### State of New Hampshire

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To the inhabitants of the town of Gorham in the County of Coos, in said State, qualified to vote in town affairs:

> You are hereby notified to meet in the Municipal Hall on Tuesday, the tenth day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

ARTICLE 1. To elect one selectman for three years, and choose all other necessary town officers for the ensuing year. (On the ballot.)

ARTICLE 2. To choose Delegates to the Constitutional Convention. (On the ballot.)

ARTICLE 3. To vote on the question "Shall sweepstake tickets be sold in this town?". (On the ballot.)

ARTICLE 4. Shall the provisions of Chapter 287 of the Revised Statutes Annotated relative to playing games of beano be adopted in this town? (On the ballot.)

ARTICLE 5. To see if the town will vote to authorize the collector of taxes to accept payments in prepayment of taxes after April first in sums of not less than ten dollars or in any sum divisible by ten dollars as provided by Chapter 80:52-a of the Revised Statutes Annotated.

ARTICLE 6. To see what sum the town will vote for Town Officers' Salaries.

ARTICLE 7. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for General Government.

ARTICLE 8. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Protection of Persons and Property.

ARTICLE 9. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Health.

ARTICLE 10. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Town Maintenance—Summer Roads.

ARTICLE 11. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Town Maintenance—Winter Roads.

ARTICLE 12. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Street Lighting.

ARTICLE 13. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Town Road Aid.

ARTICLE 14. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Public Library.

ARTICLE 15. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Public Welfare.

ARTICLE 16. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Memorial Day.

ARTICLE 17. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate to celebrate the return of war veterans on the Fourth of July, in conjunction with the American Legion.

ARTICLE 18. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Recreation.

ARTICLE 19. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Parks and Playgrounds, including Band Concerts.

ARTICLE 20. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Water & Sewer Maintenance.

ARTICLE 21. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Cemeteries.

ARTICLE 22. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Skating Rinks.

ARTICLE 23. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Advertising, including maintenance of Information Booth.

ARTICLE 24. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the White Mountains Region Association for the purpose of issuing and distributing printed matter and advertising and otherwise publicizing the advantages of the town in cooperation with the other forty-five towns in the region.

ARTICLE 25. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Unclassified Expenditures, including Auto Permits.

ARTICLE 26. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Interest on temporary loans and short term notes.

ARTICLE 27. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for payments on Short Term Notes.

ARTICLE 28. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for renewal of the Madison Avenue Water Line.

ARTICLE 29. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for replacing the 2-inch water line on Gorham Hill.

ARTICLE 30. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the construction of a new Ticket Booth and Service Building at Libby Memorial Pool.

ARTICLE 31. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Grading in Parking Area at Libby Memorial Pool.

ARTICLE 32. To see what salaries the town will vote to establish for the Justice, the Associate Justice and the Clerk of the Gorham District Court, to become effective July 1, 1964.

ARTICLE 33. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the purchase of a New Garbage Collection & Packer Truck, if the need for one should arise in 1964.

ARTICLE 34. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to distribute the inventory blanks when taking the inventory.

ARTICLE 35 .To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to hire money on temporary notes in anticipation of taxes covering the period from March 10, 1964 to the Annual Meeting of 1965.

ARTICLE 36. To hear reports of town officers, agents, committees heretofore chosen, and to pass any vote relating thereto.

ARTICLE 37. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

The polls shall be open from nine of the clock in the forenoon to six of the clock in the afternoon.

The following request was received from the Selectmen:

The Board of Selectmen requests that the Budget Committee recommend an appropriation of fifteen thousand dollars (\$15,000.00) for the purchase of a new garbage truck, if the need for one should arise during 1964. This money to be borrowed on short term notes and paid back over a period not to exceed three years, said payments to start in 1965.

The Committee recommends that this request be granted.

The Fire Wardens submitted a budget of \$9,000.00 to which the Committee added \$4,000.00 to take care of the signed agreement with the City of Berlin to answer all fire calls from the Berlin line to and including Al's Restaurant on Berlin Road. This agreement is for a term of two and a half years. The above amount is a yearly payment.

