TOWN WARRANT

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Ossipee qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the hall of the Ossipee Group Y. M. C. A. Inc., in said town on the Second Tuesday of March next, at nine fifteen of the clock in the forenoon, to act on the following subjects:

Article 1. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for decorating the graves of soldiers.

Article 2. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Memorial Day observances.

Article 3. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the repair of highways in summer.

Article 4. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for breaking roads in winter.

Article 5. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for defraying town expenses.

Article 6. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of twenty-three hundred and two dollars and fifty cents (\$2,302.50) for State aid Construction in order to receive one thousand seven hundred twenty-six dollars and fifty cents (\$1,726.50) from the state.

Article 7. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Five thousand dollars (\$5,000.00) for State Aid maintenance in order to receive Seven thousand five hundred dollars from the State. (\$7,500.00)

Article 8. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of three thousand dollars (\$3,000.00) for Trunk Line maintenance in order to receive twelve thousand dollars (\$12,000.00) from the State.

Article 9. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to hire money in anticipation of taxes and to allow them to make a discount for early payment of taxes.

Article 10. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the repair and construction of bridges.

Article 11. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the destruction of gipsy moths and White Pine Blister.

Article 12. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of five hundred dollars (\$500.00) to be used on the Roland Park road from Dore's Corner, so called, to Mrs. Ellen Rich's property.

Article 13. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of two hundred dollars (\$200.00) to extend the Huckins road, so called, at Mountainview.

Article 14. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of one hundred dollars (\$100.00) to be used on the road to the Bluffs at Ossipee Lake.

Article 15. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of one hundred dollars (\$100.00) to be used in improving the road to Duncan Lake.

Article 16. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of one hundred dollars (\$100.00) to be used in improving the White Pond road.

Article 17. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of two hundred eighty-six dollars (\$286.00) for the Library appropriation.

Article 18. To see if the town will accept from Dr. Frederick Sanborn two hundred and fifty dollars (\$250.00) with the understanding that the State Aid construction money, together with the above amount, shall be laid out this year on the Water Village road, from the County Farm turn towards the Dr. Sanborn place.

Article 19. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of three hundred dollars (\$300.00) for a new road machine.

Article 20. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of three hundred dollars (\$300.00) to pay for the new truck plough.

Article 21. To see if the town will appoint a committee of three to investigate the merits of a town forest to report at the next town meeting.

Article 22. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) towards the support of a Health Nurse.

Article 23. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate two hundred dollars (\$200.00) to be used on the road and turn near John Hayford's house at West Ossipee and to improve the drainage conditions near the depot square at West Ossipee.

Article 24. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of one hundred fifty dollars (\$150.00) for the maintenance of the Community House.

Article 25. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of two hundred dollars (\$200.00) to finish grading and railing the Minnie White bridge.

Article 26. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to contract with some physician to locate in the Town of Ossipee, New Hampshire, and to see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the same.

Article 27. To choose a Selectman for three years, Town clerk, Treasurer, Highway Agents, Auditors, and all other Officers and Agents for the ensuing year.

Article 28. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

To the Citizens of Ossipee:

You will remember that I said, three years ago, that if I were elected to the office of Selectman of Ossipee that I would endeavor to conduct the affairs of the Town in an honest, business-like way, with two thoughts always in view; Ossipee and the tax payers of Ossipee. With these thoughts before me constantly, I have completed my three year term. During this time we have built two miles of Federal Aid Road, two cement bridges, installed electric lights in the Town Hall, also in the covered bridge at West Ossipee; erected silent policemen on dangerous corners; had warning signals installed at the R. R. crossing at Mountainview; had the Soldiers' Memorial tablet placed in an appropriate location; laid out the Huckins road at

Mountainview, also the road to White Pond; made improvements on the roads leading to Effingham; erected guide boards; bought a new road machine; also a tractor and plough at a cost of \$4900.00; built two or three miles of State Aid road; paid up \$9000 worth of notes on the New High School building; and paid all outstanding notes, so that at the close of the fiscal year, February 1, 1929, we are entirely out of debt with a small balance in the Treasury.

