TIGHT RACES IN BOTH NH CONGRESSIONAL DISTRICTS

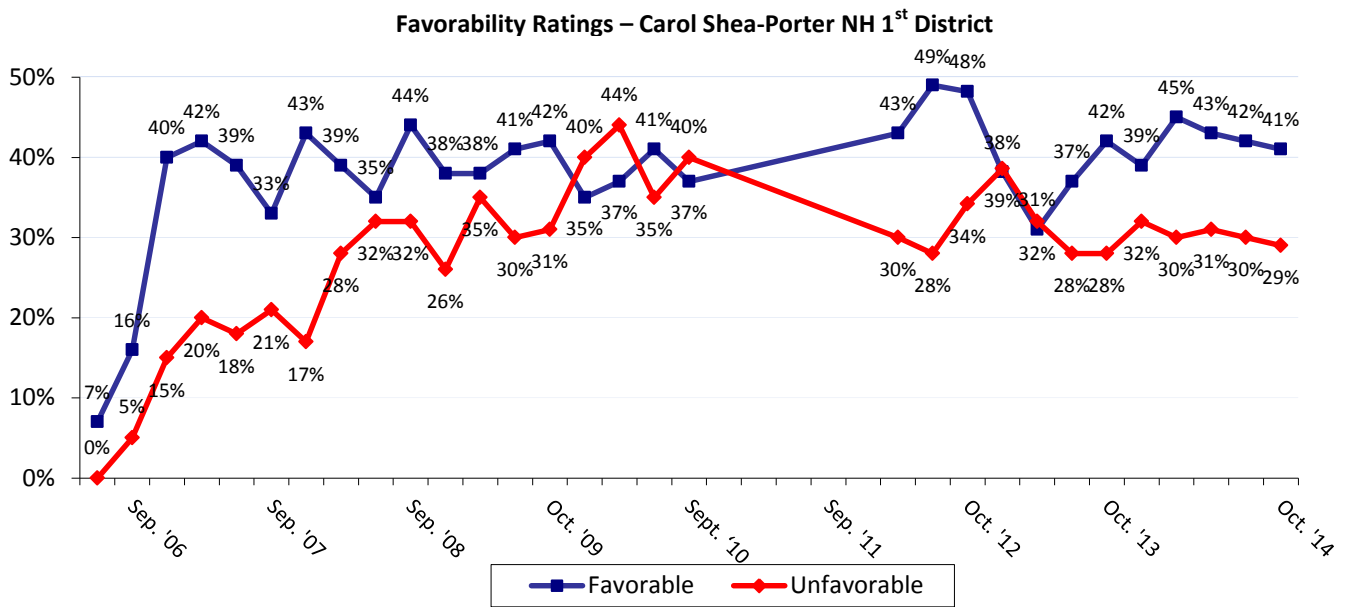
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DURHAM, NH – With less than a month to go until the general election, Congresswoman Carol-Shea Porter and former Congressman Frank Guinta remain statistically tied in New Hampshire’s 1st Congressional District. In District 2, Congresswoman Ann Kuster and State Representative Marilinda Garcia are also in a statistical dead heat.

These findings are based on the latest **WMUR Granite State Poll**,* conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. Six hundred and eighty-one (681) randomly selected New Hampshire adults were interviewed by landline and cellular telephone between September 29 and October 5, 2014. The margin of sampling error for the survey is +/- 3.8 percent. The sample included 532 likely voters (with a +/- 4.2 percent margin of sampling error). Included were 341 residents of New Hampshire’s First Congressional District (MSE = +/- 5.3%) and 340 from the Second District (MSE = +/- 5.3%). Of these residents, 258 in the First District (MSE = +/- 6.1%) and 275 (MSE = +/- 5.9%) in the Second District are 2014 likely voters.