We recommend that the following items be taken from Cash on Hand:

### **Report of Municipal Court**

A total of 243 criminal cases were handled by the Municipal Court during 1963. Four cases involving minors and two civil actions relating to landlords and tenants were also disposed of.

Of the criminal cases, two were felonies with the Court's jurisdiction limited to binding the respondents over to the Superior Court for trial. There were 209 violations of motor vehicle laws, 6 involving breach of fish and game laws, and 6 violations of state liquor laws. The other 20 cases were of various types such as breach of peace, resisting arrest and similar offenses.

Although there were 42 fewer cases in 1963 than in 1962, total fines and fees collected were greater, amounting to \$3,463 as contrasted with \$3,403.50 in 1962.

In accordance with the provisions of Chapter 331 of the Laws of 1963, the Gorham Municipal Court will automatically be dissolved as of July 1, 1964 and a new court, the Gorham District Court, will be established in its place. Similar changes will take place in other communities, the objective being to decrease the number of courts at this level, improve administration of justice, and increase the court's jurisdiction in some respects, relating to civil actions.

In accordance with other provisions of the 1963 statute creating the system of District Courts, it becomes necessary for each Court to have not only a Justice, but also an Associate Justice and a Clerk. Some physical changes will also be necessary in the Court Room itself, and these will be accomplished prior to July 1st.

Salary ranges are established for each position set forth above. However the specific salaries, within such ranges, must be voted by the Town. An appropriate article for this purpose has been inserted in the Warrant.

I have recommended to the Selectmen the following amounts for this purpose: For the Justice, \$600 annually, this being the midpoint between the statutory minimum for the Gorham District Court of \$480, and the statutory maximum of \$720. For the Associate Justice, who will only be called upon when the Justice is not able to sit, \$120 annually, this being the midpoint between the statutory minimum (\$60) and the statutory maximum (\$180). For the Clerk who must attend all sessions of Court and handle Court funds and records, the sum of \$270 annually, this being the midpoint between the statutory minimum (\$180) and the statutory maximum (\$360.).

To compensate for increased costs of operating the District Court, the Legislature established a new formula for the division of money collected in fines, giving the Town a greater portion than it has had in the past. This change become effective September 1, 1963 and its effect is already apparent as indicated in this report.

#### LIBBY MEMORIAL SWIMMING POOL

The Libby Memorial Swimming Pool was open for a period of ten weeks and two days from 10:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. daily for general swimming. Swimming lessons were from 9:00 a.m. to 12:00 noon Mon. through Thurs. and from 10:00 a.m. to 12:00 noon Fridays and Saturdays. Five Life Guards and a Maintenance Man were employed. All five of the Life Guards were qualified Red Cross Water Safety Instructors.

Red Cross swimming instructions were offered to the following classes: Beginners, Intermediates, Swimmers, Advanced Swimmers, Junior Life Saving and Senior Life Saving. Tests were also conducted for personnel (Sr. Life Saving) employed in areas other than Libby Memorial Pool. An adult swimming course was also offered on Saturday mornings. At the beginning of the season, 250 persons registered for swimming lessons, but due to vacations and inclement weather, some parents found it necessary to withdraw their children from the program before the final tests were given. Therefore, these children were not recorded as failing the course but as dropping out.

The Swimming Pool was open 72 days, on 32 of which the weather was inclement or cold. This is the reason that many children did not continue on with their lessons and were not tested at the end of the season. On Wednesday, June 26, a record 1,987 persons used the Pool facilities.

Cascade children were transported to the swimming pool Tues. and Thurs. mornings for swimming lessons and afternoons Mon. through Friday for general swimming. During inclement weather the children were not transported. The seventh annual Swim Meet was held Aug. 19th and an informal meet with Bristol, N.H. (Rec. Dept.) was held Aug. 22—won by Gorham.

Participation in the State Recreational Swim Meet held at Lebanon, N.H., was cancelled due to illness.
