TOWN WARRANT

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Washington, in the County of Sullivan, in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Washington on Tuesday, the eighth day of March, next at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- Article 1. To elect a Town Clerk, Town Treasurer, one Selectman for three years, Road Agent, Tax Collector, Auditor, Fire Chief, Police Chief, one member of the Trust Fund Committee for three years, one member of the Library Committee for three years, one member of the Planning Committee for five years, and any other necessary Town Officers.
- Art. 2. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,250.00 and accept State Aid of \$2,500.00 for State Aid Construction in said Town.
- Art. 3. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$471.59 and accept State Aid of \$3,143.94 for Town Road Aid in said Town.
- Art. 4. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance of highways and bridges for the ensuing year, and to reappropriate the balance of the 1954 road appropriation toward tarring the T. R. A. road already built in East Washington.
- Art. 5. To see if the Town will vote to rebuild the Marlow Bridge (so-called) over the Ashuelot River, and to raise and appropriate a sum of money to build same, or take any action relating thereto.
- Art. 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money to pay the State of New Hampshire a balance due on the East Washington bridge constructed in 1954.

- Art. 7. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Town charges for the ensuing year.
- Art. 8. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
- Art. 9. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of the Shedd Free Library for the ensuing year.
- Art. 10. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of the Fire Department for the ensuing year.
- Art. 11. To see if the Town will vote to replace the culvert across the common at East Washington village, and to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the same, or take any action relating thereto.
- Art. 12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money to improve the Millen Pond road, or take any action relating thereto.
- Art. 13. To see if the Town will vote to buy any new highway equipment or take any action relating thereto.
- Art. 14. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to withdraw the Capital Reserve for Highway equipment and to borrow a sufficient sum on long term note to pay the balance.
- Art. 15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money to be transferred to Capital Reserve for the purchase of highway equipment, or take any action relating thereto.
- Art. 16. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money to be transferred to Capital Reserve for the construction of a town garage, or take any other action relating thereto.
- Art. 17. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money to be transferred to Capital Reserve for the construction of permanent bridges, or take any action relating thereto.

- Art. 18. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to paint the East end of the Town Hall, or take any action relating thereto.
- Art. 19. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$400.00 for the control of Blister Rust.
- Art. 20. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of the Dartmouth-Lake Sunapee Region.
- Art. 21. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for band concerts.
- Art. 22. To see if the Town will vote to accept the offer of Lovell Grange to redecorate the interior of the Shedd Free Library during the ensuing two years.
- Art. 23. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to finish painting the exterior woodwork, (making necessary repairs) of the Shedd Free Library and to install a hand rail on the steps.
- Art. 24. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for developing the new cemetery land acquired from the Carrie F. Wright Hospital, or take any other action relating thereto.

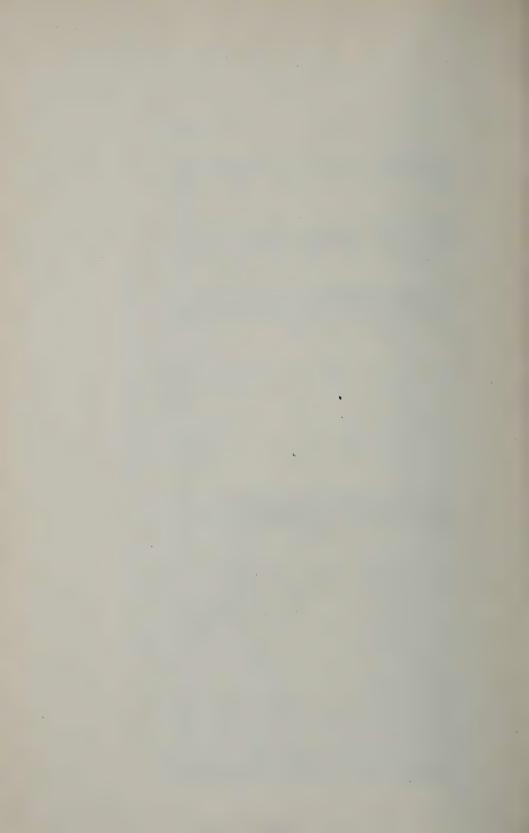
