

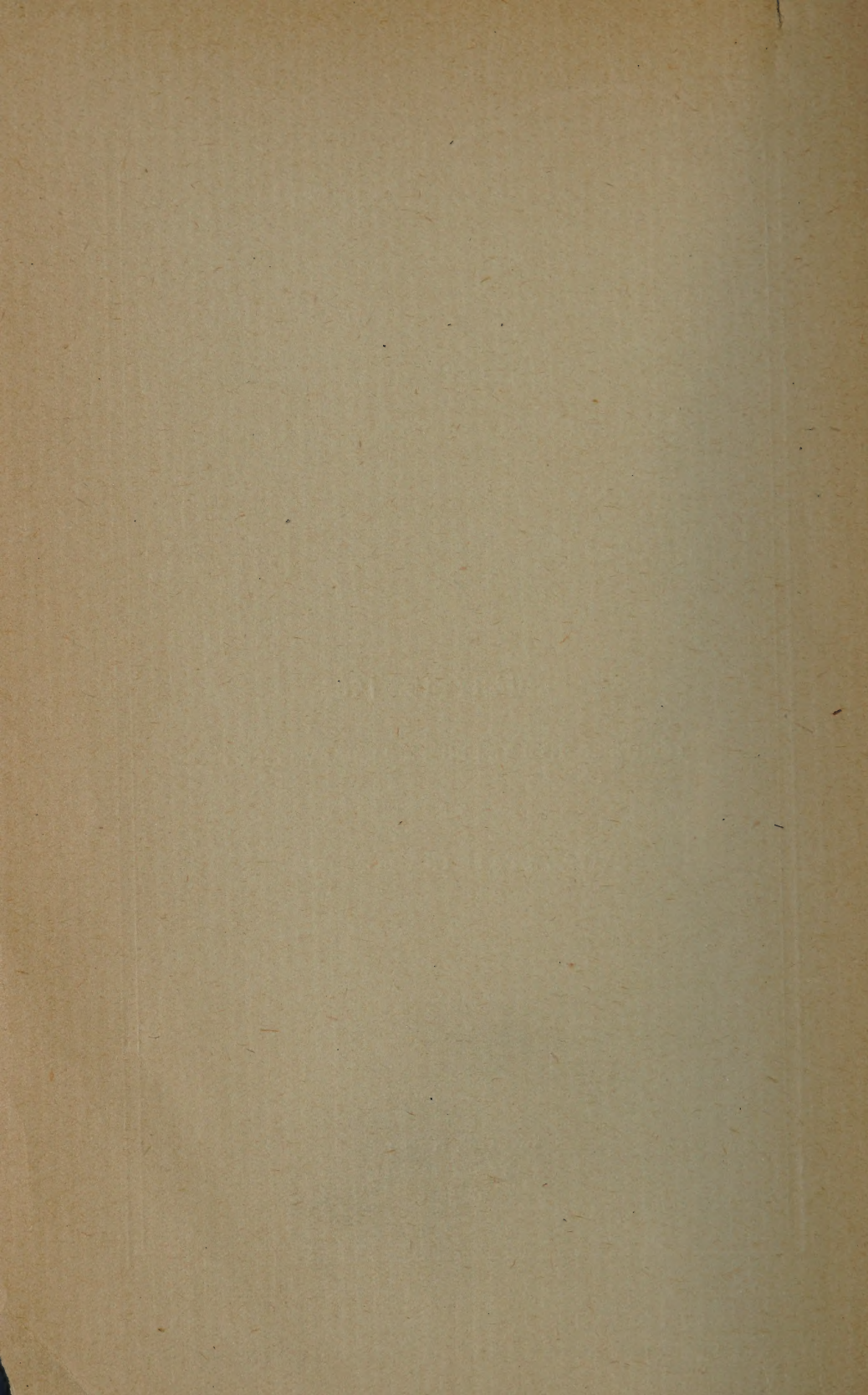

The circulation of the Public and Social Libraries for the year ending February 1, 1905, was 1,484 volumes.
