

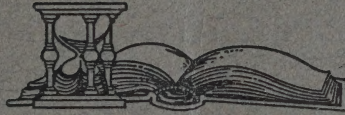

TOWN WARRANT

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the Town of Seabrook, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall, in said town on the second Tuesday of March next, at ten o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

Article 1. To elect a town clerk, one selectman for a term of three years, town treasurer, collector of taxes, three constables, three highway agents, three overseers of the poor, and all other necessary town officials for the year ensuing.

Article 2. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the expense of the general government, for the protection of persons and property, for health and sanitation, for highways and bridges, for the town poor, and all other necessary expenditures for the year ensuing.

Article 3. To see if the town will vote to allow the selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes, and renew and refund town notes.

Article 4. To see if the town will vote to place the maintenance of its highways under the supervision of one highway agent.

Article 5. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to complete the town vault.

Article 6. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the building of a sidewalk in the Slough, so-called.

Article 7. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of seventy-five dollars (\$75) to be used toward defraying the expenses of Memorial Day.

Article 8. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise toward the observance of Old Home Day, and to appoint committees for same.

Article 9. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of eight hundred dollars (\$800), for the erection of a cement bridge, the location of same to be left in the hands of the selectmen.

Article 10. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of five hundred dollars (\$500) to be paid to the Exeter & Hampton Street Railway Co., in case they show a deficit for the year 1924.

Article 11. To see if the town will vote to establish in Seabrook a Municipal Court under the provisions of Section 9 of Chapter 30 of the laws of 1915 and its amendments.

Article 12. To see if the town will appropriate the sum of one hundred dollars (\$100) to be paid as a first annual salary of the Justice of the Municipal Court for the Town of Seabrook, as provided by Section 10 of Chapter 30 of the laws of 1915.

Article 13. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of five hundred dollars (\$500) to be spent on the Collins Road.

Article 14. To see what sum of money the town will appropriate for the care of its shade trees.

Article 15. To see what sum of money the town will appropriate for street lights and to locate same.

Article 16. To see how the town will dispose of the income of Common Island, Dow and Bell Marsh.

Article 17. To see if the town will vote to purchase any fire fighting apparatus.

Article 18. To see if the town will raise a sum of money for the purchase of fire fighting apparatus and how much.

Article 19. To see what action the town will take in giving up our rights in Town Hall with the Baptist Society.

Article 20. To see if the town will vote to have the list of taxable property and valuation of same printed.

Article 21. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the printing of its town valuation.

Article 22. To see what period of time the town will limit for a discount to be made on the payment of taxes.

Article 23. To transact all other business that may legally come before said meeting.