NH First Congressional District

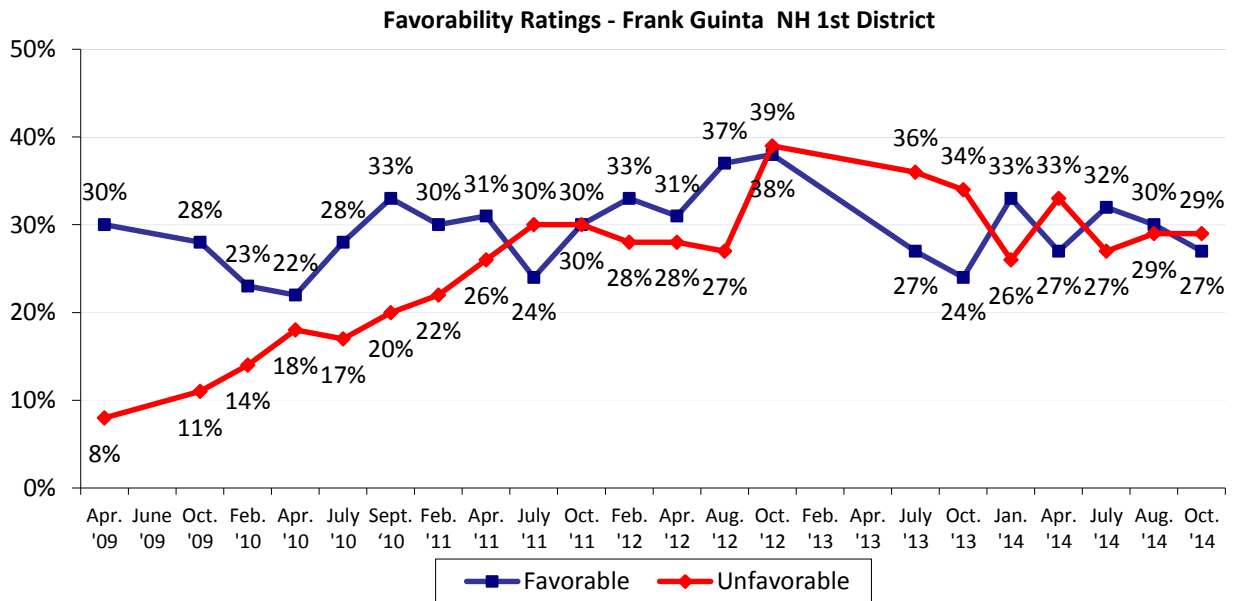
Democrat Congresswoman Carol Shea-Porter was first elected in 2006, lost in 2010, and regained the seat in 2012. She remains modestly popular in the district -- 41% of 1st District adults have a favorable opinion of Shea-Porter, 29% have an unfavorable opinion, 8% are neutral, and 22% don’t know enough about her to say. Her net favorability rating, the percentage who have a favorable opinion of her minus the percentage who have an unfavorable opinion, is +12%. Shea-Porter is very popular among Democrats (net +65%), and very unpopular among Republicans (net -49%), while Independents are divided on her (net +5%). Shea-Porter’s net favorability among likely 2014 voters is +11%.

