# TOWN WARRANT.

## THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE.

### To the Inhabitants of the Town of Greenfield, qualified to Vote in Town Affairs.

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town House, in said town, on Tuesday the 8th day of March next, at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary town officers for the ensuing year.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year, and make appropriation of the same.
3. To hear the reports of the selectmen, treasurer, road agents, overseer of the poor, school board, library trustees, and auditors, and take any vote relating thereto.
4. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate to repair highways.
5. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for support of public library in addition to what the law requires.
6. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate twenty-five dollars for the Veterans' Association of Greenfield for Memorial Day.
7. To see if the town will authorize the selectmen to hire a sum of money to pay town debts, or take any action relating thereto.
8. To see if the town will vote to allow the Ladies' Circle connected with the Union Congregational Church, to take out the windows in the second story of the Town Hall in the church building and replace them with new memorial windows such as they may select and decide upon, the change and all work incident thereto to be made and done without any expense to the town.
9. To see if the town will vote to lay a pipe from the reservoir near Frances Peavey's barn to a point near the hay scales for a public watering place, or take any action relating thereto.
10. To see if the town will vote to have a map made of the roads in town, or take any action in relation thereto.

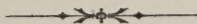

## REPORT OF SCHOOL BOARD.

The School Board respectfully submits the following annual report :

The past year has evidently been much like its predecessors. There has been no marked improvement in the condition of the schools and no deterioration. A town like this, with outlying districts with no facilities for the conveyance of the pupils to a common central school, can hardly hope for the best results. And yet far better results could readily be secured by the co-operation of the parents with the teachers. No matter how well prepared and efficient a teacher may be it is impossible for her to do good work in the conditions which have obtained in our schools. "A fleet is no faster than its slowest vessel," for the simple reason that its vessels must keep together, and in the class in school a half dozen bright and faithful pupils must wait, when prepared to advance, because one of their number has been detained to do chores or to run an errand. These delinquents dishearten the best teacher and retard the progress of the willing and the faithful. Perhaps there is no remedy for the evil for the parents of the delinquent pupils are those who do not read the report of the School Board, and if they did they would soon forget the appeal.



Change of teachers has occurred in each of the schools except the Center Primary. The people are fortunate that the services of Miss Pettee have been so long retained as the teacher of their children. There are other teachers whose term of service has been brief who have done efficient work.

It should be borne in mind that a teacher's value is not to be estimated by reports of some of the pupils, and it is no less true that there may be conditions which render it impossible, in a single term, to test a teacher's efficiency.

All the education which a large majority of our children get is from the schools of this town, and they surely need it all. "I do not see how that study will help a boy get a living" is a remark which has been made by some who mistake the aim of a school and of life. "Man shall not live by bread alone," and that which helps a boy to a better manhood makes life the more worth living.
