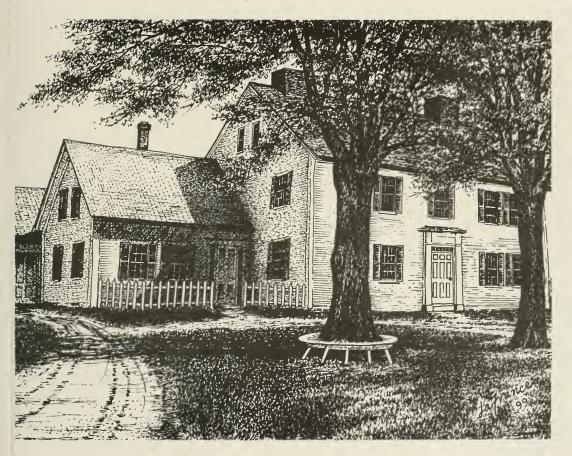

#### **DEDICATION**

#### HAZEL PARSONS

It is with great distinction that this year's Town Report is dedicated to Hazel Parsons. Miss Parsons is a fifth generation member of the family to reside in the Parsons homestead in Lower Gilmanton, which is the oldest house in Gilmanton. Reverend William Parsons built the house in 1763 on land deeded by the King of England. Hazel presently holds the Boston Post Cane. She is the third member of the Parsons family to have this honor.

Miss Parsons was feted at a birthday party honoring her 100th year on November 29, 1998 at the Epsom Manor. There were many family and friends gathered to wish her well and happy returns.

Miss Parsons is the daughter of the late Usher and Addie Hill Parsons. Hazel was the youngest of four children, two sisters Flora and Zella and a brother Albert.

Hazel was an organist at the Lower Gilmanton Church and is the only surviving charter member of the Lower Gilmanton Community Club. She was a very active member of the Club until 1993 when she moved to Epsom Manor, as her health would not allow her to live alone. Prior to that time, Hazel lived in the homestead without electricy or plumbing.

Miss Parsons' independence can best be expressed by relating the story as told by Lois Withington. Lois brought Miss Parsons home from an evening out and left her feeling all was well. The next day Lois found out that upon Miss Parsons entering her home she encountered a burglar. She shook her cane at him and asked him what he was doing in her home and told him to leave. She then went to bed feeling quite content on regaining the privacy of her home. The next day she called the police and informed them of the incident. This certainly is an anecdote of Yankee standards. Miss Parsons lives by her values of independence.

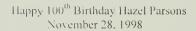

#### MINUTES OF THE TOWN MEETING

#### MARCH 10, 1998

The meeting was called to order by the Moderator at 7:00 A.M. and the warrant was read. It was voted to hold the adjourned meeting of Articles 4 through 25 of the warrant on March 14, 1998 at 10:00 A.M. at The Gilmanton School. Ballots were unsealed by the Deputy Clerk and given to the Ballot Inspectors for counting. The ballot box was shown to the voters present as being empty. It was voted to close the polls at 7:00 P.M. and to open the absentee ballots at that time.

ARTICLE #1: To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing, by ballot. 640 ballots cast. (See Results of Balloting)

ARTICLE #2: Are you in favor of the adoption of Amendment #1, Commercial Boat Storage, as proposed by the Planning Board for the Zoning Ordinance. (The Planning Board <u>DOES</u> support this amendment):

To amend Article XVI, Zoning Regulations, to control the large scale winter storage of boats that is not consistent with the Master Plan. This was suggested by the Selectmen.

ARTICLE #3: Are you in favor of the adoption of Amendment #2, Clarification and Additions to Rules Governing Non-Conforming Uses, Lots and Structures, as proposed by the Planning Board for the Zoning Ordinance. (The Planning Board DOES support this amendment):

To amend Article VII, Zoning Regulations, to clarify from a code enforcement and land owner perspective the conditions which require a Special Exception or Variance; to require that a Special Exception be obtained before a non-conforming lot that meets all the requirements of the ordinance, except for the minimum lot size, be used for building purposes. Further, to require that relief from waterfront setback requirements be obtained in the same manner as relief from other setback requirements. These amendments were suggested by the Zoning Board of Adjustment.