In 1926 we bought a car load of cedar posts for guard rails. These posts were six feet long and none under six inches in diameter. We bought these delivered here for thirty-three cents each, which saved for the town on one car alone more than two hundred dollars. As these have all been used up I would recommend the buying of another car this summer.

You will notice in the warrant that we have a number of articles asking for small appropriations which are intended to show to our appreciative summer visitors that we welcome them to our town and do intend to give them good roads. I believe that we should make similar appropriations every year.

I would like to say in closing that the work which I started over four years ago, which resulted in returning to our town over \$12000 was simply that right might prevail, and that that wrong, which is a detriment to any town might not be allowed to undermine the financial, and governmental affairs of one of the best and one of the most promising towns of the State.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the School Board of Ossipee:

I herewith submit my third annual report as superintendent of schools, it being the tenth in the series of such reports.

Nine schools are open this year. The Brown School was closed for lack of pupils. As a whole the schools are doing well.

During the year ending June 30, 1928 we had an average attendance of 185, an average membership of 199 and a percent of 93. In general attendance has improved but we should do still better. We should not have less than 95%. The rural schools have better attendance than the center schools.

I have been privileged to attend several school-community gatherings during the past year and have been pleased to note the cordial interest of the parents and other citizens. The Christmas program and that presented by the Woman's Club were especially commendable. Those in the smaller schools were well adapted to time and place.

Repairs and Improvements

During the summer vacation chemical toilets were installed at Granite, greatly improving the sanitary condition. New single adjustable seats have been placed at Ossipee Corner and a library table provided. Work on the grounds at Center Ossipee was nearly completed in the fall. Slate blackboard has been placed in the Special Room.

For next year I recommend chemical toilets for Water Village. Ossipee Corner should have the lighting changed to the left of the pupils and the building should be painted. Painting should be done at the Center in the halls and gymnasium. All furniture should be cleaned and varnished.

Grammer School: Ruth Libby, Clyde Bean, Ada Eldridge, Archie Eldridge, Esther Eldridge, Rita Eldridge, Willis Williams, Frances Forbush, Evelyn Wasson.

West Ossipee: Dorothy Browne, William Browne.

The following pupils in the second year of high school were promoted: Lena Arsenault, Mark Winkley, Marion Atherton, Ruth French, Marjorie Sabine, Thelma Williams, Mildred Eldridge.

Medical Inspection

The school health inspection is being conducted by Miss Philomene Barber who succeeds Miss Sibley as Red Cross nurse. After the inspection reports were sent to parents regarding defects found. Cooperation of all the homes would bring about the correction of a much larger number of defects.

A successful dental clinic was held last summer when Miss Barber directed the activities. Dr. Meader of Wolfeboro did the dentistry. This is a fine piece of preventive work. This clinic should be held each year.

Many defects were noted in teeth, vision and malnutrition. These should be corrected.

The children are weighed each month and an effort is made to bring each child up to normal weight.

"A sound mind crowns a sound body."

At the time of the World War, one man in every six examined was found physically unfit. One man in every four drafted was lacking in ability to read and write. After learning this, the nation set out to give each child a schooling that would make him physically fit and qualify him with education for the duties of life. We are still working toward that goal. As a nation we have not fully arrived.

The school aims are seven:

1. Sound Health
2. Worthy Home Membership
3. Mastery of the three R's

4. Good Citizenship
5. Vocational Efficiency
6. Wise Use of Leisure
7. Training in Good Character

The nation spends for schools \$2,255,251,327.

The nation spends for tobacco, soft drinks, ice cream, candy, chewing gum, theatres, movies and similar amusements, jewelry, perfumes and cosmetics, sporting goods, toys, etc., \$6,239,860,000. For these luxuries we pay about three times as much as for schools. Can we afford to pay more for luxuries than for schools?

Money invested in education brings handsome economic returns to states and communities. If the right schooling raises the earning power 10%, then 10% of our total annual income is nine billion dollars—more than three times as much as we pay yearly for public schools and colleges of all types. Herbert Hoover lists education and scientific research as first among the factors which are responsible for the nation's high economic position.

