

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town House in said Bridgewater on Tuesday, the eleventh day of March next, at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 7. To see if the Town will vote to accept the provisions of the law in regard to State Aid on Bridges and make appropriation for same.

- 8. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise for Snow Removal.
- 9. To see what action the Town will vote to take in regard to the Improvement of the northerly section of the Point Road, so called, to make the necessary appropriation and elect an agent.
- 10. To see what action the Town will vote to take in regard to establishing a fund for the future replacement of Snow Removal Equipment and make appropriation for same.
- 11. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise for the Observance of Old Home Day.
- 12. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise for the Observance of Memorial Day.
- 13. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.
