## TOWN WARRANT

### THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

(L.S.)

To the Inhabitants of the town of Raymond, in the County of Rockingham and said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Odd Fellows Hall in said Raymond on Tuesday, the 10th day of March next, at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
2. To fix compensation for collecting taxes for the year ensuing.
3. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray all town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriation for same.
4. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for town maintenance including snow.
5. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate such amounts for State Highways, as required by the New Hampshire State Highway Department.
6. To see if the town will vote to exempt the Women's Civic Club from taxation for the term of one year.
7. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for memorial day purposes.
8. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate to pay the fire company.

9. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Dudley Tucker Library.

10. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for street lighting.

11. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in the anticipation of taxes.

12. To see if the town will vote to discontinue the Shirking road, so called, by gates or bars.

13. To see if the town will vote to accept River Street, leading from north side of Epping Street to the School yard.

14. To transact such other business as may legally come before said meeting.

## REPORT OF RAYMOND HIGH SCHOOL.

The school year began September 3, 1930 with an enrollment of 55 in the Senior High School, and 34 in the Junior High School. The Senior High School enrollment is at present the same, while the Junior High School enrollment has increased to 44, making a total enrollment of 99, which is considerably more than the attendance last year. While this increase is gratifying, it results in an over crowded condition which in the near future may necessitate some change in the building.

The Debating Team which was started last year, has continued with added interest. We may feel proud that we were one of the two teams to defeat Laconia within the last five years.

The Basketball Teams, in spite of lack of practice, have rapidly developed under the able coaching of Mr. John Whittemore.

Perhaps the greatest single need of the school is an adequate gymnasium. This would not only be a benefit to the teams, but would provide a chance for physical training and corrective drilling for all pupils. The expense for a suitable building would not be heavy, but if the town is not able to meet this expense, a few public spirited citizens would certainly be doing the school and the pupils an important service, if they would provide this building. Much of the work could be done by the Manual Training Department.

We wish to express our appreciation to the Odd Fellows for the use of the hall, which is all that makes possible the support of the Basketball Teams.

We also wish to express our appreciation to the Trustees of the Dudley-Tucker Library, for the Refer-

ence Books which they procured for us last year. This is the first time in our experience when a public appeal brought direct results.

The students and faculty wish to thank the people of Raymond for the support of the Basketball Teams, the Debating Teams, Plays, etc.

During the past school year only about three parents have visited classes in the High School. This certainly does not show the interest that the parents should have in the Schools. It is greatly to be desired that more show their interest by visiting classes.

During the past year the Parent Teachers Association has been formed. It is to be expected that this organization will bring the parents and teachers in closer contact, so that each may aid the other in the solution of their common problems. All the success of a school depends upon the cooperation of the parents, teachers, and students.
