TOWN WARRANT

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

- To the inhabitants of the town of New Durham, in the county of Strafford, in said state, qualified to vote in town affairs:
- You are hereby notified to meet at the town hall in said New Durham on Tuesday, the tenth day of March next, at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:
- Article 1. To choose all necessary town officers for the ensuing year.
- Article 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriation of the the same.
- Article 3. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of the public library in addition to the amount required by law.
- Article 4. To see if the town will vote to authorize a discount of two per cent on all property taxes paid on or before July first, 1931.
- Article 5. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$754.50 to secure state aid construction, the state to give \$1,454.00.
- Article 6. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$550.00 to secure state aid maintenance, the state to give \$550.00.
- Article 7. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$900.00 to secure state aid maintenance for the trunk line, the state to give \$4,500.00.

Article 8. To see if the town will vote to raise and ap-

propriate \$300.00 to fight white pine blister rust, the state to give twenty-five per cent.

Article 9. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to hire money on the credit of the town to pay its just debts.

- Article 10. (By request.) To see if the town will vote to purchase securities for the bonded town officers when the selectmen deem such action advisable.
- Article 11. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to buy fire fighting apparatus for the town and appropriate money for the same.
- Given under our hands and seal, this twenty-first day of February, in the year of our Lord ninteen hundred and thirty-one.

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Report of the Superintendent of Schools

To the School Board and Citizens of New Durham:

School statistics for the school year 1929-1930 follow.

Number of pupils registered, 71; 41 boys, and 30 girls. The number in the several grades was as follows: Grade I, 11; Grade II, 12; Grade III, 12; Grade IV, 7; Grade V, 5; Grade VI, 8; Grade VII, 10; Grade VIII, 6. Average attendance was 55; per cent of attendance, 91; number of visits by school board, 9; by the superintendent, 64; by citizens, 60. The number neither absent nor tardy was 7.

Three schools are maintained this year with the same teachers as last year. All are doing well even though the attendance is low on the part of some pupils. HIGH SCHOOL PUPILS

Sixteen New Durham pupils are attending high school this year. This is five more than we had last year. Only two of these graduate this year and two have moved away. Four or five new ones will enter high school next year. That means that the tuitions of these pupils will amount to about \$1,500 a year unless some of them drop out. At the last annual meeting \$1,000 was appropriated for high school tuitions. That means a deficit for the present year of approximately \$400, and makes it necessary to raise at least \$1,400 for the year 1931-1932.

During the summer some repairs were made on the school buildings. A new wood house was built at the Ridge and attached to the main building to save going outside and have room enough for a year's supply. Some more work needs to be done the coming summer. You will note that the Equalized Valuation in the district of New Durham has fallen about \$20,000.00 for the next two years. That means that the \$5 tax will give the school fund about \$100 less. We expect the loss will be approved for state aid.

The school board, teachers, and superintendent appreciate the kindly cooperation given them by the people of New Durham.
