TOWN WARRANT

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the town of New Durham, in the county of Strafford, in said state, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the town hall in said New Durham on Tuesday, the twelfth day of March next, at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

Article 1 To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year, and make appropriation for the same.

Article 2 To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of the public library, in addition to the amount required by law to be raised.

Article 3 To see if the town will vote to authorize a discount of two per cent on all property taxes paid to the collector on or before July first.

Article 4 To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$754.50 to secure state aid construction, the state to give \$754.00.

Article 5 To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$200.00 to secure state aid maintenance, the state to give \$200.00.

Article 6 To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$1,400.00 to secure state aid for trunk line maintenance, the state to give \$2,800.00.

Article 7. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to hire money on the credit of the town to pay its just debts.

Article 8 To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$200.00 to fight white pine blister rust, the state to give \$50.00.

Article 9 To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$50.00 as a yearly salary for policeman.

Article 10 To see if the town will vote to pay \$3.50 per nine hour day per man for labor on the town highways and \$8.00 per nine hour day for a man and pair of horses.

Article 11 To choose the following town officers for the ensuing year: Town clerk, town treasurer, tax collector, auditor, policeman, janitor of town hall, and to elect the following town officers for the ensuing three years: One selectman, one library trustee, and one trustee of trust funds.

Article 3 To choose a treasurer for the ensuing year.

Article 4 To choose a member of the school board for one year.

Article 5 To choose a member of the school board for the ensuing three years.

Article 6 To see if the district will vote to accept the estimates of the school board for administration items, fixed charges, construction and equipment and all other statutory obligations.

Article 7 To see what sum of money the district will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of elementary schools for the ensuing year, involved in state aid items, instruction, operations and maintenance of plants, auxiliary agencies and activities.

Article 8 To see if the district will vote to raise and appropriate money to defray the deficiency caused by having to run a school at the South schoolhouse.

Article 9 To see if the school district will vote to raise and appropriate money to defray the expense of installing water at the Plains school as soon as the ground opens in the spring. It having been voted to install same at last year's school meeting.

Article 10 To choose agents, auditors, and committees in relation to any subject embraced in this warrant.

Article 11 To act upon any matters that may legally come before said meeting.

REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT

To the School Board and Citizens of New Durham :

My report for this year may be made short. The New Durham schools are doing well. The educational facilities, school buildings, teachers, health activities, supplies, entertainments, and graduations reveals the hearty cooperation of every one concerned with the schools of New Durham.

STATISTICS FOR SCHOOL YEAR 1927-1928

Number of pupils registered, 61; 36 boys and 25 girls. The distribution by grades was as follows: Grade I, 14; Grade II, 7; Grade III, 3; Grade IV, 7; Grade V, 10; Grade VI, 9; Grade VII, 6; Grade VIII, 5. Average attendance was 50; per cent of attendance, 93. Number of visits made by the school board was 6; by the superintendent, 41; by citizens, 24. Regular meetings held by the school board were 7. Seven pupils were neither absent nor tardy during the year. Seventy pupils have registered this year.

Some necessary repairs were made during the summer and more will be necessary the coming year. Facilities for water in the Plains building should be made if possible.

If the district could stand the expense of transportation, it would be worth while to have all of the VII and VIII grade pupils in the grammar room of the Plains school.

More pupils than usual are attending high school so that the cost has increased accordingly. Tuition will be \$700 or more next year as nearly as we can judge at present.

I am expressing for the eleventh time my appreciation of the very fine cooperation of all of the New Durham people in the work of the public schools.
