To the inhabitants of the Town of Gorham, in the
SEAL County of Coos, in said State, qualified to vote in Town
affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet in Municipal Hall on Tuesday, the thirteenth day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To elect one selectman for three years, and choose all other necessary town officers for the ensuing year.
2. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for highways and bridges.
3. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for water and sewer maintenance.
4. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for street lights.
5. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for police for the ensuing year.
6. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Public Library.
7. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for District Nurse.
8. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Skating Rink.
9. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Common.
10. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the retirement of Cascade Water Bonds.
11. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the retirement of Municipal Bonds.
12. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the retirement of Municipal Water Bonds.
13. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the public dumping ground.
14. To see what action the town will take in regard to raising and appropriating money for the Grand Army.
15. To see what action the town will take in regard to raising and appropriating money for the American Legion.
16. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for cemeteries.

17. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for town charges.

18. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the airport.

19. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to distribute the inventory blanks when taking the inventory.

20. To see if the town will vote to allow the selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

21. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate to purchase circulars advertising the Town of Gorham.

22. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate to build a sidewalk on Washington Street from St. Clair's garage to the easterly boundary of the O'Neil Twitchell property, work to be contracted to a local contractor.

23. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate to make suitable drainage at the home of Levi Paulsen at the Cascade.

24. To see if the town will vote to construct a properly built road on Washington Street from the Glen Road to the Island, so called, and that same be paid for from the Emergency Fund allotted the town by the State.

25. To see if the town will vote to instruct the selectmen to employ sufficient police to protect public and private property from destruction on October 31st.

26. To see what action the town will vote to take on the following subject:

"Your attention is called to the Laws of 1933, Chapter 99, Section 22, which, in part, is as follows:

"22. Local Option. A town at its next regular town meeting, unless a special town meeting called for the purpose is sooner held, shall include in the warrant an article 'To see whether beer or other lawful alcoholic beverages shall be manufactured or sold locally as permitted under this act.'"

27. To see what action the town will take in regard to accepting the lot of land willed to the town by the late Grace A. Peabody, to be used by the town for park purposes, and to be known as "Peabody Park."

28. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate funds for the purchase of a new fire truck, or for the repairing of the present equipment.

29. To see if the town will vote to appropriate money for the purpose of raising the catch basin at the corner of First Avenue and Gordon Street at Cascade.

30. To see if the town will vote to have the Road Agent instructed to purchase a blade to be used on local trucks for the plowing of winter roads, and the same to be paid for from the highway maintenance.

31. To see if the town will vote to construct a suitable road on the street leading from Alpine Street and known as Corbin Avenue, to be built from the Emergency Fund allotted by the State.

32. To hear reports of town officers, agents, committees heretofore chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.

33. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

We recommend that a sidewalk be built on Washington Street from St. Clair's garage to the easterly boundary of the Neil Twitchell property and that the sum of \$1,000 be raised for same. Work to be contracted to a local contractor.

We recommend that Washington Street be properly built from Glen Road to the Island, so called, and that same be paid for from the emergency fund allotted the Town by the State.

We recommend that the street leading off Alpine Street and known as Corbin Avenue be built from the emergency fund allotted by the State.

We recommend the amount of \$100 be appropriated and raised to purchase circulars advertising the Town of Gorham.

We recommend that the amount of \$1,700 be appropriated and raised for Nurse Association, to be used as follows, \$1,200 for the Association and \$500 for new automobile.

It appears there are some repairs that should be made in the Library and we therefore recommend the amount of \$1,550 be appropriated and raised and of this amount \$250 be used for repairs.

We recommend that \$100 be appropriated and raised to make suitable drainage at the home of Levi Paulson at Cascade.

We recommend that the Town vote to have the Road Agent purchase a blade to be used on local trucks for plowing winter roads and same be paid for from Highway Maintenance money.

There has been an application made for the purchase of a new fire truck, or that extensive repairs be made on the present truck. We suggest an article be placed in the Town Warrant to cover this, and that if the voters decide to purchase a new truck, that the amount appropriated should not exceed \$4,000.

We recommend that the catch basin located at the corner of

First Avenue and Gordon Street at Cascade be raised to proper height to insure safe traffic.

We recommend the amount of \$3,000 be appropriated for Municipal Water Bonds, to be taken from funds on hand.

Following is a list of our Budget for the ensuing year and if no new projects appear other than recommended below, our tax rate should be about \$25.50 per \$1,000.

The work in the schools consisted of the usual examinations, the vision test, weighing and measuring, and pediculosis, as well as emergency calls for first aid. Aside from these routine examinations, health talks were given in the elementary grades, the nurse having spent in the schools the time not occupied in nursing and welfare work.

Although we found many children with defective vision, they could not be supplied with glasses for the reason that the parents were financially unable to furnish them and last year the state could not assist in the work as it did the year previous. However, the state is supplying milk for undernourished children whose physical condition has become very much improved, and since January 1st, has been distributing, through the nurse, cod liver oil to malnourished children.

Retardation in school work is, as we all know, caused to a

great extent by physical defects. For this reason, medical inspection is of little value unless corrective treatment follows. If this is not done, the examination amounts to little. The nurse has long hoped that a fund available for this follow-up work might be established in the community.

Many needy families reported their condition to the nurse, who through the Red Cross Distribution Center, the County Welfare, as well as the charity and kindness of several local people, was able to distribute food, clothing and medicine to these people suffering because of unemployment.

The nurse thanks those whose support and good will have encouraged and assisted her in carrying on her work in the community.

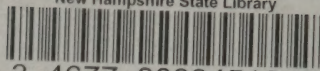
