wide, or act in any way relating thereto as petitioned for by Ludger Pelletier and others.

14. To see if the Town will vote to adopt an ordinance pertaining to the observance of the Lord's Day.

15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 for band concerts during the summer of 1933, or act in any way relating thereto, as petitioned for by George A. Hart and others.

# School Warrant

## THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the School district in the town of Jaffrey qualified to vote in district affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Union Hall in said district on the thirteenth day of March 1933, at 7:30 o'clock in the afternoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose a Moderator for the coming year.
2. To choose a Clerk for the ensuing year.
3. To choose a Member of the School Board for the ensuing three years.
4. To choose a Treasurer for the ensuing year.
5. To determine and appoint the salaries of the School Board and Truant Officer, and fix the compensation of any other officers or agent of the district.
6. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees, or Officers chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.
7. To choose Agents, Auditors and Committees in relation to any subject embraced in this warrant.
8. To see if the district will vote to make any alteration in the amount of money required to be assessed for the ensuing year for the support of public schools and the payment of the statutory obligations of the district, as determined by the school board in its annual report.
9. To see if the district will raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed Seventeen Hundred (\$1,700) Dollars for repairs on the roof and walls of Conant High School building, and on the roof of Union Hall annex, or take any action relating thereto.
10. To see if the district will raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed Two Hundred (\$200) Dollars for the employment of a school nurse, or take any action relating thereto.

## TOWN SURVEYS—REPORT NO. 5

Selectmen of Jaffrey, N. H.  
Gentlemen:

Herewith is the progress report of the Town Surveys to January 31, 1933.

During the year additional surveys were made as follows: North Street from Peterboro Road to H. Cutter's Bradley Court, Main Street from Charlonne Street to the Catholic Church, Lawrence Street, and River Street from Gray Line Garage to the Mountain Stream bridge. A traverse was run from the foot of Cutter Hill on North Street across lots to Main Street at Charlonne Street to tie in these two street surveys and to locate an old lot line of the original town layout. Measurements of the ground plan of buildings on Main and North Streets were made.

The village surveys are plotted on cloth backed paper sheets, 24x34 inches in size, and at the present time there are 13 sheets laid out. Seven of these are practically complete as far as physical features are concerned.

Voted that the Selectmen be authorized to appoint the remaining officers.

Voted to elect two Highway Agents.

Voted, that until otherwise ordered by vote of the town, the time for closing the polls at all town and State elections and Primaries shall be six o'clock p. m.

Voted to accept and adopt the town reports as printed, except the Selectmen's estimate to be taken up later.

Voted that the amount of the County Tax in the Selectmen's estimate be changed to read \$6,777.00.

Voted that, Whereas in the year 1910 the late Derostus P. Emory gave to the town of Jaffrey the sum of Two Thousand Dollars the same to be held in trust for the term of ten years and the income thereof to be turned into the town treasury annually and at the expiration of said term of ten years said sum to be turned into the town treasury to be disposed of as the town might direct, and Whereas, said sum of two thousand dollars was turned into the town treasury during the year 1920 but no disposition thereof was directed by the town: now therefore be it Moved, That the town raise and appropriate the sum of Two Thousand Dollars to be held in trust by the Trustees of Trust Funds as the Derostus P. Emory Fund, the income to accumulate until such time as the town by vote may direct the income, or the principal, or both to be otherwise disposed of.

Voted to raise and appropriate \$3,000.00 for State Aid Maintenance upon condition that the state allot the sum of \$3,000.00.

Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,500.00 for Trunk Line maintenance, upon condition that the State allot the sum of \$2,500.00.

Voted that the town raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,869.50 for state aid construction, upon condition that the state allot the sum of \$2,151.75 to be expended on the "Turnpike" so-called, westerly beginning where work ended two years ago.

Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of Three Hundred Dollars and the Selectmen be authorized to borrow \$300.00 to build a cement sidewalk on the east side of North Street in East Jaffrey Village, on the same conditions as the sidewalks previously built, beginning at the land of Hiram E. Cutter and southerly to the old ash sidewalk, distance about 667 feet.

