TOWN WARRANT

State of New Hampshire

To the inhabitants of the Town of Orford, in the County of Grafton, in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Orford, on Tuesday, the 11th day of March next, at ten of the Clock in the forenoon, to Act on the following subjects:

Article 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year; also to choose one Selectman for three years; one Trustee of Trust Funds for three years; one Library Trustee for three years; one Cemetery Commissioner for three years; and two Park Commissioners for three years.

Article 2. To hear the budget of the Town and raise and appropriate any money recommended therein or pass any vote relative thereto.

Article 3. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to defray Town Charges for the ensuing year.

Article 4. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for maintenance of Town Highways and Bridges for the ensuing year.

Article 5. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the removal of snow and care of Town winter roads for the ensuing year.

Article 6. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for insurance purposes.

Article 7. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the use of electric lights.

Article 8. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Orford Free Library and Orford Social Library.

Article 9. To see if the Town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to hire money in anticipation of Taxes.

Article 10. To see if the Town will vote to dispense with the distribution of Inventory Blanks until the Selectmen appraise the property.

Article 11. To see if the Town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to sell and administer property acquired by Tax Deed.

TOWN WARRANT - Continued

Article 12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for the use of the Dartmouth-Lake Sunapee Region.

Article 13. To see if the Town will vote to accept State Aid for the Construction of Class V Roads and raise and appropriate \$681.69 for that purpose.

Article 14. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Care of Common and for Park Commission.

Article 15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 to cover expenses of Memorial Day.

Article 16. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 to be used to put in dry hydrants.

Article 17. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the use of the Fire Department.

Article 18. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Control of Pine Blister Rust and Care of Trees.

Article 19. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Lebanon Airport.

Article 20. To see what action the Town will take in regard to Ambulance Service for this area, and how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate made necessary by this action.

Article 21. To see if the Town will vote to do anything about a Loader, and how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate made necessary by this action.

Article 22. To see what action the Town will take to instruct the Selectmen to open and maintain approximately 300 feet of the Old County Road from Route 25-A at corner where Gerald Pease's and Kenneth Nutter's homes are located to the property owned and now occupied by John Nutter. (By petition)

Article 23. To see if the Town will vote to allow the selectmen to appoint all Police Officers including the Chief of Police, pursuant to the provisions of R.S.A. 105:1.

Article 24. To see what action the Town will take to provide for the election of Town Officers by the Australian Ballot system, as provided by R.S.A. 59:72. (By petition)

TOWN WARRANT - Continued

Article 25. To see what action the Town will take in regard to Planning and Zoning in Orford, and raise and appropriate any money made necessary by this action or appoint any Committee.

Article 26. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for increased Police Protection.

Article 27. To hear reports of Agents, Auditors, and Committees heretofore chosen and pass any vote relating thereto.

Article 28. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

REPORT OF
FOREST FIRE WARDEN AND DISTRICT CHIEF

New Hampshire is the fastest growing state in the northeast in terms of population increase. It is also an industrialized state and this growth is likely to continue, all of which means more families and homes. Our growing summer population is scattered throughout the state with a phenomenal increase in vacation homes.

Many new homes and practically all cottages are being located in woodlands and abandoned fields and forests crowd into the back yards of our village streets. In a state where the forests cover 86% of the land surface, it is necessary that everyone be aware all through the season, which comes with the disappearance of the snow until the snow comes again, of the need to be careful with outdoor fires and fire sources.

The following action will help:

1. To teach our children the danger of lighted matches.
2. To never discard lighted smoking material from a car or while walking through fields or woods.
3. To safely dispose of rubbish preferably at the town dump. If you must burn -
 - a. You need a written permit from the town fire warden for all debris burning except when the ground is covered with snow. Cooking fires in outdoor fire-places or in charcoal brasiers in your own back yard is permitted on notification of the warden.
 - b. The warden is forbidden by regulation to allow burning of household rubbish on grass by householders between 9:00 A.M. and 5:00 P.M.
 - c. Have equipment on hand to control the fire before you light the match.
4. Promptly report any fire out of control to your fire warden or fire department.

Help to keep our town out of the fire occurrence column and save our tax dollars for useful purposes.

ANNUAL REPORT OF THE ORFORD SCHOOL BOARD

To the Citizens of Orford:

We hereby submit our report for the year 1968.

CURRICULUM High School

Although we have not dropped or added any course offerings for the first time in several years, the present curriculum has been upgraded in many significant ways. As we have endeavored to meet the individual needs of each student, a more flexible program is being offered by encouragement of independent study, discontinuance of mandatory study halls, division of classes by homogeneous grouping, revitalizing the schedule by more frequent field trips, released time for students, and the opportunity for pursuit of individual interests.

Audio-visual aids add impetus to the French program while the English Department is being reorganized to incorporate a continuity of study.

Extracurricular activities have given the students additional challenges and responsibilities. During their released time they have formed an Art Club, a school newspaper, worked as teacher aides in the 'Ville School, helped out in the Principal's office, made minor repairs to the plant, built instructional equipment for classroom instruction, and acted as coaches for various sports.

ELEMENTARY 'Ville School

The efforts at the 'Ville School to present an individualized program, especially in the Language Arts area, have been augmented by the addition of a part-time teacher, a practice teacher, a high school teacher aide, and the continued use of our resource teacher.