The recessed meeting, determined by vote of March 10, 1998, was called to order at 10:00 A.M. at The Gilmanton School by the Moderator and the results of balloting of March 10, 1998 were read. Frank J. McClary, a Korean War veteran, was selected by the Moderator to lead the body in the salute to the flag. All the elected officers present were sworn in by the Moderator, George B. Roberts, Jr.

Selectman Carolyn Baldwin presented Evelyn O. Forsyth a plaque for her sixteen years of dedicated service to the Town as Town Treasurer. A standing ovation was given to Evelyn for her exemplary service.

ARTICLE #4: A motion by David Russell with a second by Carolyn Baldwin to see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate, for the support of Town Government and for the payment of the statutory obligations of the municipality for the 1998 fiscal year, exclusive of all other warrant articles \$1,577,436.43. (Recommended by Selectmen \$1,601,588.04; Recommended by Budget Committee \$1,577,436.43). To be allocated as follows:

An amendment by Carolyn Baldwin with a second by David Russell to increase this amount by \$9,850.00 to be used as follows: hired employees' wages in the amount of \$5850.00, \$1000.00 to increase the Treasurer's wages and \$3000.00 for repair to a fire engine leaf springs was voted on with the following results:

The vote for \$5850.00 for hired employees' wages lost by a division vote of Yes 67 and No 138. The vote for \$1000.00 for Treasurer's wages passed by a division vote of Yes 169 and No 25. The vote for \$3000.00 for the leaf springs repair for a fire engine passed by a voice vote in the affirmative. A motion by Terry Donovan with a second by Rick Moorehead to reconsider the line item of hired wages in the amount of \$5850.00 lost by a voice vote. Therefore it was determined that this line item could not be brought up for discussion or vote again. An amendment by William Angevine with a second by Betty Smithers, to increase the salary of the bookkeeper of the Trust Funds to \$3500.00 to restore the salary of 1997 was passed by a voice vote in the affirmative. An amendment by Jim Munsey with a second by Mike Teunesson to reduce the amount of this article to \$1,471,517.00 was carried by a division vote of Yes 122 to No 103. A motion by Judy Price with a second by John Whelan to reconsider this vote won by a division vote of Yes 118 to No 98. A motion to table this was moved by Peter Baldwin with a second by Carolyn Baldwin lost by a voice vote in the negative. It was determined after a great deal of discussion to review the budget line by line.

An amendment was offered by Audrey Woodard with a second by Jim Munsey to add the words "by sealed bid or by auction as authorized by the Selectmen". This amendment was adopted by a voice vote in the affirmative. The main article as amended was adopted by a voice vote in the affirmative.

ARTICLE #23: A motion by David Russell with a second by Carolyn Baldwin to see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to convey, by Quitclaim Deed, property currently owned by the Town of Gilmanton known as Map 26, Lot 29-08 on such terms as the Selectmen deem just was amended. An amendment was offered by Audrey Woodard with a second Jim Munsey to add the words "by sealed bid or by auction as authorized by the Selectmen". This amendment was adopted by a voice vote in the affirmative. The main article as amended was adopted by a voice vote in the affirmative.

ARTICLE #24: To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to change the deadline for filing an application for an elderly exemption to August 1, prior to the setting of the tax rate. As the proper hearings were not held for this article and it was not on the ballot, the meeting voted to passover this article.

ARTICLE #25: To hear the reports of any Committees chosen and pass any votes relative thereto. As there were no reports forth-coming nor Committees to be chosen this article was passed over. The meeting was adjourned at 7:10 P.M.

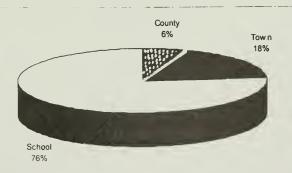

### BOARD OF SELECTMEN

Not unlike years in the past, 1998 produced a myriad of challenges for your Board of Selectmen. Foremost on the list was dealing with the two natural disasters that occurred, involving at least half of the year's meetings.

Personnel turnover also consumed a lot of time and effort, but has produced some excellent results. In June, we lost two of our Solid Waste attendants. Our sincere thanks to Steve McWhinnie for filling in at the site while we interviewed for replacements. We were fortunate to obtain the services of Patrick Vachon as Facility Manager, who comes with years of experience in this field with Browning-Ferris Industries. Jerry Turcotte has been promoted to the year-round position, and we have hired Charlie Twombly for the part time summer position.

