(TOWN WARRANT)**THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE**

To the inhabitants of the Town of Troy, in the county of Cheshire in said State, qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Town on Tuesday the eighth day of March next, at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- Art. 1. To choose a Clerk for the ensuing year.
- Art. 2. To choose a Treasurer for the ensuing year.
- Art. 3. To choose a Selectman for the ensuing year.
- Art. 4. To choose a Selectman for the ensuing two years.
- Art. 5. To choose a Selectman for the ensuing three years.
- Art. 6. To choose all other necessary town officers.
- Art. 7. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year, and make appropriation of the same.
- Art. 8. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the support of the poor.
- Art. 9. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for repairing highways and bridges, and see if the town will vote to apply for state aid and permanent improvement of highways in accordance with an act of the Legislature of 1905.

Art. 10. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for state aid maintenance.

Art. 11. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for street lighting.

Art. 12. To see if the town will vote to allow a discount of two per cent upon all taxes paid previous to July 5th of the current year, and instruct the Collector to collect all poll taxes before June 1, 1921.

Art. 13. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of five hundred dollars to apply to outstanding notes.

Art. 14. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the public library in addition to the amount required by law.

Art. 15. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money to pay the interest on the water bonds.

Art. 16. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the extension and maintenance of the water system.

Art. 17. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money to be set aside as a sinking fund to pay off the water bonds at maturity.

Art. 18. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the purpose of employing a District Nurse.

Art. 19. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the purpose of painting the Town Hall.

Art. 20. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the purpose of putting in a culvert in front of the house of Fred Eugene Whitecomb, to carry off the surface water.

Art. 21. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the observance of Memorial Day, and choose a Committee to have charge of the same.

Art. 22. To see if the town will vote to raise and appro-

priate a sum of money for the purpose of buying an Auto-Truck or Tractor, suitable for fire purposes, and choose or appoint any necessary committee for that purpose.

Art. 23. To see if the town will vote to instruct the selectmen to borrow money to pay town charges.

Art. 24. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors or Committees heretofore chosen, and take any action in relation thereto.

Art. 25. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

Art. 26. To bring in your ballots upon each of the questions submitted by the Convention to Revise the Constitution relative to the amendments proposed by said Convention at a session held January 28, 1921.

REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the Troy School Board:

I herewith submit to you my third annual report as Superintendent of Schools. The total enrollment of pupils of 325 as against 288 for the first term last year and 280 two years ago, shows that our schools are filled very nearly to the limit of the seating capacity.

The large seventh grade coming into the high school building made more room absolutely necessary, and during the summer a new room was finished off which has helped greatly to relieve the congestion in that building. This new room is well lighted, and until a new high school building is possible seemed to be the most economical way of taking care of the junior and senior high school.

There has been but one change in the teaching force in the high school building. Miss Dorothy E. Hall was elected to succeed Miss Atwood, who accepted a position in Massachusetts.

The senior high school is still small, enrolling but 13 pupils for the two years. Some good work has been done in all the classes in this building, but the discipline and spirit of the school is not yet as good as it should be.

In the primary building the principal, Miss Olsen, and Mrs. Brown have continued their excellent work. Miss Susie

H. Yeaton succeeded Miss Dorothy Platts who accepted a position in Massachusetts. Miss Velma A. Blake succeeds Miss Colley in the third grade, and Miss Kate A. Brooks has taken the second grade, succeeding Miss Agnew.

The enrollment of all the grades in the primary building is larger than it should be to obtain the results desired, but after going over the situation very carefully last spring we found there was absolutely no more room available. These rooms have an enrollment of from 37 to 56. If we could have one room for each of the six grades it would make possible better work in the fourth, fifth and sixth grades.

The work done in all the grades in the primary building has, however, been exceptionally good, and the building is well organized.

The school at West Hill is again in charge of Mrs. Howe with practically the same enrollment as last year. New blackboards were installed in this school last summer and other changes were made.

Mrs. Whitcomb has been retained to supervise the music in the village schools. I believe the parents generally appreciate the advantage of having a specially trained teacher to plan and look after this important side of the school work.

In making the contracts for the present school year the school board were prompt to meet the situation regarding the shortage of teachers, and made substantial increases. Even with the increases offered four of our teachers accepted better paying positions in Massachusetts. To fill these positions we secured two teachers from Maine, one from Massachusetts and one from New Hampshire, all well trained, and all but one having had experience.

Even with the large increases granted for the present year salaries are none too high, but as new teachers are secured we should endeavor to arrange a schedule whereby our teachers of training and experience should receive considerably more than the beginners, and the new teachers, who make satisfactory progress should be rewarded by substantial increases from year to year.

The school conditions at the present time are good and the outlook encouraging. Many problems appear from time to time for solution, but with the co-operation of teachers, school board and parents they will, I believe, be satisfactorily solved.