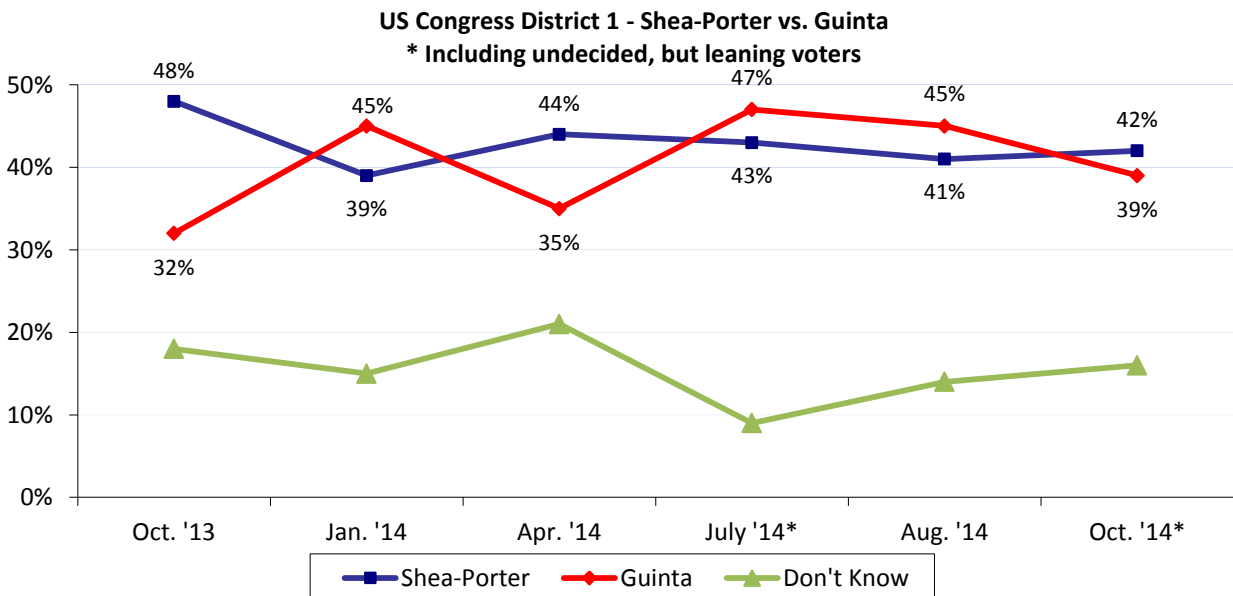
Favorability Ratings – Frank Guinta

Currently 27% of 1st C.D. adults have a favorable opinion of former Congressman Frank Guinta, 29% have an unfavorable opinion of him, 9% are neutral and 35% don't know enough about him to say. His net favorability rating is -2%, down from +1% in August. Guinta is popular among Republicans (net +41%), but less popular than Shea-Porter is among Democrats. Guinta is unpopular among Independents (-9%), and very unpopular among Democrats (-35%). Guinta's net favorability among likely 2014 voters is -3%.



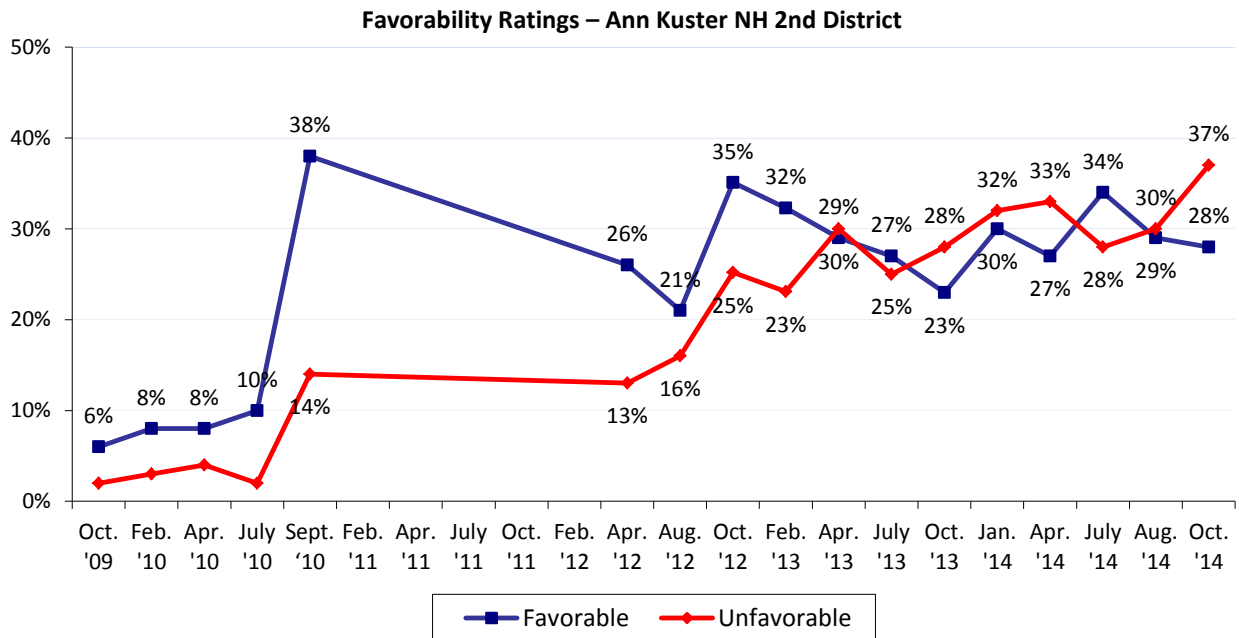
2014 U.S. Congress Election – 1st District

