11. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$1,000.00 to secure from the State \$2,000.00 for permanent road from Rumney Village to Stinson Lake.

12. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$25.00 to help defray expenses for Old Home Day.

13. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate to buy new chairs and new curtain for town hall.

14. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for permanent water to the Village Cemetery.

15. To see if the town will vote to allow 2 per cent discount on all taxes paid before July first.

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## REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

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To the School Board and Citizens of the Rumney School District:

Ladies and Gentlemen:

I hereby submit my sixth annual report as Superintendent of Schools. The statistical portion of the report follows.

The teaching staff of the district remains the same with the exception of the appointment of Stella M. Olsen at Stinson Lake. The enrollment at the Village School has dropped from last year and at this writing is twenty-three. Grades I - II - III - V are enrolled in the primary room and VI - VII VIII in the grammar room. To even the teaching load V Grade History and Geography are seated in the grammar room. There is no IV grade this year. The entire enrollment of the district with less than 30 at the village school and 8 at Quincy qualifies the district for state aid for only six teachers while it now has seven on its staff. If the 7 teachers are continued with the present enrollment the expence of the 7th teacher falls entirely on the district.

Since my last report considerable repair work has been done throughout the district. At the Depot Grammar Room walls and ceiling were painted and desks varnished. At West Rumney the shed was shingled. At Stinson Lake the toilet was enlarged so that the boys and girls have separate compartments and the school room was painted and whitened. The furnaces at the Village and Depot were overhauled and appear to be working very satisfactorily. The flagpole at the Depot was shortened and painted. A piano was bought for the Montview School.

It is my recommendation throughout this supervisory union that the honor roll for perfect attendance be discontinued after the present year. Originally intended to increase attendance I am firmly convinced that, at the expense of health, it defeats its own ends. Children with hard colds, sore throats, etc., often forerunners of contagious diseases, expose the entire school to illness in their zeal to maintain perfect attendance. The State Board of Health says that when contagious diseases are prevalent such children should stay at home. These children often times should not be sent out in stormy weather, and there are probably times when small children, tired or nervous, may well be kept at home a day or two. The whole matter of school attendance is one of common sense. When children are well and able they must attend, and when they are sick and ailing they should stay at home. The children on honor rolls would probably attend regularly anyway, and those of poor attendance are not motivated to attend any more regularly.

As indicated in my last report the water supply of the schools should be entirely under the control of the Board and the opportunity to do so at the Village should be taken at once. The comfortable and dignified office of the School Board in the renovated town hall shows the esteem of the people of Rumney for education.