Voted unanimously by a rising vote to adopt the following resolution:

Whereas, We the voters of the town of Jaffrey, have learned with great satisfaction of the intention of our fellow-citizen, George E. Emory, to present to the town modern fire fighting equipment: Now therefore be it

Resolved, That we, the voters of Jaffrey in town meeting assembled this eighth day of March 1932 hereby express our gratitude and hearty appreciation to Mr. Emory for this needed and appropriate gift; and be it further

Resolved, That the Selectmen of Jaffrey be and are hereby authorized to accept, in the name of the town, such equipment as shall be offered; and be it further

Resolved, That these resolutions be spread on the records of the town, and that the Town Clerk be hereby instructed to transmit a copy of these resolutions, suitably engraved, to George E. Emory.

Voted, that the sum of Three Thousand Dollars be raised and appropriated to build a new fire house on the site where the

engine house now stands in East Jaffrey Village, with such additional land as may be necessary to acquire, the same to be expended under the direction of the Selectmen; provided, however, that if such fire fighting equipment as shall be given to the town by Mr. George E. Emory can be suitably accommodated in the present fire house, the Selectmen are hereby instructed to use such part of the appropriation hereby made as shall be necessary to remodel and refit the present fire house for such accommodation.

Voted, that the town accept and adopt the licensing system for milk dealers as provided in sections 4 to 10 inclusive, Chapter 163 of the Public Laws.

Voted, that the town raise and appropriate Three Hundred Dollars for town surveys.

Voted, that the town raise and appropriate Two Hundred Dollars to provide for a swimming instructor and life guard at Contocook Lake during July and August, under the direction of the Jaffrey Parent-Teachers Association.

Voted to pass over Art. 14 (Probation Officer and Clerk of Court).

Voted, that the Selectmen be authorized to sell to the United Shoe Machinery Corporation about three acres of the Danforth land between K-K Road and the Boston & Maine railroad.

A Presidential Primary was held in connection with this meeting which is properly recorded on the Clerk's record.

## REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the School Board of Jaffrey:

I submit herewith my fifteenth annual report as superintendent of schools, this being the twenty-fourth in the series under union supervision. I also include the report of Mr. Beal, Headmaster of Conant High School.

The total school enrollment for the present year is 551 which is twenty-five larger than for the first twelve weeks of last year. The total enrollment for the last school year was 562, the largest the schools have ever had. This enrollment is one hundred more than for the school year 1924-25, only seven years ago.

There were no changes in the teaching force for the present school year. Mr. Forcier was transferred from the seventh grade to the high school, although continuing to teach some subjects in the junior high department.

Miss Jackson, who taught the second division of grade five last year, continued with the same pupils this year as teacher of the second division of grade six.

Miss Mary Hurley was transferred from grades six and seven to the seventh grade when Mr. Forcier was transferred to the high school.

On account of the pressure of outside work Miss Emma LaFreniere was unable to give the usual physical examinations early in the school year. After our schools had taken a recess of one week in January on account of the large number of pupils and teachers who were ill with "grippe" colds, the school board secured Miss Bertha M. Sweeney to examine all the pupils. This examination occupied two weeks, and the findings have been carefully tabulated.

Financial reasons compelled the suspension of the evening schools during the present school year. The evening school work had been carried on for more than fifteen years with very satisfactory results.

The preparation of the budget for the coming year involves rather drastic reductions in order to meet the financial situation. It will be necessary to reduce practically all items except fixed charges ten per cent or more, and will probably necessitate the rearrangement of certain grades and the elimination of one teacher for the next year in spite of the fact that we now have the largest schools we have ever had.

In the school board budget the estimate for minor repairs has been cut to the lowest possible figure, but certain rather extensive repairs required on the roof of the Conant High School building, and on the roof of Union Hall annex are major repairs that will require action under a separate article.

In closing I desire to thank the school board, teachers, pupils, parents, and all who have co-operated to help carry on the work of the schools of Jaffrey.

## REPORT OF HEADMASTER OF HIGH SCHOOL

To Lewis S. Record, Superintendent of Schools, East Jaffrey, N. H.

The following is my third annual report as Headmaster of Conant High School.

