# TOWN WARRANT

## State of New Hampshire

To the inhabitants of the Town of Orford, in the County of Grafton, in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Orford, on Tuesday, the 14th day of March next, at ten of the Clock in the forenoon, to Act on the following subjects:

Article 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year; also to choose one Selectman for three years; one Trustee of Trust Funds for three years; one Library Trustee for three years; one Cemetery Commissioner for three years.

Article 2. To hear the budget of the Town and raise and appropriate any money recommended therein or pass any vote relative thereto.

Article 3. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to defray Town Charges for the ensuing year.

Article 4. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for maintenance of Town Highways and Bridges for the ensuing year.

Article 5. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the removal of snow and care of Town Winter Roads for the ensuing year.

Article 6. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for insurance purposes.

Article 7. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the use of electric lights.

Article 8. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Orford Free Library and Orford Social Library.

Article 9. To see if the Town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to hire money in anticipation of Taxes.

Article 10. To see if the Town will vote to dispense with the distribution of Inventory Blanks until the Selectmen appraise the property.

Article 11. To see if the Town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to sell and administer property acquired by Tax Deed.

Article 12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for the use of the Dartmouth-Lake Sunapee Region.

Article 13. To see if the Town will vote to accept the State Aid for the construction of Class V Roads and raise and appropriate the sum of \$615.76 for that purpose.

Article 14. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for care of Common.

Article 15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 to cover the expenses of Memorial Day.

Article 16. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the use of the Fire Department.

Article 17. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Control of Pine Blister Rust and Care of Trees.

Article 18. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to be paid over to the Federal Airport Project.

Article 19. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for increased Police Protection.

Article 20. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate any money to fence West Cemetery.

Article 21. To see what action the Town will take to setting and posting Speed Limits on Town Roads.

Article 22. To see if the Town will vote to use all sums of money derived at any time from the sale of Bi-Centennial Souvenirs and Books for an Orford Improvement Fund, to be administered by the Bi-Centennial Committee.

Article 23. To see what action the Town will take in regard to purchasing a new Loader, and how much money they will vote to raise and appropriate made necessary by this action.

Article 24. To see if the Town will vote to have the Selectmen appoint a Park Commission to set up rules and regulations to Control Upper Baker Pond Beach and Orford Town Dock under R. S. A. 31-47.

Article 25. To hear reports of Agents, Auditors, and Committees heretofore chosen and to pass any vote relating thereto.

Article 26. To Transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

REPORT OF THE  
FOREST FIRE WARDEN AND DISTRICT CHIEF

Fire records are made by people - those who cause fires and those who control them. Your forest fire warden, deputy wardens, fire chief and firemen have, in spite of a prolonged drought, made one of the best fire control records in recent years. Despite a very dry spring, we in New Hampshire working together, have substantially reduced our fire incidence (885 in 1965 to 595 in 1966.)

This enviable record is largely due to two factors:

1. A closely coordinated and integrated state-town organization jointly carrying out programs of forest fire prevention, training and suppression with dedicated personnel.
2. Your appreciation of our forest fire control program and your individual effort in practicing fire prevention.

Statistics show, however, there is room for improvement. Major problems are still with us; (1) the careless disposal of cigarettes; (2) the householder's carelessness in burning rubbish; (3) the failure of woodlot owners and contractors to completely extinguish their brush burning fires; (4) failure to extinguish camp fires; (5) unsupervised children playing with matches.

New Hampshire has 4,339,000 acres of woodland to be protected. In 1966 we experienced 595 forest fires on this area and restricted acreage burned to 395 acres - a fine testimonial to the efficiency and dedication of the men who make up our forest fire control organization.

1. If you must burn you will need a permit. Permits are not issued between 9:00 A.M. and 5:00 P.M. except on rainy days. Permits are not needed when the ground is covered with snow. To minimize risk the best way to dispose of rubbish is at your authorized town or municipal dumping area.
2. Be sure all discarded smoking material is out.
3. Don't leave a live camp or cooking fire.
4. Most important - Instruct your children that matches are not play things.

To the inhabitants of the School District of Orford qualified to vote in District affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Memorial Hall in said District, on Tuesday, March 7, 1967, at 8:00 P.M. to act on the following subjects:

Article 1. To choose a Moderator for the coming year.

Article 2. To choose a Clerk for the ensuing year.

Article 3. To choose two members of the School Board for three years, and to fill any vacancies which may occur on the School Board.

Article 4. To choose a Treasurer for the ensuing year.

Article 5. To determine and appoint the salaries of the Truant Officer, and Treasurer, and fix the compensation of any other officers or agents of the District.

Article 6. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees or Officers chosen, and pass any vote relative thereto.

Article 7. To choose Agents, Auditors, and Committees in relation to any subject embraced in this Warrant.

Article 8. To see if the District will favor the discontinuance of the Orford High School, consisting of Grades 9 through 12, and authorize the School Board, or a majority of the School Board, to join with twenty or more legal voters of the town or district in a petition to the Grafton County Superior Court under the provisions of New Hampshire Revised Statutes Annotated Chapter 194:35 requesting the discontinuance of the Orford High School; or to take any action incidental to or in connection with the foregoing matter.

Article 9. To see if the District will vote to direct the Orford School Board to negotiate contracts for all Orford resident High School pupils to attend high schools in other school districts, effective the 1967-68 school year, under provisions of New Hampshire Revised Statutes Annotated Chapter 194:21-a.

Article 10. To see if the District will vote to raise and appropriate, in addition to the original appropriation for 1966-67, a sum of money in the amount of Fourteen Thousand Dollars (\$14,000.00)

to be made available to the School District prior to July 1, 1967, in order to meet obligations due primarily to unanticipated reductions in the number of tuition students attending the high school.