Guinta and Shea-Porter will face each other for the third straight time. Guinta defeated then incumbent Shea-Porter in 2010 while Shea-Porter won the seat back from Guinta in 2012. If the congressional election were held today, 37% of likely 1st District likely voters would vote for Shea-Porter, 32% would vote for Guinta, 3% would vote for someone else and 29% are undecided. When undecided voters are asked which candidate they lean toward supporting, 42% would vote for Shea-Porter, 39% would vote for Guinta, 3% would vote for someone else, and 16% remain undecided.

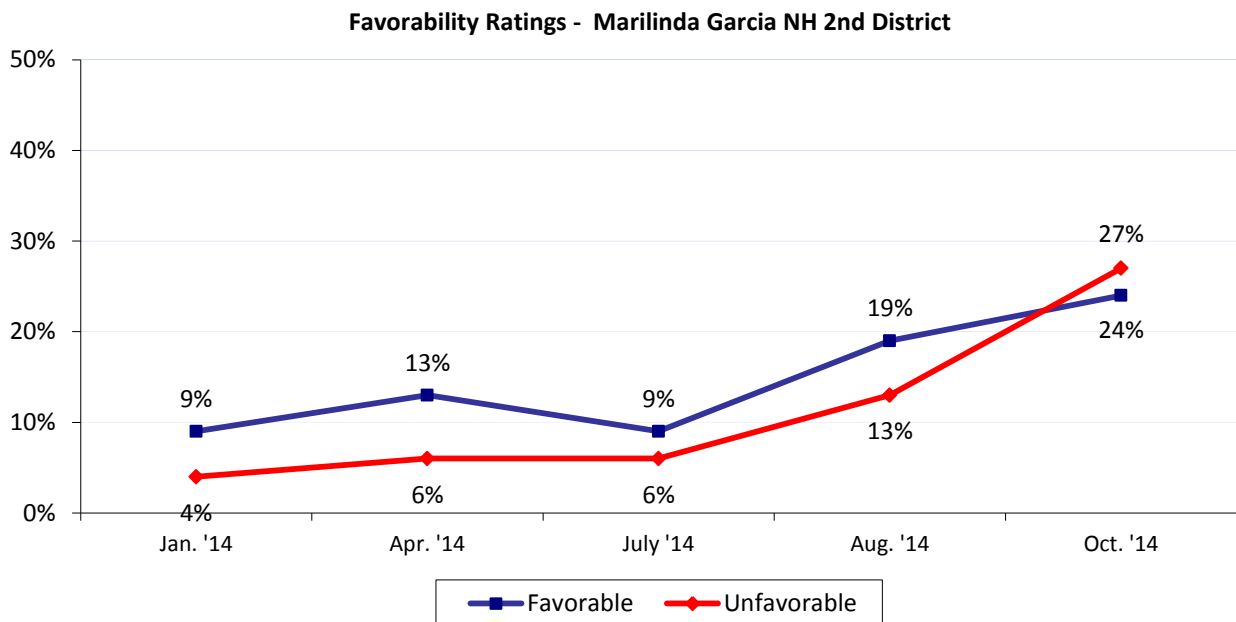


NH Second Congressional District

In New Hampshire's Second Congressional District, first term Congresswoman Ann Kuster's favorability ratings remain low. Currently, only 28% of 2nd District adults have a favorable opinion of Kuster, 37% have an unfavorable opinion of her, 10% are neutral, and 24% don't know enough about her to say. Her net favorability rating is -9%, which is down from -1% in August. She is popular among Democrats (net +58%), unpopular among Independents (net -12%) and very unpopular among Republicans (net -60%). Kuster's net favorability among likely 2014 voters is -10%.

