You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said town on the second Tuesday of March next at nine o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose a Town Clerk for the ensuing year.
2. To choose a Town Treasurer for the ensuing year.
3. To choose one Selectman for the ensuing three years.
4. To choose a Road Agent for the ensuing year.
5. To choose Tax Collector, Constables, Fence Viewers, Measurers of Wood, Surveyors of Lumber, Library Trustees, Trustees of Trust Funds, and other officers as the voters may direct.
6. To raise money for highways and bridges, town charges, and other necessary expenses.
7. To see if the town will raise the amount of money required by the State for State Aid and Trunk Line maintenance.
8. To see if the town will raise money for Old Home Day.
9. To see if the town will accept the trust funds of Louisa Belt French, Lucy J. Porter and John J. Chandler.
10. To see if the town will raise money for street lights on the Common at East Alstead.

12. To see if the town will vote to allow discount on taxes and how much.

## REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

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To the School Board and Citizens of Alstead:

I herewith submit my third annual report as Superintendent of Schools.

### ORGANIZATION

May I record with appreciation the forming of a parent-teachers association at East Alstead.

### TRANSPORTATION

During the summer of 1927 it became evident that the school at East Alstead would, in the fall, be too large for one teacher to handle. Instead of hiring a new teacher, buying new seats and putting in condition the extra room at East Alstead it was decided to transport the upper grade children from East Alstead to Alstead Village. This arrangement has proved to be satisfactory, being both educationally advantageous to the children and financially advantageous to the district. It should be kept in mind that the school team from East Alstead avoids the necessity of hiring two teachers, one at East Alstead and one at Forristall.

The district has transported this year, only elementary pupils living two miles or more from the school house. There are certain children living just under this two mile limit for whom the walk to school is a real hardship. The district could well consider transporting these children.

### BUILDINGS

During the summer of 1927 the building at Alstead Village was painted with two coats of white paint. The blinds were repaired and painted green. Three good canvas window shades were purchased, the remaining shades put into condition and minor repairs attended to.

New movable chair-desk units were installed at Alstead Center. The best of the old seats were sent to East Alstead and Mica Mine.

The interior of the Mica Mine school house was redecorated. The woodwork was varnished, the side walls given a coat of buff kalsomine and the ceiling whitened. This room is now much lighter and more cheerful on the dark winter afternoons.

The brick school house in the Rhoades district was shingled as voted at the last March meeting.

It is continually necessary to repair school buildings and to add new equipment in order to give the children the best possible conditions under which to work. Some of the things most needed are: Electric lights in all the schools; a larger wood shed at the Mica Mine school; chemical toilets and jacketed stoves.

### HEALTH

In last year's school report Miss Edith Foss submitted a partial report of her work as school nurse and listed the physical defects found among the children. The last part of the year was given over to obtaining the correction of these defects as far as possible.

Dental clinics were held at or near the different school

houses on May 9, 10, 16, 17, 26, 27 and June 6, 7, 13, and 14. Dr. Irving Crandall and Miss Foss, R. N., were in attendance.

The dental chair was loaned to the district by the state. The clinic rates were as follows: Teeth cleaned \$.50, Extractions \$.50, Fillings \$.50-\$1.00. Novocaine was used when occasion arose. The total bill for this work was \$176 paid by the parents of the children having the work done.

In addition to dental clinics Miss Foss held three tonsil and adenoid clinics, arranged for the fitting of glasses, and consulted with parents in regard to the treatment of other defects.

There is nothing more important to the future of our children than good health.

#### UNION NURSE

This year the four towns of the union have combined to hire a union nurse to be on duty the entire year. Miss Frances Edgett has begun her work in Alstead. I bespeak for her your co-operation.

#### FINANCES

The School Board's budget printed on another page shows increasing costs over the budget submitted last year. These items are as follows: Deficit; caused by school team from south woods, \$500, an increase in number of pupils at East Alstead making a school teacher or school team necessary, \$500, and a decrease in state aid of \$500 making a total deficit of \$1,500.00.

The prospect of 32 high school pupils next year makes an increase of \$1,000.00 for High School tuition seem necessary.

The increase in the number of pupils at East Alstead and the school team to the south woods necessitates an additional \$1,000.00 for transportation. A decrease in state aid of at least \$500 is expected.

#### CHARACTER EDUCATION

One of the most important duties of any teacher and one which should pervade all her work is the building of character. This has in the past been handled rather informally and often neglected.

The State Board of Education has recently recommended for use in the schools an outline for the work in character education and we have during the past year followed this outline in the Alstead schools.

The health and the character of the growing child are very important. I hope there may be conferences between parents and teachers on these two subjects as well as on reading, writing and arithmetic.

Again, may I express my appreciation of the interest the people of Alstead take in their schools and the fine co-operation they have given me during the past year.