The Selectmen's Office was in a similar situation, with Administrative Assistant Kelley Collins leaving us in April for a better paying position. Executive Assistant Pam Barriault filled this position very capably while we went through the process again. In August, Tim Warren joined us as the new Administrative Assistant. Tim has considerable municipal experience from Concord and Meredith, and most recently with Avitar Associates, who provides our assessing software. If you haven't done so, you're welcome to come in and meet Tim and our staff.

Finally, all the engineering and permitting for the replacement of the Stone Road bridge are in place. Construction bids go out in March, with a completion clause before September. The Board has chosen to close the road during this period rather than incur the expense of a temporary bridge.

The landfill is rapidly running out of space, with a complete closure imminent in the year 2000. We therefore ask for your cooperation in having the proper sticker on your vehicle, and reporting any violations you might observe.

We are in our third year of participating in a Hazardous Waste Collection Day, to be held the fourth Saturday in July at the Belmont Elementary School. Bring any household items, such as outdated prescriptions, solvents, paints, batteries, petroleum products, etc. for disposal, free of charge.

As always, the Board is always seeking involvement by the citizens in Town affairs. There are quite often vacancies on our Boards and Commissions and we invite you to visit our public input sessions every Monday at 7:00 p.m. with your comments and concerns.

### GILMANTON FIRE/RESCUE DEPARTMENT

### "YOUR LIFE SAFETY ORGANIZATION"

First, and foremost, I would like to thank the volunteer and call members, their families, and the support from the community to maintain an efficient and effective fire department and ambulance/rescue service. Your life safety organization responded to a total of 362 requests for emergency service in 1998. This figure does not include approximately 150 additional requests for services generated during the "Ice Storm of 1998".

The fire department responded to 176 emergency calls for service. Estimated fire loss was down this year at \$155,000. An area of concern for the next several years will be the threat of forest fires; the damage caused by the ice storm to our forest lands has provided for a greater fire ground load which allows for forest fires to burn quicker and deeper into the duff.

The ambulance service responded to 186 emergency medical requests. The ambulance/rescue truck, (9X1), housed at the Iron Works Station is due to be replaced next year. The body is in pretty good shape but the engine/transmission is beginning to have problems. Options of replacement of the entire unit or remounting the "box" on a new chassis are being investigated. We continue to work closely with our surrounding neighbors to provide the appropriate level of emergency care to meet all patients' needs. We are beginning to investigate options for providing paramedic level care on a regional basis. My goal is to see if we can improve the current level of service and do so in a cost effective manner, while increasing the level of involvement by our volunteer/call members.

The building and code enforcement department has seen increased activity this year. Estimated cost of construction in the community grew to \$3.2 million from \$1.4 million last year. There were 99 building permits issued this year. Of those, 23 new single family dwellings were constructed. There were 402 building inspections performed. There were 96 code violations or hazards identified that needed correction. There were 156 code enforcement inspection/investigations conducted.

This year Deputy Gilmore and FF/EMT Chris Dias became certified as EMT-Intermediates. This allows them to conduct advanced patient assessments, start intravenous fluids, and stabilize patients in a more expeditious manner. Lieutenant EMT-I Jacqueline Gardner was promoted to the position of Captain. She will replace Captain Thomas O'Flaherty who, due to employment reasons, felt he should step down. I take this opportunity to thank Tom, and his family, for the many years of devotion and care that he has given. Tom will be staying on the department as Safety Officer and EMT-I. EMT-I Rhonda Roy was promoted to the rank of Lieutenant. Dana Middleton was promoted to the rank of Lieutenant of Engine Company 3.

Lieutenant Michael Johansson attended the Fire Department Instructor's Conference in Indianapolis. He received valuable instruction for training officers and is working on developing and reorganizing our training program with Captain Lee Gardner. FF/EMT-I Chris Dias spent two weeks with a crew of 20 New Hampshire Forest Firefighters in West Virginia. They worked a 4500 acre forest fire and he gained valuable experience that he hopes he never has to use in Gilmanton.

FF Richie Maltais completed and passed the requirements for Firefighter I. A special thanks to FF Mark Sawyer and his family, as he completed his 31st year as a member of the Fire Department.

