### REMARKS

Although our school attendance this year has been somewhat broken up by contagious diseases, the School Board feels well pleased with the progress made therein. The Superintendent's report demonstrates where Swanzey schools rank in accordance with national standards. Such facts leave no doubt that the extra expense of employing trained teachers, as far as possible, has been well worth while.

There was an unlooked for drain upon the school finances this year—the increased tuition of \$20 per pupil attending high school.

Last year the district voted to install a new heating system at No. 2, in East Swanzey, and raised \$900 for the same.

The School Board, following the suggestions offered at the time, have had a steam heating system put in. The cost of the whole outfit, installed, and the necessary alterations in the basement to make it suitable for good work, amounts to \$1,350. Article 12 is inserted in the warrant to raise the money to finish paying for this valuable improvement.

In closing, the School Board wishes to state that it considers the quarters of the Center Primary School, in the Library building, entirely inadequate, and feels something should be done to remedy the situation. The board realizes its responsibility to provide proper school accommodations, as required by state laws, but it cannot better this condition without sufficient appropriation from the town. We would request that the district consider this matter under Article 14 and vote for such plan as the majority may desire.

## REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

---

To the Board of Education and Citizens:

I hereby submit my third annual report as superintendent of schools.

First, I will present a brief general summary of the educational results achieved as a direct outcome of the plan of organization and supervision inaugurated early in the school year of 1921-22. For two years and a half the school board, teachers, and the majority of citizens have cooperated wholeheartedly with me in my attempt to have all the schools in the town realize their fullest possibilities with the help of standardized mental and achievement tests.

This involved radical changes in organization and methods of teaching, and the expenditure of a considerable sum of money for tests and accessory materials. One of the main features of our present scheme of organization and control is a system of educational accounting, whereby we are enabled to show at any time whether or not our educational plants are running at a profit, and whether or not any individual pupil, class, school, or the system as a whole, is working up to normal capacity.

It now devolves upon me, as superintendent of your most important business enterprise, to submit a sort of balance sheet, so to speak, showing the amount of profit or loss and whether or not the money spent for tests and measurements has resulted in an increase in school efficiency sufficient to justify such expenditure. Also to inform the patrons of our schools how the educational product of our schools compares with that of the schools of other communities.

The following table presents the facts and figures. The figures are percentages. A minus sign means below standard and a plus sign means above standard. For instance, the schools of the district were 28% below national standards in September, 1921. In June, 1923, they were 23.3% above standard; an increase of 51.3% in reading efficiency as a result of two years' intensive drill to improve the reading habits of the pupils. By "standard" we mean the average for the country as a whole. The table is really a comparison, on a percentage basis, of the achievements of your schools with those of the nation as a whole.

The money expended for tests and accessories for the two years is less than 2% of the total amount spent for schools. This means that the efficiency of the schools has been increased nearly 38%, with an added overhead of only 2%. This is the answer to the question "Does it pay?" Most businesses would, I think, consider an increase in production or profit of 38% from an investment of 2%, as a paying proposition.

In nearly every case the Swanzey schools are in good condition from the standpoint of teaching and learning efficiency and are making progress commensurate with the mental capacities of their constituents. The various school plants are in reasonably good physical and sanitary condition, except that the room in the Library building is, of course, entirely unfitted for school use, and the lighting of the rooms at the Cutler and East Swanzey buildings is far from satisfactory. These are conditions that ought to be remedied as soon as the district feels that it is financially able to do so. The dangerous cross lights in the Cutler and East Swanzey buildings, due to windows on three sides of the rooms, is very trying to the eyes and cannot help but lessen the efficiency of the work of both teachers and pupils, not to mention the permanent injury being inflicted on the eyes of the pupils.

In conclusion, I want to make an appeal to the parents for better attendance of their children at school. Of course, children should not be sent to school when they are ill or when they have a long distance to walk and weather conditions are such as to endanger their health. But they should never be kept out of school or permitted to stay out for any other reason. Some parents do not seem to realize the disastrous effect of excessive absence on the success of children in their school work. When a child is absent from school, his classmates are going ahead with the work. If he is absent three or four days a week, they have gone considerably ahead of him and he finds it difficult to overtake them. Furthermore, the teacher with twenty-five or thirty pupils in one or two grades, as well as the teacher with fewer pupils and more grades, has little time or opportunity to help the truants catch up with their classes. Many times the teacher or superintendent is blamed because children are not promoted at the end of the year when the fault lies entirely with the parents because of unnecessary absences on the part of the child. A child who loses as much as two or three weeks out of the school year decidedly weakens his

chances of promotion unless he is unusually bright and industrious.
