# Report of Board of Education.

---

As another school year draws to its close, we, the Board of Education, once more make our report of the closing year.

The statistics of the three schools in town will be seen in the following table, so there is no need of our touching upon that branch of the subject in this brief summing up. The length of the school year was one week shorter than last year, made such by the severe winter weather, which necessitated closing the schools. Last fall, certain pupils refused to attend school until compelled to by the truant officer. Of course we cannot too severely censure those pupils for their conduct, nor thank too heartily their parents for co-operating with us throughout the trouble. The usual repairing was made in the school houses; several new seats and desks had to be purchased for the North School room, to accommodate the increase in attendance, and a new stove was installed in the West School, the old one being beyond further use.

At the close of the Spring term, Miss Cora A. Nudd resigned as teacher of the North School, the Board accepting her resignation with much reluctance, for she had given satisfaction to them, as well as to pupils and parents. Miss Eliza N. True, of Salisbury, Mass., a graduate of the Putnam Free School, was engaged for the position thus made vacant. She proved to be a teacher well informed as to her duties, a good disciplinarian, who at all times was faithful to her charge. Miss Elizabeth M. Sawyer, the brilliantly gifted and cultured young lady, of whom this town is proud, once more taught the East school, giving the splendid satisfaction she has always given. The West school was again in charge of Mrs. Georgianna Hodgdon, who, as in the past, was a sort of mother-teacher to her pupils, kind, patient, yet firm, instructing them in a truly excellent manner.

In closing, we will say that we think the schools have made a progress, reasonable and good, and we ask parents and townspeople to be fair in their criticisms, and just in their praise, ever remembering that the teachers, and the Board of Education, by virtue of their offices and knowledge of school affairs, are first deserving of sincere support.
