


#### TOWN WARRANT

#### STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Ossipee qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the hall of the Ossipee Group Y. M. C. A. Inc., in said town on the Second Tuesday of March next, at nine-fifteen of the clock in the forenoon, to act on the following subjects.

Article 1. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for decorating the graves of soldiers.

Article 2. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Memorial Day observances.

Article 3. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the repair of highways in summer.

Article 4. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for breaking roads in winter.

Article 5. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for defraying town expenses.

Article 6. To see if the town will vote to raise

and appropriate the sum of twenty-one hundred and sixty seven dollars and fifty cents (\$2167.50) for State Aid Construction in order to receive twenty-one hundred and sixty seven dollars (\$2167.00) from the state.

Article 7. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of nineteen hundred dollars (\$1900.00) for State Aid maintenance in order to receive ninety five hundred dollars (\$9500.00) from the State.

Article 8. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of twenty-five hundred dollars (\$2500.00) for Trunk Line maintenance in order to receive seventeen thousand five hundred dollars (\$17500.00) from the State.

Article 9. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to hire money in anticipation of taxes and to allow them to make a discount for early payment of taxes and to see what amount the town will vote to raise and appropriate for interest on loans.

Article 10. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the repair and construction of bridges.

Article 11. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the destruction of gipsy moths and White Pine Blister.

Article 12. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate one thousand dollars (\$1000.00) towards the support of a Health Nurse.

Article 13. To see if the town will vote to raise

and appropriate the sum of three hundred fifty dollars (\$350.00) for the Library.

Article 14. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of four hundred twenty dollars (\$420.00) to be used for rent and office for a Doctor.

Article 15. To see what amount of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for repairs on the Goldsmith Cemetery and cemetery at West Ossipee near White's Garage.

Article 16. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of eight hundred fifty-five dollars (\$855.00) to pay balance due on new tractor.

Article 17. To see if the town will vote to discontinue the highway known as the Mountain road in Ossipee Mountain beginning at a point five hundred feet (500) west of the Colby Bridge to the end of said road on the Moultonboro line.

Article 18. To see if the town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to submit for bids and to award to the lowest bidder, said bids to be accompanied with a good and sufficient bond, subject to the approval of said Selectmen, the job of removing the snow from the highways in the town of Ossipee.

Said bid shall cover the payment of all necessary expenses for the operation of two tractors as now used in said town.

To include the furnishings of a truck suitable for the proper operation of the blade-plow (so-called) now or here-after used and the operation and maintenance of said blade-plow truck be taken care of by the bidder.

The bid not to include necessary expense for repair to either tractor or any plows now or hereafter used.

Article 19. To see if the town will vote to install three dry hydrants, two at West Ossipee and one at Ossipee Valley and to raise and appropriate money for the same.

Article 20. To choose a Selectman for three years, Town Clerk, Treasurer, Highway Agents, Auditors, and all other Officers and Agents for the ensuing year.

Article 21. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

### SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the School Board of Ossipee:

I herewith submit my fifth annual report as superintendent of schools, it being the twelfth in the series of such reports.

The free public school is still our grand heritage from the liberty-loving pioneers. If our democracy is to continue, our schools must train citizens for honest and wise participation in self-government. Ossipee is to be commended for so liberally supporting its schools. The buildings are in good condition, the teaching staff is efficient, the pupils are fine boys and girls.

Following is a list of schools and teachers:

High School, Walter W. Cook, University of New Hampshire. (Mr. Cook is on leave of absence. Leroy Jackman, Boston University, is substituting.)

Grammar School, Edith G. Kelley, Plymouth Normal School.

Assistant, Elsie S. Sylvester, Portsmouth Training School.

Intermediate, Ruth B. Ackerman, Keene Normal School.

Primary, Dorothy M. Langley, Plymouth Normal School.

Special, Florence W. Pearson, Plymouth Normal School.

West Ossipee, Lilla M. Moulton, Keene Normal School. Water Village, Marie Nixon, Plymouth Normal School. Ossipee Corner, Hazel M. Merrill, Summer Normal School. Granite, Doris Fortier, Plymouth Normal School.

Only two changes have occurred since the last report. This speaks well for the quality of work done by the teachers, and also for the continuity of our work. It is much better for the schools when good teachers can be retained for a series of years.

I would urge again this year that parents and other citizens give more attention to visiting the schools and noting the classroom work. Parents should see that pupils attend every day and apply themselves diligently. A few pupils do not attend regularly unless forced to do so. These do not receive the maximum benefit from the school.

At present there are 174 pupils in Ossipee Public Schools. Out of this number we ought to be sending a larger number to college and normal schools. Each succeeding year demands more workers with advanced education.

During the year ending June 30, 1930, we had an average attendance of 177, an average membership of 186 and a percent of 94.9.

### **Medical Inspection**

The health work is going on as usual. A dental clinic was held last summer under the direction of the nurse, Miss Barber. A Toxin Anti-Toxin clinic and also an eye clinic are planned for this spring. Health is of very great importance. Parents should see that physical defects are corrected.

Parents should plan to avail themselves of the clinics which are so often arranged. All children who plan to enter the first grade next fall must be vaccinated. Parents should attend to this before school opens in September.

# Repairs and Improvements

Ossipee is keeping its school property in good condition. During the summer vacation the Center building was much improved by cleaning, painting and varnishing. Improvements were made in the yard and a drain put in near the corner of the building. Under the direction of Mr. Hill, as a member of the school board, aided by the generosity of leading citizens, playground equipment was provided which

is greatly enjoyed by the pupils of the school. Equipment is also being provided for the other schools.

During the year each rural school has been provided with a manual training bench and a few tools so that projects can be worked out. The boys are enjoying this arrangement very much. Each school also has a victrola and some records for calisthenics and music appreciation. More equipment of this kind should be provided at the Center next year. Pupils should have an opportunity to use hands as well as heads in securing an education.

During the summer West Ossipee building was painted inside and the yard partially graded. Screens were provided and also fine adjustable curtains.

At Ossipee Corner the windows were changed so that the children now have light from the left side as is proper. A bookcase was built and some painting done.

All floors were oiled and furniture varnished.

For next year special attention should be given to the lower part of the Center building, all yards should be better graded and beautified. Water Village building should be painted outside. Adjustable seats are needed at Granite and West Ossipee.

Special appropriation should be made for a coal pit at the Center. It is wasteful to leave coal unhoused and handle it twice.

Since the last annual meeting, the school district has suffered the loss of a devoted member of the school board. Dr. E. W. Hodsdon's place was left vacant a few days after the close of the last March meeting. As superintendent of schools I wish to express appreciation of Dr. Hodsdon's unselfish and

loving service for the welfare of the children of Ossipee. He was the retiring member of the board and his place will be filled by the regular election of a member for three years.

On September 1, James N. Pringle succeeded Ernest W. Butterfield as State Commissioner of Education. Our state has met with a distinct loss in the departure of Mr. Butterfield who for ten years had guided the schools so successfully during the period of transition and growth under the new state law. However, we are pleased that he has an entirely worthy successor.

Mr. Pringle comes to the position of commissioner with a full knowledge of conditions which he, as deputy, has had a large share in developing. We are glad to welcome Mr. Pringle, believing that the school welfare in New Hampshire is under safe, conscientious, and wise direction.


