## REMARKS.

Since our last Annual Report the School House in Division 1 has been painted inside and out, with the exception of the High School room.

The Heating Apparatus which for several years has been unsatisfactory gave out entirely soon after the commencement of the fall term and it was deemed advisable to replace it with a new up-to-date Pratt & Walker Steam Heater similar to the one in the Town Hall, at a total cost of \$451.00. As the law limits the use of money appropriated for school purposes, which can be used for repairs to 5 p. c. and practically that amount had been used for other necessary repairs, in accordance with authority given us at the special school meeting held December 8, 1906, we borrowed the money, to pay this bill, from the town giving a note of the District at 3 p. c. interest.

This Heater is of sufficient capacity to heat the building easily and should do good service for many years.

It will be necessary to shingle this building soon, otherwise it is in good condition.

The School Houses in Division 4 and 5 have been shingled. That at the Branch will probably have to be shingled this year.

All the School Houses outside of the Village need painting.

## REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

### *Members of the Board:*

It is my duty to submit to you a brief report upon the schools since coming under my supervision.

In all, four new teachers were secured for the schools of the town, three in the village school and one at the Center. The latter has recently resigned to accept a position in Massachusetts at an advance in salary of about twenty-five per cent. It will thus be necessary to secure a new teacher for this school in the spring.

A new course of study for the High School outlined by the Principal and approved by the State Superintendent went into effect in September. The work in the grades is now being organized and will probably be ready for the approval of the Board in the Spring.

The total number of pupils registered in the Fall term was 233; and of these 39 were in the High School.

A word of approval should be given for the great improvement in the village school caused by the thorough renovation last summer. Nothing contributes more to a respect for and pride in their surroundings on the part of pupils than to have these surroundings properly kept. A well ordered school in a dilapidated building is well nigh an impossibility.

The need of a longer school year in the grades is very pressing. The amount of money needed to give three weeks

more of school in all grades below the High School would be raised without any taxpayer feeling it in any distinct degree. It is the general feeling among the grades that the work of the entire year just falls short of being satisfactory because of this lack. The amount necessary to put the five upper grades in the village school upon a somewhat satisfactory footing in this respect would be about \$100. I have confidence to believe that the great majority of tax payers would willingly pay this to feel that their graded school was on a par, as far as length of schoolings is concerned, with other progressive towns of similar character.

The first four grades do not feel this lack as much as the others. In fact for younger children the terms should be somewhat shorter.

A bill now pending in the State Legislature contemplates the State certification of teachers. Such a method of certification would secure teachers of higher training than is required at present and consequently would advance salaries. However this would not seriously affect our schools, and would apply to only two at least as now consolidated. I heartily approve of the economy secured by this consolidation and trust the policy will receive the hearty support of the townspeople.

I wish to express my appreciation to the citizens for their interest in the schools, to the teachers for their willing cooperation and to the Board for their helpful advice and suggestions in all school matters.