The student intern program continues to support the community. Three seniors live-in at the Corners Station. They are all trained Level II Firefighters and EMTs. Two just recently passed the EMT-Intermediate Course. Three freshmen reside at the Iron Works Station. They will complete Level I Firefighter and EMT-Basic this spring.

This year we will be focusing on several areas. Recruitment and retention will be a top priority. Training and educational programs will be centered around "back to basics". Fire and safety education will continue in the Elementary School with the "Firefighter Buddy Program". A commercial inspection and hazard identification program will be instituted. The goal is to inspect all commercial and Town owned buildings at least once annually.

Like many communities, we are faced with an ever increasing challenge to recruit, train, and maintain volunteer/call people firefighter and emergency care providers in our community. A priority in 1999 is to bring our plight to the citizens in the community who may be interested in becoming department members. If you are interested in finding out more about the Fire Department, please call us at 364-2500.

Please take time to check your batteries in your smoke detectors. Let's all hope for a fire safe year.

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### **EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT**

Since its inception in 1993, the local Department of Emergency Management has never had a declared emergency until 1998, when there were two. Before this year, we have been occupied with training, mock disaster drills, Master Plan preparation and preparedness.

Last January, all these efforts paid off as the emergency plan was put into action. For seven days, the Emergency Operations Center (EOC) at the Iron Works Fire Station and emergency shelter at the Gilmanton Elementary School were manned around the clock. All departments worked smoothly together to see that everyone's needs were satisfied. Many thanks to all involved, including those citizens who volunteered for a myriad of different tasks.

The second disaster occurred late in June and early July in the form of excessive rainfall. The damage incurred was different in nature, as it primarily involved the Highway Department's efforts to keep our Town roads open. Twenty-three sites were declared disasters by FEMA officials. The Road Agent and his crew are to be commended for their good work.

Both these disasters, particularly the most recent, were costly events. During 1998, a total of \$301,412.03 was posted to the Emergency Management account. Through the diligent reporting by the Management staff, we were able to recover \$279,791.24 from FEMA, leaving a net cost to the Town of \$21,620.79. There is also \$44,000 due to the Town upon completion of all the work from the State's share (12.5%).

### REPORT OF TOWN FOREST FIRE WARDEN AND STATE FOREST RANGER

To aid your Forest Fire Warden, Fire Department and State Forest Ranger, contact your local Warden or Fire Department to find out if a permit is required before doing ANY outside burning. Violations of RSA 227-L:17, the fire permit law and the other burning laws of the State of New Hampshire are misdemeanors punishable by fines of up to \$2,000 and/or a year in jail. Violators are also liable for all fire suppression costs.

There are ten Forest Rangers who work for the New Hampshire Division of Forests and Lands, Forest Protection Bureau. State Forest Rangers are available to assist communities with forest fire suppression, prevention and training programs as well as the enforcement of forest fire and timber harvest laws. If you have any questions regarding forest fire or timber harvest laws, please call our office at 271-2217.

There are 2400 Forest Fire Wardens and Deputy Forest Fire Wardens throughout the state. Each Town has a Forest Fire Warden and several Deputy Wardens who assist the Forest Rangers with forest fire suppression, prevention, and law enforcement. Early in 1998 we experienced an ice storm, which caused severe damage to forests of New Hampshire. This damage created a greater potential fire hazard as well as safety hazards to many areas of the state. Your local fire warden and Forest Rangers need your assistance in preventing wildfires in these hard hit areas and throughout the State. If you need assistance or information dealing with ice damaged woodlands, please call 1-800-444-8978.

The State of New Hampshire operates 15 fire towers, 2 mobile patrols and 3 contract aircraft patrols. This early detection and reports from citizens aid in the quick response from local fire departments. This is a critical factor in controlling the size of wildland fires and keeping the loss of property and suppression costs as low as possible.

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### GILMANTON POLICE DEPARTMENT

This year the healthy economy has played havoc with police staffing throughout the state. The turn over rate, in the state, has risen to just under ten percent which means the state is turning over better than 200 police officers per year. This translates to many more hirings, increased Police Academies and many police agencies working with limited resources. It is now common to pick up a local newspaper and see that departments are seeking qualified candidates for police positions.

