TOWN WARRANT

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Candia, in the County of Rockingham in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

[L. S.]

You are hereby notified to meet at Town Hall in said Candia on Tuesday, the Tenth (10th) day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary town officers for the year ensuing.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year, and make appropriation for the same.
3. To see how much money the town will vote to raise for Memorial Day.
4. To see how much money the town will vote to raise for Old Home Day.
5. To see how much money the town will vote to raise for Smyth Public Library.
6. To see how much money the town will vote to raise for roads and bridges.
7. To see how much money the town will vote to raise as recommended by the New Hampshire Highway department.
8. To see if the town will vote to appropriate the sum of money sufficient to maintain electric lights for the ensuing year.
9. To see if the town will vote to appropriate the sum

of two hundred dollars (\$200.00) to be used for the maintenance of fire apparatus and equipment of the Candia Firemen's Association, Inc., the money to be expended under the direction of said Firemen's Association.

10. To see if the town will vote to buy a new snow plow to be used on a truck, and appropriate money for the same.

11. To see if the town will vote to raise two hundred and fifty dollars (\$250.00) to put a roof on the bandstand and make other necessary repairs in Moore's Park.

12. To see if the town will vote to install a furnace in the town hall, and appropriate money for the same.

13. To see if the town will vote to allow a discount on early payment of taxes, and if so, to fix the time and rate.

14. To see if the town will authorize the selectmen to hire money to take up the long term notes.

15. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of five hundred dollars (\$500.00) a year to pay on the long term notes.

16. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of two hundred dollars (\$200.00) for the upkeep of the cemeteries.

17. To see if the town will vote to accept a deed of the plot of land, with the monument of Sam Walter Foss thereon, and a trust fund of at least one hundred dollars (\$100.00) the income of said fund to be used for the care of said plot of land.

18. To see if the town will raise and appropriate the sum of four hundred dollars (\$400.00) for white pine blister rust control, to be spent in co-operation with the State Forestry department.

19. To see if the town will vote to regulate the charge

for the use of the town hall as follows: The sum of six dollars (\$6.00) will be charged for the use of the town hall between the hours of 7:30 p. m. to 12 o'clock midnight. The regulation to apply to anyone requiring the use of the town hall, for which admission is charged. Exception: For any other occasion for public benefit at which no admission is asked, there will be no charge.

20. To see if the town will vote to appropriate the sum of twenty-four dollars (\$24.00) to pay Lawyer Frank Bacheldor for instructing the Selectmen of Candia in regard to the duties on Article 18 in Town Warrant of March, 1930.

21. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of sixteen hundred dollars (\$1,600.00) for the purpose of purchasing a new tractor and crawlers complete for snow plow.

22. To see if the town will vote to accept the remainder of the Selectmen's budget and appropriate money for the same.

23. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.
