TOWN WARRANT

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the town of New Durham, in the county of Strafford, in said state, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the town hall in said New Durham on Tuesday, the eleventh day of March next, at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

Article 1. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriation for the same.

Article 2. To choose delegates to the constitutional convention.

Article 3. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of the public library in addition to the amount required by law.

Article 4. To see if the town will vote to authorize a discount of two per cent on all property taxes paid to the collector on or before July 1, 1930.

Article 5. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$400.00 to fight white pine blister rust, the state to give twenty-five per cent.

Article 6. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$759.00 to secure state aid construction, the state to give \$759.00.

Article 7. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$350.00 to secure state aid maintenance, the state to give \$350.00.

Article 8. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to hire money on the credit of the town, to pay its just debts.

Article 9. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$1,200.00 to secure state aid for trunk line maintenance, the state to give \$4,200.00.

Article 10. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to buy new curtains for the town hall and appropriate money for the same.

Article 11. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$600.00 to improve road from Wolfeboro line to Middleton line, the state to give the same.

Article 12. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to buy fire fighting apparatus for the town and appropriate money for the same.

Article 13. To see if the town will vote to install street lights on Main street and Depot street, and appropriate money for the same.

Article 14. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate to build a sidewalk on Main and Depot streets.

Article 15. To see if the town will vote to buy a suitable truck for the public uses of the town, and raise and appropriate money for the same. (By petition).

Article 16. To choose the following town officers for the ensuing year: Town clerk, town treasurer, tax collector, auditors, policeman, janitor of town hall, and to elect the following town officers for the ensuing three years: One selectman, one library trustee, and one trustee of trust funds.

Report of the Superintendent of Schools

To the School Board and Citizens of New Durham:

Following are usual statistics for the school year 1928-1929.

Number of pupils registered, 69; 44 boys, and 25 girls. Grade distribution was: I, 11; II, 10; III, 8; IV, 5; V, 8; VI, 11; VII, 4; VIII, 12. Average attendance was 60; per cent of attendance, 94; number of visits by school board, 3; superintendent, 66; by citizens, 60. Six pupils were neither absent nor tardy. Sixty-six pupils are registered this year.

There are three schools this year and everything is going well in each. New Durham schools match well with other schools in the state. It would be well if more of the parents and citizens would visit the schools and observe the work first hand.

Cost for teachers' salaries this year is less than last and transportation more. Eleven pupils are attending high school, making that cost somewhat more or about \$900. The cost is likely to be at least \$1,000 next year. Nevertheless it is fine to have so many in high school.

The usual repairs were made during the summer and the school buildings are in good condition. Having water in the Plains school building is very convenient and worthwhile.

The cooperation of the New Durham citizens as well as that of all of the school children is appreciated by all of the school officials and teachers.