Police Chiefs are combating the exodus by seeking higher salaries so that their agencies may be competitive with private industry. Unfortunately, this creates "Department Jumping" by police officers seeking to make better wages for their families. We were not exempt from these phenomena as we experienced the loss of two police officers to other police agencies for higher salaries and better shift assignments. Officer Loren Ackerman left after five years with the Town of Gilmanton and, I thank him for the positive rapport he established with the youth of our community. Also, Officer Terrence Morgan left us after one year of service to join the Alton Police Department. I wish them both well.

We have hired Officer James Quealy, to fill one vacancy, and he is presently at the New Hampshire Police Academy. You will see him patrolling our town some time in the Spring. We are presently going through the hiring process to fill the other vacancy. Obviously, this leaves just a few of us to work many more hours to pick up the police coverage vacated by these resignations. Our part time staff is pitching in and picking up as many shifts as they can. Our good friends, the Alton Police Department, the Belmont Police Department and the New Hampshire State Police are assisting us until we are back to full staff.

Many of you will remember that in 1997 we acquired a grant to purchase a computer system. We have been working diligently to bring this system on line for 1998. I am happy to report that we have accomplished that and our reporting activities, which are to follow, are but one of its functions. I would like to acknowledge Sgt. Baiocchetti and Robin Bonan for their hard work to bring this to fruition.

At last year's town meeting, the Police Department requested the purchase of a police cruiser to replace a 1994 cruiser, which had about 110,000 miles on it. This request was in keeping with our past practice for the last 15 years and is part of our "Capital Improvement" replacement schedule. This request was voted down with little discussion. Although, many of us drive our personal vehicles more than 110,000 and get many more years of service from them, this correlation does not play out with police cruisers. Generally, at the conclusion of four years of service and over 100,000 miles of use, these cars are tired and are tenuously on the verge of needing serious repairs. As a rule of thumb, the mileage on police cruiser odometers should be doubled for a general determination of its actual use.

About half way through the year the 1994 cruiser needed several thousand dollars in repairs. After exploring various options with the Board of Selectmen, it was decided to lease a 1998 police cruiser. This accomplished several things. First, we would not expend several thousand dollars in repairs and we were able to sell the 1994 cruiser at State Auction for \$3600.00. Also, we did not have to expend any funds for the lease until April 1999, which allows the Town to vote on it at the 1999 Town Meeting. Also, the lease agreement has a non-appropriation clause, which does not bind the Town to the lease if the purchase is not approved at the Town Meeting. Last, this decision saved the Town of Gilmanton several thousand dollars, which is in keeping with our fiscal responsibilities.

In closing I would like to express a collage of happenings this year. We have continued our educational programs for our youth which include; DARE, Bicycle Safety and Halloween Safety. Sgt. Baiocchetti was certified as a Traffic Accident Reconstructionist through the Accreditation Commission of Traffic Accident Reconstruction. This makes him one of 615 in the world accredited through this commission and one of four in the State of New Hampshire. We investigated 400 criminal offenses, made 1048 car stops, answered 1947 calls, issued 226 citations, stepped up our DWI enforcement, and increased our town road patrols. Our plate has been full and will continue to be for some time, but we will endeavor to give you the best service possible.

We are happy to report to all member communities that 1998 marked the ninth complete year of successful operations. Some items which may be of interest follow:

The 1999 budget reflects a reduction in the tipping fee to \$36.50 per ton. This is the fifth consecutive year the Cooperative has been able to either lower or maintain the tipping fee.

The waste delivered to the Wheelabrator facility this year was 128,017 tons. That represents an increase of 8,076 tons over 1997, or an 6.7% increase. The amount of trash delivered continues to rise as predicted.

A total of 64,525 tons of ash were disposed of at the Franklin ash monofill. Things continue to operate well at the ashfill. Phase III Stage II is being filled at this time. The most recent expansion (1996) will provide disposal capacity for the next seven years.

The Cooperative has completed negotiations with Wheelabrator for the emissions retrofit. This retrofit must be completed by January 2001 to meet EPA and DES regulations.

