Town Warrant

The State of New Hampshire

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Wentworth in the County of Grafton in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Town Hall in said Wentworth on Tuesday, the 13th day of March next at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year, and make appropriation for the same.
3. To see how much money more than required by law the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for highways.
4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate money sufficient to secure State aid on trunk line maintenance.
5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate money sufficient to get State aid on construction of highways.
6. To see what action the Town will take regarding raising and appropriating money for the control of the white pine blister rust in town.
7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money sufficient to get State aid on maintenance of highways.
8. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to hire money, if necessary.
9. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To The School Board and Citizens of Wentworth:

I have the pleasure to submit herewith my first report of the Schools of Wentworth. I have found the schools in very good condition and have tried to continue the work so well begun by your former Superintendent.

We may consider ourselves very fortunate in retaining the majority of last year's teachers. Miss Edna Holbrook attended the Summer sessions of six weeks at the Plymouth Normal School. The courses offered at Plymouth and Keene are of great value to the teachers attending them, especially to those having experience but no normal training.

No one realizes better than I that a superintendent's first year in a district should be a time of getting acquainted, rather than a period of radical changes. With this in mind I have tried to make myself familiar with matters pertaining to schools and to follow as closely as possible for the present the plans of my predecessor. Mr. Rhoades' courtesy in making me acquainted with the schools was most helpful.

I regret that more parents have not visited the schools. It should always be understood by them that they are most welcome at all times. A helpful spirit

of cooperation would be warmly fostered if parents would know teachers better and talk with them more, for while the layman's advice can not always be followed, it is best that a common understanding of purposes should exist.

The attendance last year was 90 per cent of the membership. This is a little lower than that of the preceding year. There were 118 different pupils registered in the district last year. This is 10 more than in the previous year. Thus far this year 100 pupils have been registered.

The following pupils were perfect in attendance for three terms last year: Eldon Ladd: for two terms, Theodore Evans and William Flanders: for one term, Mathon Ladd, Althea Dow, Alice McLaughlin, William Dow, Kenneth Gordon, Richard Downing, Marion Downing and Evelyn Chase.

We note that parents are paying heed to the notices sent by our medical inspector regarding defects, by the number of defects that have been corrected. If your child is backward in school, note carefully the report sent you, and if defects are found have the defect removed if possible. No pupil can do the mental work of the school properly, if physically handicapped.

I wish to thank those citizens as well as the members of the School Board, who, from time to time have given an appreciative word to the teachers and myself. We are striving to give you good schools and need your support.

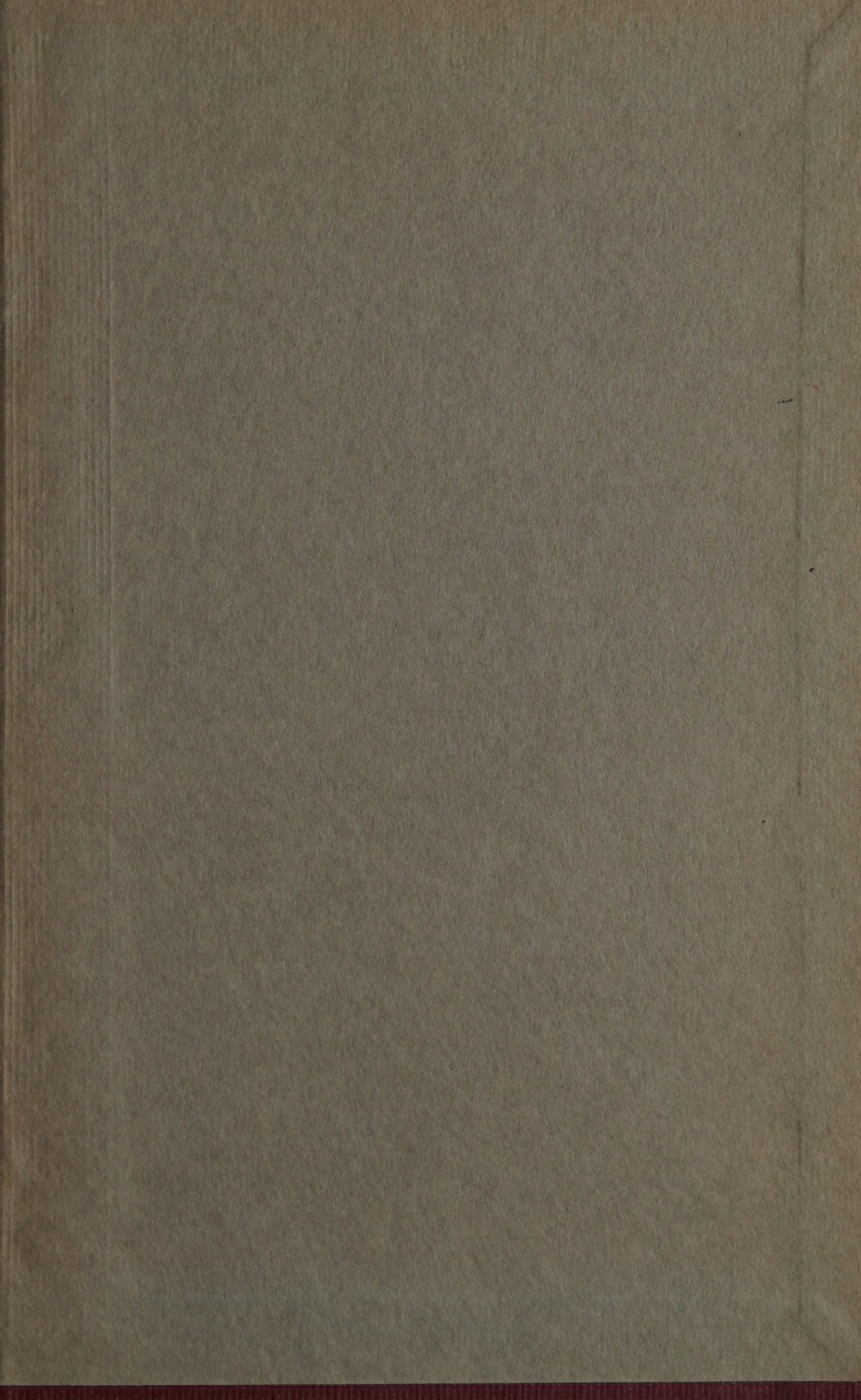
