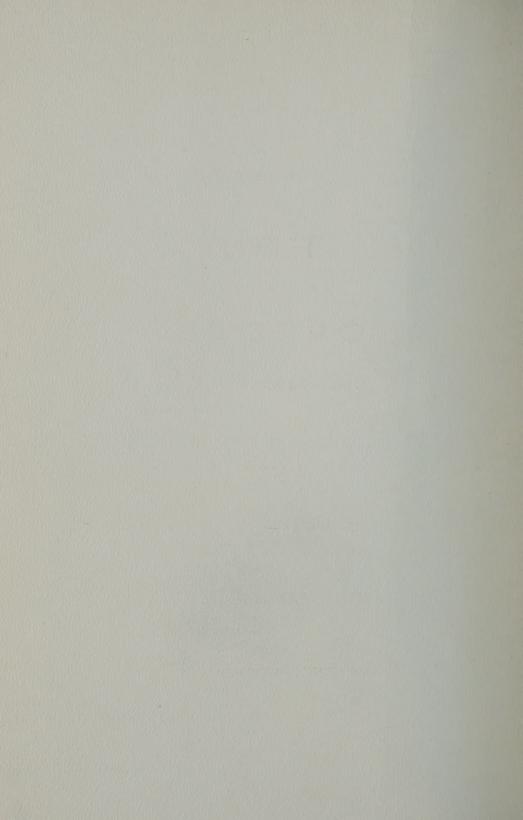

#### TOWN WARRANT

#### State of New Hampshire

To the inhabitants of the Town of Orford, in the County of Grafton, in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Orford, on Tuesday, the 12th day of March next, at ten of the Clock in the forenoon, to Act on the following subjects:

- Article 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year; also to choose one Selectman for three years; one Trustee of Trust Funds for three years; one Library Trustee for three years; one Cemetery Commissioner for three years; and one Park Commissioner for three years.
- Article 2. To hear the budget of the Town and raise and appropriate any money recommended therein or pass any vote relative thereto.
- Article 3. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to defray Town Charges for the ensuing year.
- Article 4. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for maintenance of Town Highways and Bridges for the ensuing year.
- Article 5. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the removal of snow and care of Town winter roads for the ensuing year.
- Article 6. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for insurance purposes.
- Article 7. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the use of electric lights.
- Article 8. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Orford Free Library and Orford Social Library.
- Article 9. To see if the Town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to hire money in anticipation of Taxes.
- Article 10. To see if the Town will vote to dispense with the distribution of Inventory Blanks until the Selectmen appraise the property.

- Article 11. To see if the Town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to sell and administer property acquired by Tax Deed.
- Article 12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for the use of the Dartmouth-Lake Sunapee Region.
- Article 13. To see if the Town will vote to accept State Aid for the Construction of Class V Roads and raise and appropriate the sum of \$685.84 for that purpose.
- Article 14. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Care of Common.
- Article 15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 to cover expenses of Memorial Day.
- Article 16. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the use of the Fire Department.
- Article 17. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Control of Pine Blister Rust and Care of Trees.
- Article 18. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to be paid over to the Federal Airport Project.
- Article 19. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$175.00 to subsidize Ambulance Service for this area.
- Article 20. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise appropriate for increased Police Protection.
- Article 21. To see what action the Town will take in regards to purchasing a new Truck and how much money they will vote to raise and appropriate made necessary by this action.
- Article 22. To see what action the Town will take in regard to building a new bridge in Archertown, and how much money they will vote to raise and appropriate made necessary by this action.
- Article 23. To hear reports of Agents, Auditors, and Committees heretofore chosen and to pass any vote relating thereto.
- Article 24. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

The number of books circulated the past year was 1,247. 18 books were purchased by the Library and 150 books were given to it. Orford Social Library spent \$65.72 for books and the State Library Reference Book Fund spent \$67.97 for books.

- 4. Keep matches away from young children.
- 5. Be sure matches and smoking material are dead out when we discard them.
- 6. Set a good example for others in fire prevention.

You are hereby notified to meet at Memorial Hall in said District, on Tuesday, March 5, 1968, at 8:00 P.M. to act on the following subjects:

- Article 1. To choose a Moderator for the coming year.
- Article 2. To choose a Clerk for the ensuing year.
- Article 3. To see if the District shall have a school board of either three, five, seven, or nine members as required by 1967 Laws, Chapter 343, Section 1, and to determine the number of members to be elected each year until the desired number of members is reached.
- Article 4. To see if the District will vote to have a school board consisting of three members and to reduce the present six member board by decreasing it by one member at the 1969 School District meeting and by two members at the 1970 meeting of said District in accordance with RSA 197:15 and P.L. 1967, Chapter 343:3.
- Article 5. To choose two members of the School Board for three years, and to fill any vacancies which may occur on the School Board.
  - Article 6. To choose a Treasurer for the ensuing year.
- Article 7. To see if the District will vote to instruct the School Board to have all books, accounts and records of the District kept by the School Treasurer instead of in the Superintendent's Office as is now the practice.
- Article 8. To see if the District will vote to instruct the School Board not to pay any money levied against the District as its share in the operating cost of Supervisory Union Number 22 for the school year 1968-69, and to take whatever action may be necessary to effectuate this purpose.
- Article 9. To determine and appoint the salaries of the Truant Officer, and Treasurer, and fix the compensation of any other officers or agents of the District.
- Article 10. To see if the District will vote to discharge the present school planning committee and create a new cooperative school

Article 10. (continued) district planning committee to consist of three qualified voters, pursuant to RSA 195:18.