### GILMANTON HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT

The Highway Department was challenged by the big ice storm of January. This natural disaster definitely made its mark in Gilmanton, where many trees were demolished and piled into the roads and streets. This two week storm took a short time to create a lot of work for the Highway Department for many months to come. The biggest challenge was dealing with the broken power lines interwoven with the brush and trees. The advice from the power company was to stay away from the lines since any line could be powered at any time. Many times the lines could become charged by other sources other than the power company. People became very aggravated when they loose power to keep refrigerators and freezers working. Most people have electric operated heat and other necessary electrical equipment. If you were one of the lucky people with a generator, you were able to keep going with the necessities. It is very important to be careful when you hook up a generator to your house that the power doesn't feed back to the power company's lines. This is when it is possible to charge the lines laying on the ground and possibly electrocuting someone. Many people volunteered their services and it was greatly appreciated. Please remember that power lines are never safe to touch at any time. Safety is a big importance in a demanding time such as this was, since everyone was working hard to help out with very little or no sleep. The conditions were hazardous with ice chunks rolling around on the ground under your feet with every step. Trees hanging overhead, waiting for a little more weight to snap off the remainder of the tree. Trees constantly snapping, sounding like a shotgun blast all around you. Many instances we would find ourselves running for cover as a tree would crash toward us. (Hiding under a machine or truck.) Working all night running a chainsaw with a flashlight and truck lights. Cutting trees is very challenging in the daylight, and very dangerous at night. Hopefully, we will never see another ice storm like that one!

This year our summer projects consisted of shimming and sealing the roads. We shimmed and sealed Mountain Road from the intersection of Canney Road, down Mountain Road to the school bus turn around just past Varney Road. Another was White Oak Road from the intersection of Old Stage Road to the town line in Barnstead. The next road was Smith Meetinghouse Road from the intersection of Route 140 to the intersection of Stone Road. The last road was Howard Road where we reclaimed the existing cold mix emulsion, graveled the road and placed new asphalt.

The summer started with a wash thanks to the heavy rainfall in June. Many of the roads in Gilmanton received washouts due to the 100 year rain and in the same week, we had two 50 year rainfalls creating a lot of flooding. The rain took many of our roads into the woods and swamps. Most of the gravel in the heavy wash areas was lost and had to be replaced. Culverts were still filled with gravel and debris from the ice storm. FEMA representatives reviewed the locations and estimated the damage to be over \$250,000. We were able to get most of the areas repaired and ready for winter, but there is still a lot of work to be done. Some of the locations heavily hit were Allens Mill Road, Currier

Hill Road, Meadow Pond Road, Loon Pond Road, Smith Meetinghouse Road, Pancake Hill Road, Upper City Road, Geddes Road, Stone Road, Halls Hill Road, Secord Road, Hidden Valley Road, Durrell Mt. Road, Sargent Road, Leavitt Road, Middle Route, Copp Road, Sawtooth Road and Seibel Road. This year was hit harder than any in the past from natural disasters thanks to the El Nino weather conditions. I think it's time for good weather!

### GILMANTON PLANNING BOARD

The year 1998 was a challenging year for the Planning Board. A total of 21 applications were received, compared to 13 in 1997. There were six subdivision applications, for a total of 16 residential lots and three woodlots. Of these, 13 were approved. Six applications were received for commercial site plans of which two were approved and are under construction or have received occupancy permits; one was subsequently withdrawn, one was denied by the Zoning Board of Adjustment, and two have been carried over to 1999. The Board has spent a substantial amount of time with these site plan applications to insure that the environment, property values and safety are not adversely impacted, while encouraging commercial development whenever and wherever it is consistent with the Gilmanton Master Plan. The remaining applications were for boundary line adjustments, excavation permit amendments and lot mergers.

At the 1998 March Town Meeting, the Board proposed two amendments in order to fine tune the Zoning Ordinance. The Board is grateful for the encouragement of the community in supporting these proposals with your approval expressed in the voting booth.

This year the Board has been very active in reviewing our Regulations and Land Use Ordinances to identify where additional changes are needed to keep pace with technological and economic conditions. The Board is proposing four amendments on the 1999 March town ballot as part of this activity, and requests your continuing support.

After several public hearings, amendments have already been made to the Town Subdivision Regulations to make clear the criteria used by the Board in reviewing applications, as well as in all the Land Use Regulations, to remain current with State Regulations. The Board is continuing to study ways to better protect the Town from excessive growth as the economy of New Hampshire continues to expand. The Board sees this to be a continuing process due to the pace of change in the State.

The Planning Board meets regularly on the second Thursday of each month at the Gilmanton Academy, 7:30 p.m. Check the *Laconia Citizen*, Academy Building, Iron Works Town Hall, or one of the two Post Offices for the agendas.

