



#### TOWN WARRANT

#### (L. S.) THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE.

To the Inhabitants of the town of Grantham in the County of Sullivan in said State, qualified to vote in town affairs.

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Grantham on Tuesday, the eleventh day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

Article 1. To choose by ballot and major vote one town clerk and one town treasurer for the ensuing year, one selectman for the ensuing year to fill vacancy caused by resignation of Roy R. Smith, one selectman for the ensuing two years to fill vacancy caused by resignation of Ralph R. Barton, one selectman for the ensuing three years, one trustee of Public Library for the ensuing year to fill vacancy caused by resignation of Irene Hemphill, one trustee of Public Library for the ensuing three years, and one trustee of trust funds for the ensuing three years.

- Art. 2. To choose one or more highway agents and all other necessary town officers, agents and committees, and pass any vote relating thereto.
- Art. 3. To\_raise and appropriate such sum of money as may be necessary to defray town charges.
- Art. 4. To see if the town will vote to apply for state aid for highways, and raise and appropriate money for same.
- Art. 5. To raise and appropriate such sum of money as may be necessary to repair highways and bridges.

- Art. 6. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance of the Trunk Line highway.
- Art. 7. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for State Aid maintenance.
- Art. 8. To raise and appropriate such sum of money as may be necessary for the support of the Public Library.
- Art. 9. To see what sum of money, if any, the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the purpose of commencing the control of the "White Pine Blister Rust" in this town.
- Art. 10. To see if the town will vote to buy a certain gravel bank of Leon Spooner, and raise and appropriate money for that purpose.
- Art. 11. To see if the town will vote to instruct the selectmen to hire money if necessary.
- Art. 12. To hear the reports of officers, agents and auditors, and pass any vote relating thereto.
- Art. 13. To see if the town will vote to buy a snow scraper, and raise and appropriate money for same.
- Art. 14. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.