ANNUAL REPORT OF  
THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the School Board and Citizens of Orford:

I hereby present my annual report for 1966.

STAFFING

Eight new teachers joined the Orford staff this year joining the eight teachers returning from the previous year. We are very pleased to have them with us and hope they enjoy their stay in Orford.

Our new Principal is Mr. Frank Sawyer who received his bachelor's degree from the University of New Hampshire and his master's degree in school administration from Boston University. Mr. Sawyer is a veteran of several years of active service as an officer in the U. S. Army and was a teacher of history in Hillsboro prior to coming to Orford.

CURRICULUM

Elementary. - Our most significant advance in curriculum this year has been the adding of one new teacher for the upper elementary grades. This gives us a teacher for each grade in grades 5-8 and has enabled us to operate a much improved departmentalized program for these grades. This program allows our teachers to specialize somewhat in that their preparation involves responsibility for one major subject area and not for several subjects in the traditional program. It enables the students to have a different teacher for each major course and to change classes during the day.

On the whole, we have been satisfied with the progress made in the upper elementary program and feel that our students now are receiving a much stronger instructional program at that level.

I feel we have made some real progress in the elementary grades with respect to revising and bringing up to date both our reading and mathematics programs. We still have a distance to go in both of these areas and must begin to bring our elementary school social studies and science programs up to date. This will represent a major curriculum overhaul and outlay of funds for material and equipment.

We appreciate the fact that Mr. Edwards has taken a little time out of his schedule to do some work in physical education with the upper elementary students. Mrs. Lawrence has also provided invaluable services, even in a limited way, in music to these students.

Our most serious problem in the elementary school remains the shortage of one teacher at the primary level and the lack of a full-year kindergarten program. We simply cannot group the students properly in reading, the language arts, and mathematics in the primary grades where the spread in achievement and ability is so great. This situation grows more acute each year as difficulty levels of textbooks and other materials increase and as newer and more complicated materials replace the old. Our first step to alleviate the problem is to add another teacher in the primary grades. As soon as it becomes economically feasible and when space becomes available we should start a kindergarten program.

Secondary. - The major obstacle to improving the educational program for the boys and girls of Orford remains the continued existence of the high school. We made a very determined effort to attain a rating as an approved comprehensive high school and failed. We then trimmed our program in an effort to provide just a basic two-track program, one track for college preparatory and one for general students.

Our enrollment is now 77 students in grades 9-12, of which only 45 are Orford resident students.

The crux of the educational problem is that we have put all of our efforts into keeping the high school going but at the expense of the elementary program. We have spent a great deal of money, not only in staffing and equipping the high school but also in keeping the three buildings operating. In addition to the expense involved, everyone's attention has been so directed to the high school that insufficient time has been given to the elementary school. This is unfortunate because it is extremely important that each child receive a good basic foundation in the elementary school. This is not possible when there are not enough staff members, when there is insufficient budgeting allocations to curriculum, and when everyone is overly concerned with the high school program.

Our high school program is a very limited one and simply cannot provide the kinds of educational opportunities our students ought to have. We cannot afford to hire sufficient teachers so that each teacher is teaching a subject which he is prepared to teach. Classes are so small that students often do not receive a proper balance of intellectual competition and differing viewpoints. In general, we do not offer the variety of courses and the appropriate level of difficulty to meet the needs of our students. It is safe to say that in a situation of this nature a few of the better students will succeed without too much difficulty; it is the general students or the student who learns at a slower rate who

usually suffers. With few exceptions our students are simply not prepared well enough to do well in college or in higher paying skilled labor. And this condition will become worse each year as competition becomes greater.

It would appear to make a great deal more sense to develop a plan whereby our high school students could attend high schools in the area which can provide a wider curriculum offering and better educational opportunities. This would enable us to concentrate on doing the best possible job we can with our elementary school and would lessen the tax burden on the community.

#### COOPERATIVE SCHOOL DISTRICT

It was certainly gratifying to witness the large vote by the people of Orford in favor of the Moosilauke School District and most unfortunate that two of the towns involved failed to vote in favor of the cooperative.

I think most of us realize that this is the logical long-range solution to our school problems. I hope that this initial setback will not be too discouraging and that we will all keep our eyes on this goal.

Incidentally, there are no sinister forces at work attempting to "pull a fast one" on the people by forcing them into large and oppressive school districts. Orford school boards have been trying to form cooperative school districts with nearby towns since 1958 and I am sure that these board members realized even then that the cooperative school district was a logical and reasonable way for small towns to get together to provide a sound educational program for their children.

#### BUDGETS AND FINANCES

There are two budgets which will be presented for consideration at the Annual Meeting. One of these budgets has been carefully worked out by Mrs. Gallup, Mrs. Mack and myself. It calls for operating a much improved elementary program and providing for the education of our high school students by tuitioning them to nearby high schools. This budget appears sound and I am sure it is realistic.

The second budget has been revised by other members of the School Board from an earlier budget document I prepared for the Board and which was a conservative budget aimed at keeping costs to a minimum while operating a pared-down program. Further reductions of this budget would be, in my opinion, totally unrealistic and might result in another deficit situation. Realistic budgeting to operate the high school and elementary school another year should be somewhere between \$172,000 and \$175,000.

CONCLUSION

I wish to extend my gratitude to the members of the professional, custodial, clerical, and cooking staffs for their fine work in our schools.

Special thanks should go to the members of the school board, the Orford P. T. A., the Cooperative School District Planning Committee and all others who have assisted the Orford schools during the year.