### GILMANTON HISTORIC DISTRICT COMMISSION

The Gilmanton Historic District Commission is charged with the responsibility of maintaining the architectural integrity of the two Historic Districts which the Town has established - the Gilmanton Corners district and the Smith Meetinghouse District. When any new construction or exterior modifications are proposed for properties within the Districts, property owners are required to make application to the Commission for a Certificate of Approval.

The Commission meets regularly on the first Tuesday of each month at 7:30 p.m. at the Academy to review applications and to transact other business. During 1998, the Commission received six applications and issued Certificates of Approval for the following work:

- 1-98 Landry, Smith Meetinghouse Road Proposed construction of two decks
- 2-98 Dorley/Marcoux, Route 107 Proposed sign
- 3-98 Flack, High Street Proposed stone wall
- 4-98 Powers, Gilmanton Corner Store, Route 107 Proposed window modification and painting of exterior
- 5-98 Stockwell, Smith Meetinghouse Road Proposed deck and front steps
- 6-98 Centre Community Church, Route 107 Proposed handicap access ramp

Also considered was a modification to a previously approved plan (application 8-98 Hottel, Route 107) to change the configuration of new windows. A revised Certificate of Approval was issued.

During the course of the year, the Commission worked with the Building Inspector and Board of Selectmen to correct several violations to the Regulations. The Commission's activities also included forwarding copies of the Regulations to new property owners and sending out reminder letters prior to the start of the construction season.

The Commission also considered and voted 4-1 to go on record as opposing a petitioned article to remove a property from the Smith Meetinghouse Historic District. The petition will be voted upon as a zoning change on the March 1999 Town Meeting ballot. As a property containing one of the seven oldest structures in the Smith Meetinghouse District, the consensus of the Commission was that the removal of the property would be detrimental to the integrity of the District.

### GILMANTON ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT COUNCIL, INC.

The Gilmanton Economic Development Council, Inc. is a volunteer citizen group organized to promote economic development, growth and vitality in the community.

Major emphasis for 1998 was centered on:

- 1. Sharing of ideas for economic development.
- 2. Enlisting outside expertise for assistance in ways the community may proceed with economic development.

Among the business people who participated and shared information were: Peter Casey, Kristic Owens, Joanne Stendor, Larry Frates, Dick Maltais and Nancy Maltais.

The two outside participants who lent assistance to the Council were:

- 1. Lovering Hayward from the New Hampshire Foundation For Sustainable Communities, who shared information about the Soucook River Watershed Reclamation Project. Some of the ways this project has been looking at economic development include: Developing high density areas in or adjacent to already developed areas. Developing greenways for conservation/recreation purposes. Developing industries based on skills within the community.
- 2. Eliza Leadbeater, Executive Director of the Belknap County Economic Development Council enumerated the assistance available from her organization. Ms. Leadbeater also suggested that we take another look at the Community Profile, set a priority and complete one recommendation at a time.

For 1999 the first priority will be to rebuild the Gilmanton Economic Development Council, Inc. and fill all of the Council officer positions. The second priority will be to select a project from the Community Profile and to complete that project.

#### STATE REPRESENTATIVES

1998 was a year of "trying" in the New Hampshire House of Representatives. Prominent concerns were funding for education, electric rate reduction and long term care. Of these three, two remain unresolved. Some progress has been made in reduction of electric rates, but none in education funding. By April 1, 1999 the Legislature is obliged to resolve the funding mechanism for our schools, because the present method of using property taxes has been ruled unconstitutional.

The most major change in elder and chronic care since Medicare in the 1950's was accomplished with the passage of Senate Bill 409. The main thrust is to keep people in their own homes or in Residential Care facilities and out of nursing homes as long as possible. This is an important start in addressing problems engendered by the increasing elderly population.

Overcrowding in the state prison will be relieved by the construction of a large facility in Berlin. The Laconia facility will remain open for the time being.

Over the next several years, sale and use of lead sinkers will be phased out. An education program on the use of alternative sinkers will be ongoing during this phaseout.

An attempt was made to simplify the process of putting in temporary or seasonal docks. If all regulations and requirements were met, it was hoped that a cottage owner could be excused from the permitting process. The bill was killed by the Senate. The problems of beach erosion will be addressed in 1999 and a bill concerning breakwater construction has been filed.