Article 11. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees or Officers chosen and pass any vote relating thereto.

Article 12. To choose Agents, Auditors, and Committees in relation to any subject embraced in this Warrant.

Article 13. To see if the District will vote to raise and appropriate, in addition to the original appropriation for 1967-68, a sum of money in the amount of Three Thousand Dollars (\$3,000.00) to be made available to the School District prior to July 1, 1968, in order to meet obligations due primarily to unanticipated reductions in receipts.

Article 14. To see what sum of money the District will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the payment of salaries for school district officials and agents and for the payment of the statutory obligations of the District.

### ANNUAL REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the School Board and Citizens of Orford:

I hereby present my annual report for 1967.

### CURRICULUM

High School. - We have added a survey course in social studies to give the college preparatory seniors a brief introduction to such fields of study as political science, economics, sociology, and area studies. We dropped the course in Asia-African History and substituted one in World Geography. For the general students, we added a course in Eusiness Mathematics so that these terminal students now have a two-year sequence in mathematics.

Although our library holdings are not very large in number nor broad in scope, all of our books are now properly catalogued.

We have improved our industrial arts offering by the purchase of some much needed equipment for the shop, including a lathe and a belt and disc sander. The emphasis on agriculture-related areas has been replaced by a limited industrial arts program. This year we were able to strengthen our woodworking program and next year we hope to be able to introduce some mechanical drawing as well as increase our program in metals.

We are still experiencing some difficulty (because of insufficient staff) in ability grouping in the English department where it is necessary to group both the college preparatory and general students in the same class at the ninth-grade level and probably at both the ninth and tenth-grade levels next year.

The students and coaches deserve a strong commendation for their excellent performance, especially in basketball. The basketball team has certainly been a source of great pride to the school and to the community as well. For the first time, we offered girls field hockey and this has provided a grand opportunity for athletic participation for our high school girls.

Elementary School. - We have not made any significant changes in the elementary school program this year. A few minor improvements include offering a little more physical education in the upper elementary grades and we have added substantially to our library books and resources for our elementary students using, for the most part, federal funds available under Title II of the Elementary-Secondary Education Act.

Our two major weaknesses in the elementary school program continue to be the double grade in the primary level at Orfordville and the lack of a Kindergarten program.

In terms of curriculum, we have gained a little ground in the two problem areas of science and social studies in the elementary grades but to do the job right we should have more continuity of staff and substantially increased budgetary allocations.

Resource Teaching Program. - This year, our resource teaching program has reached 35 students in Grades Two through Eight. The basic emphasis on this Title I program (federally aided) has been in the field of remedial reading and is geared to help those pupils who need special assistance. Some very significant gains in reading have been made by the children in this program and it is proving to be a most valuable aid for them and for the school program.

### SOME THOUGHTS FOR THE FUTURE

The major problem which the District is trying to resolve is the formation of a Cooperative School District. The planning Committee deserves a tremendous amount of credit for the work it has been doing during the past three years to bring about the formation of a cooperative in our area. With the passage of enabling legislation in Vermont and New Hampshire allowing the formation of cooperative interstate school districts, another possibility has been opened up. I am convinced that the most pressing needs of the schools will be met upon the formation of a cooperative school district which will provide better educational opportunities for our high school pupils and allow us to concentrate on providing an improved elementary school program for our younger children.

Another probelem which the community will have to face in the foreseeable future is the modernization of the school buildings. Some of our buildings and facilities are obsolete and are not suitable for a modern curriculum program.

The rapidity of change in the school curriculum will continue and this means, simply, that the community will have to provide a higher level of financial support. A key to ongoing curricular development is the quality of the administrative leadership and teaching staff of the school. Careful attention in staffing and staff salaries must be given if we are to assure that our children have an up-to-date program taught by competent professionals.

### SPECIAL REMARKS

We have been most fortunate to have had the services of some very dedicated and fine teachers in our schools over the years. I would like to take this opportunity to pay special tribute to three of them. Mr. Leroy Guptill retired from active teaching in June of 1967 after more than 30 years in the teaching profession, 20 of which were in service to the Orford children. Many of his former students will remember him throughout their lives as a fine teacher, one who really made a difference. For several years, the school has had two outstanding elementary school teachers, Mrs. Hazel Donnelly and Mrs. Dorothy Woodward. In serving as the nucleus of the elementary school teaching staff, they have spearheaded curriculum development in the upper elementary grades, oriented new and young teachers to teaching and to the school, and have given freely of their energy and time to assist our young people in every possible way.

### CONCLUSION

Inasmuch as this is my last annual report to the district, I wish to express my personal gratitude to the community for its support of the schools. I realize that there have been some sharp differences of opinion over the best course of action for our educational program. Some of these problems have not been resolved through no fault of the people of Orford, particularly with respect to the results of the vote on the Cooperative School District which received heavy support in Orford. One side effect of some of the contested issues has been some updating and improvement in the elementary school program, materials, and resources which has resulted in a better program for the pupils - and that is what is important. I am confident that the community will work together and will soon resolve its school problems. I have made some wonderful friends in Orford and I hope these friendships will endure.

In conclusion, I wish to extend my gratitude to all members of the staff for their fine work in our schools. Special thanks should go to the members of the School Board, the Orford P.T.A., the Cooperative School District Planning Committee and all others who have assisted the Orford schools during the year.
