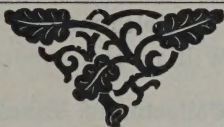

## TOWN WARRANT

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### STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the Town of Seabrook, qualified to vote in town affairs. You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said town, on Tuesday, the eighth day of March next at ten of the clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

Article 1. To elect a Town Clerk, one Selectman for three years, Town Treasurer, Collector of Taxes, three Constables, Highway Agent, three Overseers of the Poor, and all other necessary town officials for the year ensuing.

Article 2. To see what sums of money the town will vote to raise for the expense of the general government, for the protection of persons and property, for health and sanitation, for highways and bridges, for the support of the town's poor and all other necessary expenditures for the year ensuing.

Article 3. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes, and to renew and refund town notes.

Article 4. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of seventy-five dollars, (\$75.00) for the observance of Memorial Day.

Article 5. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of Two Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$250.00) to defray the expenses of collecting garbage from the residents of Seabrook Beach, the same being left in the hands of the Health Officer.

Article 6. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the reconstruction of Black Water River Bridge, in conjunction with aid from the State.

Article 7. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the repair of New Zealand Road the same

beginning at the Lafayette Road and extending to the Kensington town line in conjunction with aid from the State.

Article 8. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of Three Hundred Dollars (\$300.00) the same to be used in making repairs on the old roadway beginning at the West End of River Street and extending towards Merrill's Point.

Article 9. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) for the repairs on Farm Road.

Article 10. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) for repairs on Rock's Road.

Article 11. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) for repairs on Fogg's Corner Road.

Article 12. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of Three Hundred Dollars (\$300.00) for the construction of a sidewalk beginning at the residence of Harvey A. Chase and extending to Eaton's Corner.

Article 13. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of Three Hundred Dollars (\$300.00) for the construction of a cement bridge, the location of the same to be left in the hands of the selectmen.

Article 14. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of Three Hundred Dollars (\$300.00) for the repairs of Pickens Street.

Article 15. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of Thirty Dollars (\$30.00) to be given to the Meeting House Green Memorial Park Association to create a Fund for the upkeep of the Memorial Park.

Article 16. To see if the town will vote to print the town's inventory and to raise money for the same.

Article 17. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the observance of Old Home Day and to appoint committees on same.

Article 18. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the suppression and extermination of the Gypsy and Brown Tail Moths.

Article 19. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of Four Hundred Dollars (\$400.00) for work on the White Pine Blister.

Article 20. To see how the town will dispose of the income of Common Island, Dow and Bell marsh for the year ensuing.

Article 21. To transact all other business that may legally come before said meeting.