Again, we wish to thank our constituents for the privilege of serving them.

### REPORT OF NEW BEGINNINGS-A WOMEN'S CRISIS CENTER TO THE CITIZENS OF GILMANTON

On behalf of New Beginnings -A Women's Crisis Center, I would like to thank the Town of Gilmanton for its continued support. Your \$525.00 allocation for 1998 assisted us in providing emergency services, advocacy and support to victims of domestic and sexual violence.

Publicity surrounding the issue of domestic and sexual violence and its devastating effects on families and children has resulted in a significant increase in requests for our services. Our records indicate that we had 30 contacts with Gilmanton residents in 1993, 30 contacts in 1994, 40 contacts in 1995, and 24 contacts in 1996. In 1997 we had 92 total contacts with Gilmanton residents of whom, 44 were total client contacts, 35 total support group contacts, 11 total court contacts, and 2 community outreach events. Our advocacy outreach and support represents many service hours. Our agency documented 4,479 requests for service in 1997, 115 contacts of which were unknown residence.

As you know, New Beginnings staffs a 24-hour crisis line solely with volunteers. We operate a full-time shelter for women and children and have safe homes for male victims; provide support and advocacy at courts, hospitals, police stations, and social service agencies. New Beginnings offers peer support groups for victims of domestic violence and sexual assault; assists with needs assessments, case management and housing options; and does community outreach and education programs for youth, teens and adults. All our services are provided free of charge.

We are members of the statewide NH Coalition Against Domestic and Sexual Violence, promoting statewide networking and resource sharing among domestic violence and sexual assault programs. The Coalition is the evaluating body and administrator of state and federal contracts that provide subsidiary funding for member programs and advocates for legislative change that effects victims of domestic and sexual assault.

We greatly appreciate the solid support of the Gilmanton community. We are dedicated to human service, social responsibility and fiscal accountability. New Beginnings represents a very finite portion of the Gilmanton budget but the returns are immeasurable. We welcome your participation in our efforts to insure a world of safety for our children and ourselves. Volunteers are always needed and the opportunity to serve is fulfilling and satisfying

#### **TOWN WARRANT**

#### THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Gilmanton in the County of Belknap in said state, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Gilmanton Academy in said Gilmanton on Tuesday, the Ninth day of March 1999, next at 7:00 of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

ARTICLE # 1: To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

ARTICLE # 2: Are you in favor of the adoption of Amendment #1, Change the Boundary of Smith Meetinghouse Historic District, to the Zoning Ordinance (by petition). (The Planning Board DOES NOT support this amendment):

To change the boundaries of the Smith Meetinghouse Historic District to exclude the Bolton property, Tax Map 50, Lot 80, the only Smith Meetinghouse property on the southeasterly side of Stone Road.

ARTICLE # 3: Are you in favor of the adoption of Amendment #2, Clarification of Front Property Line for the Purpose of Setback Calculation, to the Zoning Ordinance. (The Planning Board <u>DOES</u> support this amendment):

To clarify the definition of "Setback" as it applies to front setbacks. The current setback definition refers to property lines. There has been confusion on the part of some applicants as to whether the front property line is the center line of a Town road or Town right-of-way. This change clarifies that the front property line is defined by the Town right-of-way. It does not change the way that the ordinance is currently being interpreted.

**ARTICLE # 4:** Are you in favor of the adoption of Amendment #3, *Include Fences as an Exception to Structures that may be Placed in the Setback*, to the Zoning Ordinance. (The Planning Board <u>DOES</u> support this amendment):

To explicitly allow fences in the setback area defined in the Zoning Ordinance.

ARTICLE # 5: Are you in favor of the adoption of Amendment #4, Expiration of Variances, to the Zoning Ordinance. (The Planning Board <u>DOES</u> support this amendment):

A Special Exception expires if the use for which it is granted shall cease for more than one year. As currently written, a Variance has no such expiration date, even though it may be potentially less consistent with a neighborhood as that neighborhood evolves. This amendment places the same time constraints on a Variance as on a Special Exception.

The following articles will be acted upon at the Gilmanton School on Saturday, March 13, 1999, at 10:00 a.m.

ARTICLE # 6: To see what sum of money the municipality will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of Town Government and for the payment of the statutory obligations of the municipality for the 1999 fiscal year, exclusive of all other warrant articles.
