TOWN WARRANT

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the Town of Seabrook,
qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said town, on Tuesday, the twelfth day of March next at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

Article 1. To elect a town clerk, one selectman for three years, town treasurer, collector of taxes, three constables, highway agent, three overseers of the poor and all other necessary town officials for the year ensuing.

Article 2. To see what sums of money the town will vote to raise for the expense of the general government, for the protection of persons and property, for health and sanitation, for highways and bridges, for the support of the town poor and all other necessary expenditures for the year ensuing.

Article 3. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to borrow money on anticipation of taxes and to renew and refund town notes.

Article 4. To see what action the town will take on the matter of relieving the town debt.

Article 5. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of seventy-five (\$75) dollars for the observance of Memorial Day.

Article 6. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the observance of Old Home Day.

Article 7. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of two hundred fifty (\$250) dollars to defray the expenses of collecting garbage from the

residents of Seabrook Beach, the same being left in the hands of the health officer.

Article 8. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of five hundred (\$500) dollars for the construction of a cement bridge, the location to be left in the hands of the selectmen.

Article 9. To see what action the town will take on the Blackwater River dike matter.

Article 10. To see if the town will vote to buy three dump trucks.

Article 11. To see if the town will vote to pay the drivers of the tractor and trucks not more than fifty cents an hour.

Article 12. To see if the town will vote to pay the road agent a salary and to fix the same to be not more than eight hundred (\$800) dollars a year.

Article 13. To see if the town will vote to make some deal with the town of Salisbury for fire protection, or buy some fire apparatus.

Article 14. To see if the town will vote to have all gravel by the yard and pay for the same.

Article 15. To see if the town will vote to not hire anyone under twenty-one years of age.

Article 16. To see what sum of money the town will raise and appropriate for the repair of that part of the U. S. Mail Route road between the Hampton Falls town line and the Kensington town line.

Article 17. To see if the town will raise and appropriate the sum of five hundred (\$500) dollars for the repair of that part of the U. S. Mail Route road leading from Fogg's corner to New Zealand Hill.

Article 18. To see what action the town will take in regard to oiling the town roads for the ensuing year.

Article 19. To see if the town will elect two road agents.

Article 20. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of one hundred (\$100) dollars to repair the road leading to the residence of Simeon J. Brown, Willie N. Eaton, Fred H. Greenman.

Article 21. To see if the town will appropriate the sum of three hundred (\$300) dollars for the repair of the back road that leads from the Lafayette Road where the old brick school house used to stand, by the Gove and Felch estates.

Article 22. To see what sum of money the town will appropriate for the purchase of the land owned by the heirs of the late David F. Boyd, this land to be purchased to be used as a Recreation Park and for the placing of a tablet as a memorial to the first Governor of New Hampshire born in Seabrook in 1713.

Article 23. To see what action the town will take on disposing of the "Hearse and Hearse House" also the "Old Lockup".

Article 24. To see what action the town will take in trying to purchase from the trustees the property of the Baptist Church for a Town Hall situated in Seabrook which is at the present time, being used now, in part by the voters of said town, and that action be taken at once to appoint three reliable men as a committee to visit the said trustees in regard to the aforesaid article.

Article 25. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of five hundred (\$500) dollars to be expended upon the "Rocks Road" so called.

Article 26. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of one hundred (\$100) dollars for the repair of the "Causeway Bridge" so called.

Article 27. To see how the town will dispose

of the income of Common Island, Dow and Bell Marsh for the year ensuing.

Article 28. To transact all other business that may legally come before said meeting.