With a very generous gift of one hundred fifty library books, donated by Mr. and Mrs. Arthur Mullin, and new books purchased with monies budgeted, the 'Ville School has vastly improved its library facilities. This has helped the young children greatly as they rely heavily on library materials in conjunction with their basic texts. It also allows the student to proceed at his own pace.

Street School

By a sharing of facilities between the High School and the upper elementary (grades five through eight), the grade school has added Industrial Arts to its program of studies and is afforded the opportunity of laboratory work in the sciences.

SCHOOL BOARD REPORT - 2

Cheerleading and girls' basketball have been added as extra-curricular activities.

HEALTH AND SAFETY

We have made tremendous strides in this area, the largest being the installation of two fire hydrants at the Street School. These have been tested and proven and will add immeasurably to the safety of life and property. Fire drills are conducted monthly and the 'Ville School has evacuated safely in a timed period of forty seconds.

Construction of larger and firmer roofs over the fire escapes at the Street School, covering of exposed electrical wires, removal of barbed wire from school ground boundaries, construction of safer playground equipment, installation of fluorescent lighting at the 'Ville School (eye safety), and water samples taken to determine if safe for consumption, are many of the things we have accomplished.

ADMINISTRATION AND STAFF

The Board is in unanimous agreement that this year's teaching staff is extremely competent and adds greatly to the status of the school system. The new Principal, Mr. Michael McCaffrey, deserves most of the credit for implementing and stabilizing the new ideas incorporated and for the high morale of the students. His professional handling of staff personnel is very gratifying to the Board.

Our new Superintendent, Mr. Arthur Pierce, brings to the Orford School District strong leadership and very impressive credentials. He has received his M.Ed. and Ed.D. from Harvard. After teaching experience he was an assistant to the Superintendent in Scotch Plains-Fanwood in the New Jersey Public Schools for three years. His contributions to the District have been outstanding and his sharing of new innovations in education have enriched each of us.

At the suggestion of the Superintendent, and with the approval of the Board, one or two staff members each month present an analysis of what he or she is doing along with new ideas, needs, and improvements for that particular department. It helps the Administration and the Board in its decisions and gives us a better perspective as to how close we are to achieving our objectives.

We have entered into an agreement for Recognition and Professional Procedures with the Orford teachers and have met successfully on several occasions maintaining both a constructive and friendly relationship. We hope this will continue.

SCHOOL BOARD REPORT - 3

GENERAL

Three important items which the Board had to consider were transportation for out of town students, continuance of the hot lunch program, and the hiring of a part-time teacher at the 'Ville School.

At a special School District meeting on May 6, 1968, the District voted by a majority of ten votes to approve the payment of transportation for out of town students but after full consideration of the legal and other problems involved, a majority of the Board requested a ruling from the Attorney General through the State Department of Education. A reply from Paul Fillion, Chief, Division of Administration, indicated that the State Department of Education and the Attorney General would be out of order to rule upon the question as the State Tax Commission had previously given the opinion, upon the request of the Superintendent, that "it would not be a proper and lawful use of money appropriated...". Consequently, a majority of the Board voted not to pay this. We did, however, approve of payment for transportation for both high school and elementary students residing within the district and attending the Orford Schools.

The hot lunch program was discontinued at the beginning of the year because of poor participation, which resulted in a deficit. A petition was circulated by an interested group of citizens calling for reinstatement of the program. The Chairman appointed a committee to study the situation and as a result of the study the recommendation was made that we continue the program only at the 'Ville School. This was accomplished and is now justified because of nearly one hundred percent participation. We are fortunate in also securing federal monies to lessen the cost to participants.

A portion of the money saved on the two above items was used to hire a part-time teacher at the 'Ville School. A situation existed whereby one teacher was teaching some thirty students in two grades. This was a difficult situation for both teacher and students. The desire of better learning conditions was met by utilization of these funds and the results will certainly justify the action of the Board. We have requested money in this year's budget to maintain a part-time teacher at the 'Ville School.

Although the town had to appropriate \$3,000.00 to balance the 1967-68 budget, further expenditures resulted in a \$1,323.00 deficit at the beginning of this year. Even with this deficit, and due mainly to the fact that we did not approve payment for transportation of students outside the District and because we discontinued the hot lunch program at the Street School, we anticipate a surplus of \$1,500.00 at the close of this fiscal year. Therefore, the town should not be faced with a deficit appropriation next year.

SCHOOL BOARD REPORT - 4

One of the substantial accomplishments of this Board has been the adoption of a policy handbook. It serves as a guideline to all concerned with the education of our children. There remains much to be done with it and the Board welcomes all suggestions and ideas for it.

Certainly every school district can point with pride to certain areas of its school and hope that other areas are not held in spotlight. Orford is no different. This Board and Administration have done their best in attempting to hold taxes down while at the same time endeavoring to give our children the best possible education they can. We may have failed in certain areas but we have gained in others. We are deeply grateful to all who are involved in the educational process in the Orford School District. We are all bound in a single cause: To prepare our children for the challenge of tomorrow. And to this end we have given our best efforts.

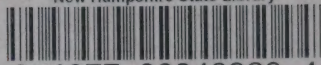
