WARRANT.

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE.

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Plymouth, in the County of Grafton, in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs.

You are hereby notified to meet at the town hall in said Plymouth on Tuesday, the tenth day of March next, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose a town clerk, three selectmen, a town treasurer, a collector of taxes, an overseer of the poor, a highway agent, and all necessary town officers.
2. To choose one library trustee for the term of three years.
3. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for defraying town charges, and make appropriation of the same.
4. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise or appropriate in addition to that required by law for the support and maintenance of the Free Public Library.
5. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the repair of highways.
6. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise or appropriate, in addition to that required by an act of legislature approved February 24, 1905, to be used for permanent improvement of its main highways, such improvement to be made under the advice of the state engineer.
7. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise or appropriate to pay firemen.

8. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise or appropriate for the decoration of soldiers' graves.

9. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to borrow money to pay the debts of the town and give notes therefor countersigned by the town treasurer.

10. To hear report from present board of selectmen in regard to fire proof vault, and take any action in regard to same.

11. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise or appropriate to pay the Keniston Band for open air concerts during the summer of 1908.

12. To see what action the town will take in regard to building a fence around the cemetery on the Spencer farm and for the perpetual care of said cemetery.

13. To see what action the town will take in regard to renewing the lease of the town hall of the Draper & Maynard Co.

14. To see what action the town will take in regard to re-adjusting the salaries of the various town officials.

15. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise or appropriate for a Fourth of July celebration.

BOARD OF HEALTH REPORT.

So far as we know, no report heretofore has been made by the local Board of Health. It has been deemed wise that a brief report be made this year that the public may be made acquainted with the work done and the results accomplished by this department during the past year.

The duties of the board are many and varied, and in compliance with their duties as outlined by the State Board of Health, the town is necessarily burdened with more or less expense, in performance of the many duties which the local board are compelled to carry out.

The chief duties incumbent on the Board of Health is to look faithfully after the health of the community, and anything that becomes a menace to good health, to see to it, that that menace is eliminated. To this end, the board, several times during the year, have made personal inspection of premises where occasion seemed to require, and at the suggestions of the board, the parties in question have gratefully conformed to the requirements.

As fast as possible property owners are conforming to the law with reference to connecting their premises with sewers provided for the purpose, so that the board is pleased to state that twenty-two residences have connected with the sewer this year, and in the early spring, many more will do likewise.

The town water system has been tested four times during the past year and excellent reports were returned to the board from the state analysis; six tests of well water has been made, with the result that three of the wells have been closed for use and the public water installed.

Four cases of diphtheria, two cases of tuberculosis have been reported this year, and the board has closely safeguarded the public from the spread of these diseases by

prompt quarantine and timely use of disinfectants. Measles were almost epidemic this year, nearly one hundred cases having been reported and in most cases quarantine services have been strict.

As a proper safeguard for the school children, all school houses in the town of Plymouth are properly disinfected during the vacation season, and especial care is given to the privies and out-buildings.

The board is thoroughly equipped with material for the disinfecting of premises when occasion requires, and upon request made to the board, any and all public buildings and private residences can have the benefit of the use of these disinfectants for the asking. It will materially aid the local board of health, if all owners of buildings will inspect their premises in the early spring, and also in the fall, for the possible discovery of health-destroying properties. "An ounce of prevention is better than a pound of cure."