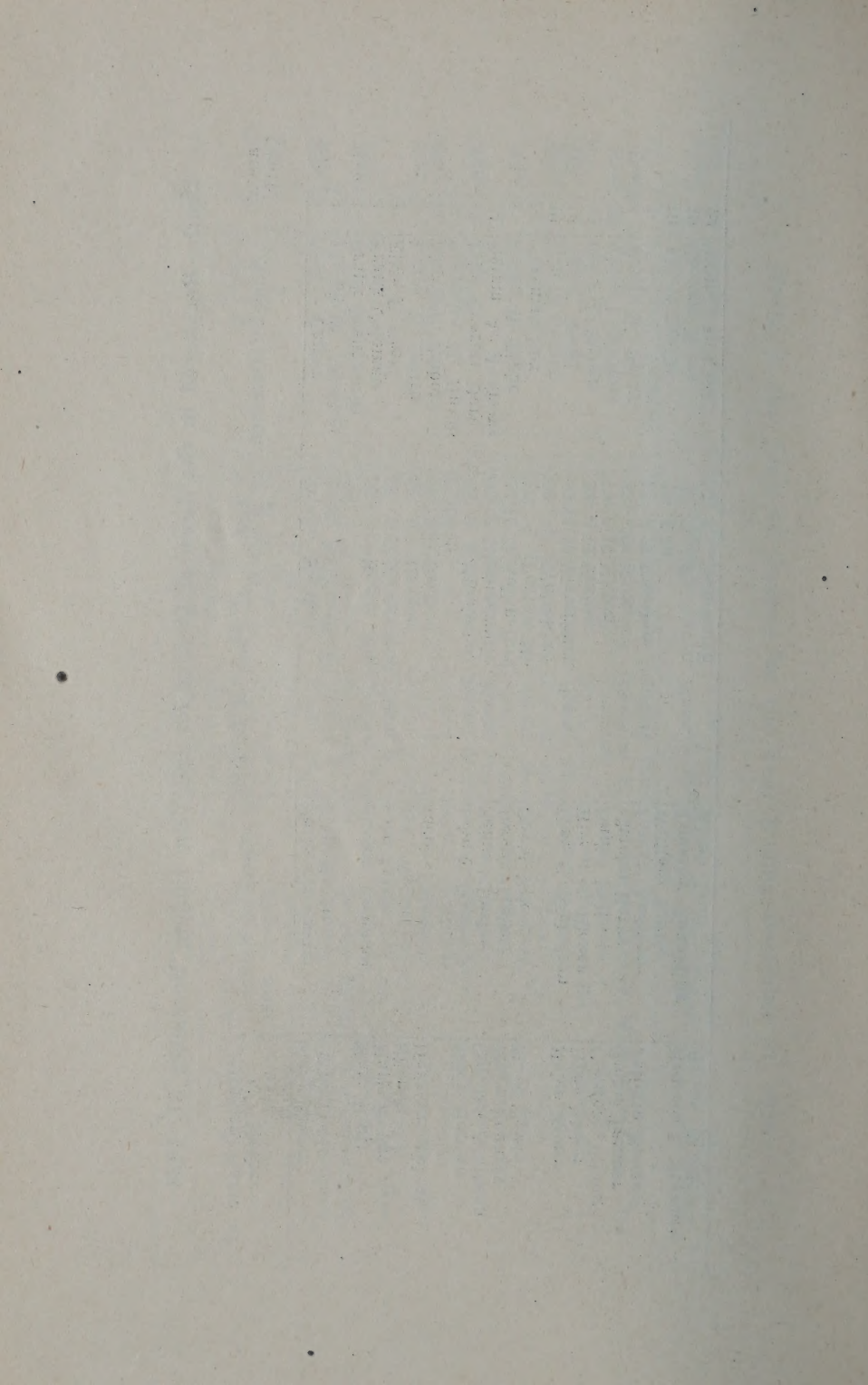