### Teaching Staff

While there are no changes in the personnel of the teaching staff this year, it has been deemed necessary to give Mr. Forcier more work in the High School. Miss Evelyn Messer has continued her Domestic Science work in the seventh and eighth grades as well as in the High School, and Mrs. Mildred Whitcomb is again supervisor of music.

### Enrollment and Attendance

The total enrollment for the year is one hundred eleven and the actual membership of February 15 is one hundred eight, of which thirty-nine are boys and sixty-nine girls. This is an increase of nine over last year's enrollment. These pupils are distributed by grades as follows:

This year Conant High is a member of the Monadnock Attendance League which includes Milford, Amherst, Wilton, and Appleton schools. Each month an attendance and a tardiness report are kept and these are checked with those of the other schools. Two prizes will be awarded in June.

### Extra-Curricula Activities

**Music.** Under the supervision of Mrs. Mildred Whitcomb of Keene the high school chorus, Glee Club, and orchestra are all functioning well. The orchestra is starting modestly and is the out-growth of the Harloway Band which meets this year under the direction of Mr. Mason again. The Girls' Glee Club consists of twenty-four young ladies picked from the four classes and the faculty. Rehearsals are weekly.

**Scholarship.** At the 1932 graduation exercises the following awards were made: For highest honors in History, Randy Cournoyer; in English, Annette Deschenes; best all-round girl, Vieno Hautanen; headmaster's prize, Arthur Coll. For this year Miss Ruth Peckham is offering a prize in typewriting to the most accurate pupil as a result of the five monthly accuracy tests.

The names of eight honor pupils have been added to the Honor Roll kept in the main room, and this board is now up to date.

**Washington, D. C., Trips.** Each freshman class decides whether or not it wants to make the Washington, D. C., trip during its senior year. If this decision meets with the approval of the School Board, each individual must save twenty-five cents per week for thirty-six weeks each year. Thus at the end of their senior year each pupil has saved thirty-six dollars of the fifty dollars which seems to be the average expense for this seven-day trip. The difference is made up from the earnings of the class as a whole. The earnings of this year's class have made it possible to cut the amount per individual to less than twenty dollars.

**Athletics.** Thirty letters were awarded to the boys and girls in basketball and baseball last year. Class games were held in

these sports as well as in volley ball and playground ball. It is hoped that some time soon the girls may have another major sport such as field hockey or soccer. Both boys and girls are represented again in the Monadnock Interscholastic Leagues this year, and the girls' team is giving a good account of itself. A field day was held this fall for the grades 5-9.

Much credit is due Mr. Homer Forcier for his personal interest and attention to the athletic program of the seventh and eighth grades. A few games are arranged for these pupils each year and Mr. Forcier has charge of these trips.

**Junior Play.** The class of 1934 presented its Junior Play, "Hold That Line, Jimmy," on February 10, 1933. This comedy made a fine hit and netted the class about seventy dollars for its Washington trip fund. The pupils were coached by Miss Margaret Cournoyer.

**Library.** Grateful acknowledgements are here made to Mrs. Alice Poole, Mr. George Duncan, and Mr. Robert Hamill for gifts of books to our school library.

**Health.** A special nurse examined high school as well as grade pupils this winter, and gave the pupil a report to take home in all cases where attention was necessary. This report showed a large percent of pupils who need to have their teeth taken care of. In this connection I believe that all pupils who are candidates for athletic teams should be examined first by a physician.

**Conclusion.** All that I said in my last year's report about our growing school applies to the present year also. With the graduation of the seniors in June we shall lose twenty-four pupils and gain nearly forty in the entering freshman group. Our seventh grade next year will have about sixty pupils, and in two years this class will be entering high school.

All parents and those interested in their transportation should note the new state requirement concerning tardiness. Any pupil not in his or her seat when the bell rings is considered tardy, no matter what the cause. On stormy days everyone concerned should plan to leave ten or fifteen minutes earlier than usual.

Finally all teachers want to co-operate with the parents in every way possible for the advancement of your children and the progress of our schools. If it is inconvenient for you to visit school, we shall be glad to go to your home.
