SEAL To the inhabitants of the Town of Gorham, in the County of Coos, in said State, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet in Municipal Hall on Tuesday the tenth day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To elect one selectman for three years, and choose all other necessary town officers for the ensuing year.
2. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for street lights.
3. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to distribute the inventory blanks when taking the inventory.
4. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Public Library.
5. To see what action the town will take in regard to raising and appropriating money for police the ensuing year.
6. To see what action the town will take in regard to raising and appropriating money for the maintenance of a trunk line road.
7. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for highways and bridges.
8. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for permanent streets; namely, Pine Street, Railroad Street, Glen Street, and Madison Avenue.
9. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for permanent roads at the Cascade; namely, River Street and Cascade Hill.
10. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for sidewalks on Church and Promenade Streets; same to be located and expended under the supervision of the selectmen.
11. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for repairs on the Town Building on Androscoggin Street.
12. To see what vote the town will take in regard to raising and appropriating money for band concerts.
13. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appro-

- priate for town charges.
14. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for ornamental street lights.
 15. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for water and sewer maintenance.
 16. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for District Nurse.
 17. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for skating rink.
 18. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Common.
 19. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the retirement of Cascade Water Bonds.
 20. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the retirement of Municipal Bonds.
 21. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for a public dumping ground.
 22. To see what action the town will take in regard to raising and appropriating money for the Grand Army.
 23. To see what action the town will take in regard to raising and appropriating money for the American Legion.
 24. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of \$45,000 by issuing its serial bonds therefor to replace and relay (said work to be done by the Water and Sewer Commission under the supervision of the Selectmen) the present spiral pipe of the water and sewer system, from its present connection with the Perkins Brook intake to its branch to the reservoir, with new twelve-inch cast iron pipe under the provisions of the Municipal Bond Statute, No. 59, of the Public Laws of New Hampshire, and the Town Treasurer, under the direction of the selectmen, be authorized and directed to issue registered or coupon Water and Sewer serial bonds for the aggregate sum of \$45,000 (forty-five thousand dollars), bearing interest at the rate of not exceeding five percent per annum, payable semi-annually, said bonds to be dated May 1st, 1931, and payable serially not exceeding twenty years from date of issue. Said bonds to be signed by a majority of the selectmen, and countersigned by Town Treasurer under seal. The coupons to be attached thereto may bear the facsimile signature of the said Treasurer. That the aforesaid town officers be vested with full authority and power to do any and all things in the name of the Town which may be necessary and proper to accomplish the

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purposes and objects sought under the provisions of any and all votes of the Town under this Article No. 24.

25. To see if the Town will vote to repeal any and all votes heretofore passed by the Town of Gorham respecting Parking upon the streets of Gorham, and to request the Selectmen to repeal all Parking ordinances heretofore passed by them, and to hereafter permit Parking upon any streets within the town limits, where the same do not interfere with or obstruct traffic thereon.

26. To see if the town will vote to rescind the vote taken under Article No. 23 at the town meeting in 1930; namely, "To see if the town will vote to require the proprietors of the Canadian National Railways to lower the highway known as Cross Street where it is crossed by their railroad so that it will be sufficiently below the railroad to safely accommodate travel upon both said highway and said railroad."

27. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,500.00 in conjunction with the State to be used for the purpose of dredging Peabody and Moose Rivers.

28. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$250.00 to be used to provide and prepare a suitable location for an emergency landing field for airplanes.

29. To hear reports of town officers, agents, committees heretofore chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.

30. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

We attach a condensed report of the following recommendations:

The State Highway Department estimates the cost of Trunk Line maintenance \$28,300.00. Of this amount the State will pay one-half. We, therefore, recommend that the town appropriate and raise \$14,150.00 for Trunk Line maintenance.

We recommend the amount of \$5,000.00 be appropriated and raised for town maintenance.

We recommend the amount of \$6,000.00 be appropriated and raised for permanent town roads, to be expended under the supervision of the selectmen.

We recommend the amount of \$8,000.00 be appropriated for permanent roads at Cascade Hill and River Street, this to be expended under the supervision of the selectmen.

We recommend the amount of \$2,000.00 be appropriated and raised for sidewalks beginning at corner of Wilson and Church Streets and extending to the corner of Church and Promenade Streets, and continuing east on Promenade Street, same to be located and expended under the supervision of the selectmen.

We recommend the amount of \$200.00 be appropriated and raised for repairs and painting the Town Building on Androscoggin Street, occupied by the American Legion.

REPORT OF TOWN BUDGET

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We recommend the amount of \$480.00 be appropriated and raised for band concerts.

We recommend the amount of \$8,000.00 be appropriated and raised for town charges.

The matter of ornamental lighting has been brought before the Budget Committee, and we feel this should come before the people at Town Meeting; we suggest that the selectmen include an article covering this in the warrant.

If no new projects appear more than outlined in the following budget which we recommend, our tax rate should be about \$29.00 per \$1,000.00.