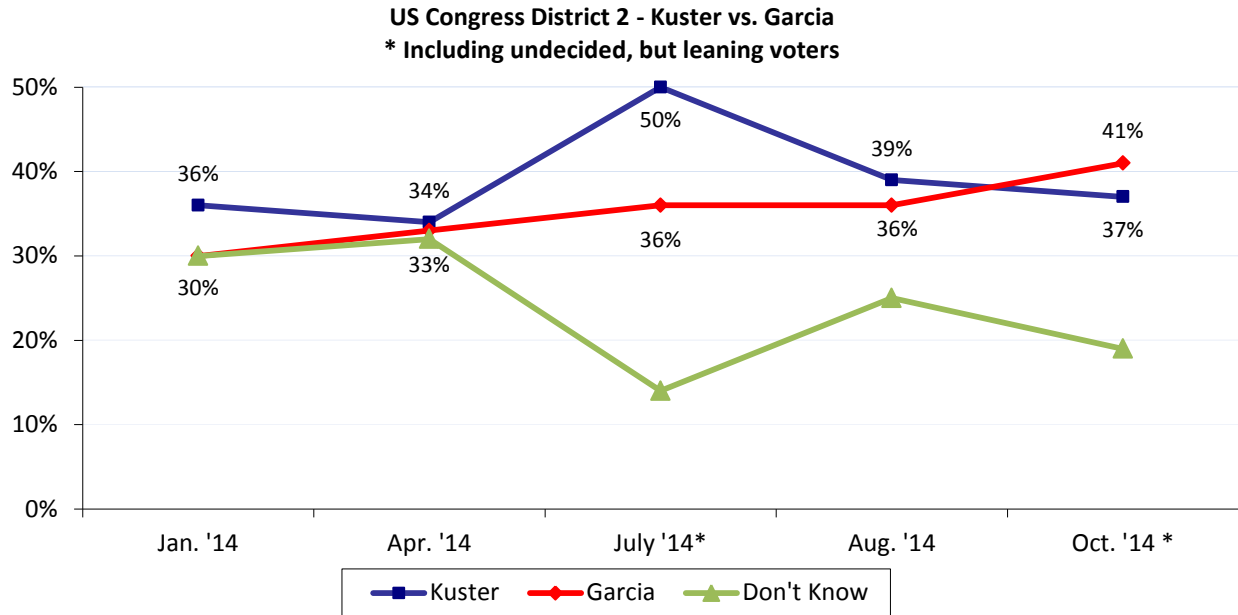


Marlinda Garcia has become considerably better known, but less popular, in recent months. Currently 24% of Second District adults have a favorable opinion of Garcia, 27% have an unfavorable opinion, 7% are neutral, and 43% don't know enough about her to say. Her net favorability rating is -3%, down from +6% in August. Garcia is popular among Republicans (+24%), and very unpopular among Democrats (-42%), while Independents are divided on her (0%). Garcia's net favorability among likely 2014 voters is -2%.



2014 U.S. Congress Election – 2nd District

The unpopularity of both candidates make the race for the 2nd District seat a volatile one. Currently, 36% of likely voters in the 2nd District say they would vote for Kuster if the election were held today, 34% would vote for Garcia, 3% would vote for someone else and 28% are undecided. However, when undecided voters are asked which candidate they lean toward supporting, the race shifts so that 41% of voters say they would vote for Garcia, 37% would vote for Kuster, 3% would vote for someone else, and 19% remain undecided.



Granite State Poll Methodology

These findings are based on the latest WMUR Granite State Poll, conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. Six hundred and eighty-one (681) randomly selected New Hampshire adults were interviewed by landline and cellular telephone between September 29 and October 5, 2014. The margin of sampling error for the survey is +/- 3.8 percent. The sample included 532 likely voters (with a +/- 4.2 percent margin of sampling error). Included were 341 residents of New Hampshire's First Congressional District (MSE = +/- 5.3%) and 340 from the Second District (MSE = +/- 5.3%). Of these residents, 258 in the First District (MSE = +/- 6.1%) and 275 (MSE = +/- 5.9%) in the Second District are 2014 likely voters.

The data have been weighted to adjust for numbers of adults and telephone lines within households, respondent sex, age, and region of the state. In addition to potential sampling error, all surveys have other potential sources of non-sampling error including question order effects, question wording effects, and non-response. Due to rounding, percentages may not sum to 100%. The number of respondents in each demographic below may not equal the number reported in cross-tabulation tables as some respondents choose not to answer some questions.
