# State of New Hampshire

---

To the inhabitants of the Town of Gorham, in the  
SEAL County of Coos, in said State, qualified to vote in Town  
affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet in Municipal Hall on Tuesday, the eighth day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To elect one selectman for three years, and choose all other necessary town officers for the ensuing year.
2. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for street lights.
3. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to distribute the inventory blanks when taking the inventory.
4. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Public Library.
5. To see what action the town will take in regard to raising and appropriating money for police the ensuing year.
6. To see what action the town will take in regard to raising and appropriating money for the maintenance of a trunk line road.
7. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for highways and bridges.
8. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for repairs on the Town Building on Androscoggin Street.
9. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for town charges.
10. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for water and sewer maintenance.
11. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for District Nurse.
12. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for skating rink.
13. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Common.
14. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the retirement of Cascade Water Bonds.
15. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the retirement of Municipal Bonds.
16. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appro-

priate for a public dumping ground.

17. To see what action the town will take in regard to raising and appropriating money for the Grand Army.

18. To see what action the town will take in regard to raising and appropriating money for the American Legion.

19. To see if the town will vote to rescind the vote taken under Article 35 at the March 13, 1923, Town Meeting, which reads that the minimum wage shall be 47c per hour.

Section 2. To see if the town will vote to pay the prevailing wage.

20. To see if the town will vote to allow the selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

21. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,425.00 for the half purchase price of a new gas roller.

22. To see what action the town will take in regard to sidewalks on Union and Cross Streets.

23. To see what action the town will take in regard to the following ordinance:

#### ORDINANCE

##### Town of Gorham

In the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and thirty-two.

#### AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO OBSERVANCE OF THE LORD'S DAY.

Be it ordained by the Selectmen of the Town of Gorham, as follows:

SECTION 1. Amateur Sports. It shall be lawful on the Lord's Day, to engage in play, games, sports, and exhibitions of physical skill, to which no admission is charged, except public dancing, horse racing, prize fighting, wrestling, pool, billiards, and bowling, provided that peace and quiet are not unreasonably disturbed thereby. The Selectmen may regulate the time, manner, and areas of such play, games, and sports, to the end that no unreasonable disturbance of peace and quiet shall be caused thereby.

SECTION 2. Professional Sports. It shall be lawful on the Lord's Day to engage in play, sports and games, involving physical skill, for which no admission is charged, except public dancing, horse racing, prize fighting, wrestling, pool, billiards, and bowling, but not earlier than one o'clock in the afternoon. No such play, game or sport shall be held without a license therefor from the Selectmen.

SECTION 3. Moving Pictures and Theatricals. It shall be lawful on the Lord's Day to conduct motion pictures, lectures,



concerts, theatricals, and vaudeville performances, but not earlier than six o'clock in the afternoon, provided that no unreasonable disturbance of peace and quiet is caused thereby. The Selectmen may make regulations controlling such entertainments as do not now require to be licensed, to the end that no unreasonable disturbance of peace and quiet shall be caused thereby, and nothing in this section shall be construed to permit without license, any such entertainment now requiring license.

SECTION 4. Retail Trade. It shall be lawful on the Lord's Day to sell at retail, newspapers, periodicals, flowers and nursery stock, ice cream, soft drinks, confectionery, fruit, bakery products including pastry, cigars, cigarettes, tobacco, smoking accessories, toilet articles, gasoline, oil, automobile parts and accessories and food for consumption on the premises. Except as provided herein and by Section 5 of Chapter 385 of the Public Laws of New Hampshire, it shall be unlawful to sell or expose for sale any merchandise whatever on the Lord's Day.

SECTION 5. Ordinances Repealed. All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed.

SECTION 6. Takes Effect. This ordinance shall take effect upon its approval by the majority vote of the legal voters present and voting at the next regular town election, provided that any section hereof which is disapproved by such majority vote shall be eliminated from this ordinance and not take effect.

24. To see what action the town will take in regard to the continuation of the Jintown road from Dixon's to Barrett's camp.

25. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$50.00 to be used to provide and prepare a suitable location for an emergency landing field for airplanes.

26. To hear reports of town officers, agents, committees heretofore chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.

27. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

We attach a condensed report of the following recommendations:

The State Highway Department estimates the cost of Trunk Line Maintenance \$8,394.00, of this amount the State will pay one-half.

We therefore, recommend that the town appropriate and raise \$4,197.00 for Trunk Line Maintenance.

We recommend the amount of \$7,000.00 be appropriated and raised for Town Maintenance and that out of this amount the following streets be reshaped and rolled: Promenade Street, Wilson Street, Union Street, and Cross Street.

We recommend the amount of \$200.00 be appropriated and

raised for repairs and painting on the Town Building on Androscoggin Street accepted by the American Legion and that in future the necessary repairs on this building be under the jurisdiction of the selectmen the same as all town property.

We recommend the amount of \$10,000.00 be appropriated and raised for town charges.

We recommend the amount of \$50.00 be appropriated and raised for the airport.

We recommend that an article be placed in the Warrant: To see if the Town will vote to rescind the vote taken under Article 35 at the Town Meeting March 13, 1923, which reads that the minimum wage shall be 47c per hour.

Also that the following article be placed in the Warrant: To see if the Town will vote to pay the prevailing wage.

It was thought advisable by the Budget Committee not to recommend building any permanent roads or sidewalks this year.

If no new projects appear more than outlined in the following Budget which we recommend, out tax rate should be about \$29.00 per \$1,000.00.

The character of the work has changed little during 1931, which completes thirteen years of Public Health Nursing in Gorham. There has, however, been a noticeable increase in the amount of welfare work during the last six months. This is due, needless to say, to the fact that many heads of families are either unemployed or are working only part time. Because of the necessity of assisting these families, the greater part of the time which is not given to nursing is devoted to welfare work.

The work in the schools has been much the same as in the past. Last October, with the assistance of the State Public Welfare, Division of Sight and Hearing, the nurse was able to hold an eye clinic at which fifty school children's eyes were examined, forty-five of whom were fitted to glasses by Dr. R. G. Ingalls of Berlin.

It was discovered that there were several undernourished children in the different grades of the elementary schools. With

the aid of different organizations in town, viz: The Woman's Club, The White Mountain Circle and The Junior League of the Congregational Church and the Good Will Circle of the Universalist Church, two ladies who wish their names withheld, and money which has been given to the nurse to be used for welfare work, we have been able to give each child needing it, a half a pint of milk each day.

People of the town have responded, as usual, most generously to the call for help and those in need have been liberally assisted. In the early fall before the Red Cross Relief room was opened at the Municipal Building, the nurse received very generous donations of shoes and clothing which were in excellent condition. One lady who doesn't want her name mentioned, gave seven pairs of new shoes for children.

We feel especially grateful to the Men's Club of the Congregational Church which donated one hundred and two dollars and ninety-seven cents to be used at the discretion of the nurse for relief of the unemployed.

I wish to thank those who have assisted me in my work by giving me their cooperation and confidence.

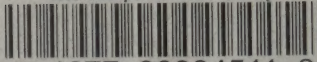
